Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE WICKER BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods, has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That all previous Determinations of the Wicker Board shall be cancelled and annulled from and after the date upon which this present Determination comes into force and is operative.

WAGES.

2. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods, shall be—

Bamboo or wicker workers	55s. per week of 48 hours.
Persons employed on basket work not mentioned	}	in piece-work schedules or on repair work	1s. 1½d. per hour or 54s.

NUMBER OF APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

APPRENTICES.

3 That the number or proportion of apprentices who may be employed within any factory or workroom, or shop, or place, in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods, shall be—

1 apprentice to every 3 or fraction of 3 adult persons receiving not less than 48s. per week, or piece-work rates fixed in the schedules to this Determination.

IMPROVERS.

4. That the number or proportion of improvers who may be employed within any factory or workroom, or shop, or place, in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods, shall be—

1 improver to every 4 adult persons receiving not less than 48s. per week, or piece-work rates fixed in the schedules to this Determination.

WAGES OF APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

ALL BRANCHES EXCEPT UPHOLSTERING.

5. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to apprentices or improver employed in the process, trade, or business of a manufacturer of bamboo or wicker goods (other than apprentices or improvers in upholstering branch) shall be as follow:—

OVERTIME.

8. That the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed outside the hours specified in clause 7 of this Determination as the time of beginning and ending work upon each day shall be for each of the first three hours or fraction of an hour at the rate of time and a quarter; and for each hour or fraction of an hour thereafter at the rate of double time.

If within the hours of commencing and ending work as specified in clause 7 of this Determination any person works beyond the maximum number of 48 hours per week he shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a quarter for the extra time so worked.

In the case of an apprentice or an improver the minimum payment shall not be less than One Shilling extra for each hour he works overtime.

HOLIDAYS—SPECIAL RATES FOR.

9. That the prices or rates of payment payable to any person for work done on the undermentioned holidays shall be—

PIECE-WORK RATES.

10. (a) That the lowest price or rate of payment payable to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of the description referred to in the following schedules of rates, shall be the price or rate fixed by such schedules in respect of such article.

(b) That where the material is not stated in the schedules the article may be made of willow or cane.

(c) That in this Determination the following terms shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say) :—

“S.” shall mean sticks.

“L.B.” shall mean length on bottom.

“W.B.” shall mean width on bottom.

“D.” shall mean depth.

“L.T.” shall mean length on top.

“W.T.” shall mean width on top.

“S.S.” shall mean side stakes.

“E.S.” shall mean end stakes.
