ROYAL COMMISSION TO INQUIRE INTO AND REPORT UPON CERTAIN STATEMENTS RELATING TO THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE INCOME TAX ACTS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 23rd day of March, 1911, appointed

JAMES GRATTAN EAGLESON, Esquire, Judge of County Courts (to be Chairman);  
WILLIAM DICKSON, Esquire, Secretary for Mines; and  
SAMUEL LEON, Esquire, Prosecutor for the King,

a Royal Commission to inquire into and report upon certain statements relating to the administration of the Income Tax Acts contained in a document brought under attention in Parliament by George Alexander Elmslie, Esquire, M.L.A., and set forth in the Schedule hereunder:—

SCHEDULE.

1. Suppressed information that allowed him (taxpayer) to escape taxation upon a large amount. No penalty imposed.
2. Suppressed information that allowed taxpayer to escape taxation for a long period and was only found out by persistent inquiry after years. No extra tax. Evasive in all his replies. Large sum was involved. Same return in after years.
3. Appeal for remission by large taxpayer. The officer reduced tax to about one-tenth payable. Large amount.
4. Suppressed full information. Similar to No. 2.
- 5 and 6. Allowed foreign expenses, but was not required to include foreign profits. Also did not include until investigation in later years sums received for service rendered in Victoria.
7. Returns sent in long after due date. No extra tax. Poor taxpayer extra taxed.
8. Evaded tax by an infringement of section 54.
- 9 and 10. Statements accepted that could and did not show proper profits. Mere statements in trading cases accepted.
11. Taxpayers allowed to pay in instalments whilst poorer taxpayers were sued.
12. Taxpayers prosecuted and fined for not furnishing return. In many cases had to be taxed under section 22. Were not properly taxed. Mostly farmers.
13. Inaccurate returns that did not show the proper state of affairs were accepted, and tax lost in consequence. To poorer taxpayers who did not keep books section 21 was ruthlessly applied.
14. Taxpayer, although allowed to occupy certain premises, was not taxed thereon.
15. Value of residence reduced about two-thirds.
16. Taxpayer was allowed to occupy a very valuable house, but this in no way was taxed or attention drawn to any anomaly.
17. Two taxpayers, although following the same pursuit, were taxed upon different lines, the richer of the two partially escaping tax.
18. Exception taken to the investigation of the papers of a rich person who showed a very strange and not properly disclosed mode of trading. This extended over some years.
19. Wrong deductions allowed. Should have been disallowed by order.
20. Other incomplete statements accepted, and annoyance being shown at taxpayer being queried.
21. Exception to action of assessor, though directed to do so by former minute.
22. Taxpayer allowed for years to escape tax owing to incorrect decision. Subsequently decision reversed. No tax imposed for bygone years.
23. Taxpayers had sent in returns for years not showing complete income. After years they informed this. Sums added to. No extra tax.
24. Heavy tax imposed on other taxpayers who were considered to have evaded in a similar way.
25. Faulty form of return permitted taxpayer to evade section of the Act to prevent income being capitalized.
26. Order-book contained so many varying decisions that officers did not know what steps to pursue. Estates dealt with in all ways.
27. In cases where the 4 per cent. value of house was not included, but, after a deal of trouble, was added; taxpayer was not prosecuted, and was allowed to partially escape.

28. Interest wrongly allowed to be offset.
  29. After caution to taxpayer who was suspected of evading tax, large income was shown. Nothing done with regard to former years.
  30. More allowed as depreciation to one person as compared with another.
  31. Schedules that were delayed for query. Sums claimed disallowed upon query. Evasive. These sums added. No extra tax. Late in paying tax owing to this cause.
  32. Complete dissatisfaction with the rambling statements of taxpayers. No legal action taken. Mystifying and evasive.
  33. Taxed upon salaries, but profits of trading concerns allowed to escape.
  34. Certain taxpayers sent in false returns. In one case heavily fined; others allowed to escape prosecution. In the cases of many poor taxpayers fines were imposed upon prosecution.
  35. Large sums were allowed as deductions contrary to the order, and taxpayers escaped tax thereon consequently.
  36. Taxpayers allowed to leave State before tax levied.
  37. Inaccurate statements accepted not sent in on proper lines. Tax not properly assessed.
  38. Tax evaded. Only elicited upon inquiry. No extra tax.
  39. Assessors worried and annoyed in the performance of their duties.
- And His Excellency has, by the same Order, directed that the maximum expenditure of such Royal Commission be fixed at Fifty pounds (£50).

Regulation No. XXIX.2.—A qualified teacher shall mean a teacher who has passed the 1st Year Examination in Sloyd-work under the Education Department, or other approved equivalent examination, and has also completed not less than 25 of the prescribed models.

The Director may, however, in special circumstances grant permission to teachers who have not complied fully with these conditions if he is satisfied that they can carry out the work of sloyd teachers efficiently, and if he is further satisfied that they are undergoing a course of instruction in order to obtain the full qualification. Teachers obtaining such permission shall for the purposes of clause 3 below be regarded as qualified teachers.

held under lease or licence or taken up or required for the purposes of the said Act, and therewith to depasture the same. This licence will continue in force until the thirtieth day of June, 19 ; and is issued subject to the conditions on the back hereof.

## Schedule.

## Conditions.

1. The rent for the year ending the 30th day of June, 19 , shall be One shilling (1/-) and shall be payable on demand and thereafter the yearly rent shall be fixed from time to time by the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Land Acts and shall be payable annually in advance on the 1st day of July in every year.

2. The Governor in Council or the Board of Land and Works may at any time enter upon the whole or portion of the land hereby licensed, for the purpose of resuming the same if required for reserves for public purposes railways roads highways canals or other internal communication through such lands or for reservoirs or for mining purposes, and in the event of such entry the licensee his executors administrators and assigns shall remove any improvements from off the land so resumed and relinquish and give up possession of the same to His Majesty his heirs or successors. No compensation for severance or for any person's interest in the unexpired term of the licence shall be given or allowed.

3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the land hereby licensed, and to search for gold and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns for surface or other damage.

4. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

5. The licensee shall be at liberty, with the consent, in writing, of the said Minister, to enclose with a fence the whole or any part of the land hereby licensed.

6. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent, in writing, of the said Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

7. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land hereby licensed and on the half-width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act 1890*, in like manner as holders of freehold land.

8. The licensee shall keep the land hereby licensed free from vermin, and, should he fail to do so, the licence shall be liable to forfeiture.

9. The licensee shall be at liberty to take in stock for agistment for such periods as the said Minister may from time to time determine.

10. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of, or neglect to comply with any of the preceding conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* purporting to declare that the Governor in Council has forfeited this licence shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR SHOW YARDS IN THE TOWN OF EUROA.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant in respect of the Reserve in the Town of Euroa for Show Yards, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be at all times maintained and used as and for show yards and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under, and in accordance with, such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Trustees for the time being of the said land and premises, and for no other purpose whatsoever. And whereas by section 200 of the *Land Act 1901* it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands, for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of the *Land Act 1901*, and has vested such land in the Trustees, or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section 1 of the said section. Now therefore we, Charles Lane de Boos, John Gall (the younger), Frank Wadeson, William Lewis, and Daniel McKernan, the Trustees for the time being of the said premises, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve, in the Town of Euroa, for Show Yards:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve, including all buildings, fences, and improvements thereon, shall be at all times under the control and management of the said Trustees.

2. No person shall enter the Reserve who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, improvements, or any other property, or the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or pass through the fences, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees, put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, goats, pigs, or sheep. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission of the Trustees.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any building, or any booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

8. No persons, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. The Trustees shall be at liberty at all times, in their discretion, to decline to admit any person, horse, or vehicle to the Reserve, and remove any person, horse, or vehicle therefrom or from any part thereof or building thereon.

10. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve shall be as follows:—For the admission of any person not under the age of twelve (12) years—Such sum as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding 2s. 6d. For the admission of every child over the age of six (6) years and under the age of twelve (12) years—Such sum as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding 1s. For the admission of every horse—Such sum as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding 4s. For the admission of every vehicle—Such sum as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding 5s. And such further sum as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding 2s. 6d., may be charged and taken for the admission of every person to every raised stand or platform in the Reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any constable or officer or servant of such Trustees does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or such Trustees or by any constable, and taken before some Justice, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WE, Harold Hughes, James Bothwell, James McNabb, James Peters, and Charles Palmer, the duly appointed committee of management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 18th November, 1890, as a site for public recreation in the parish of Corinella, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901:—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence, may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. All goats, pigs, and poultry found trespassing within the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

8. No person shall camp in the reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, any booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Any person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

10 per cent. on total amount of tender accepted, except when otherwise specified in the tender form, but in no case will security of less than £5 be received.

Schedules as above, with full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown to persons tendering.

In certain schedules where doubt exists as to whether the articles enumerated may or may not be manufactured within the Commonwealth, double columns are inserted for the rates, "A" for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth and "B" for articles manufactured elsewhere.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule and the rates charged are considered reasonable.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for —" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office. Supplies for s.s. *John Murray* must be delivered at the Railway Pier, Port Melbourne.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 15 of these conditions.

12. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railway Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

13. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

14. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 7.

15. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

16. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

17. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, or on account of the Federal Government, or for the Railway Department, or for supplies for Technical Schools, or for the Metropolitan Parks and Gardens, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings for Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

18. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

19. As regards Contracts for Supplies used expressly for the Defence Department, however, it will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the whole or any item of the contract by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given as in Clause 18.

20. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clauses 18 and 19 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the

contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

21. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

22. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; the terms of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules, and the wages paid to any such person shall be in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour clauses thus indorsed on the schedules affected shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and, in all other respects.

23. The contractor shall, before any account is passed for payment for services rendered, furnish a statutory declaration that all the workmen under this contract have been employed in accordance with clause 22 of these conditions, and have been paid not less than the minimum rate of wages for such workmen as is provided for under that clause.

**TOWN OF CAMBERWELL.**

**By-Law 31.**

A By-law of the Town of Camberwell, made under the provisions of section 193 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 31, for regulating and restraining the erection of removed wooden buildings in the town of Camberwell.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. Repeal.—Section 8 of By-law 21 is hereby repealed.
2. No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be removed or transported into any part of the town of Camberwell, or from any one part of the town to another part of the same, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

3. Before any building or erection is removed into the town, or from any one part of the town to another part, the owner or the person carrying out the removal shall give to the Council, its Town Clerk, or Building Surveyor, not less than ten clear days notice in writing of his intention to remove and re-erect such building, and shall accompanying such notice supply the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
- (b) The situation of the land on which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.
- (c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building, including any alterations or additions thereto, and a tracing copy of such plan, to be retained by the Council.
- (d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is re-erected.

And shall at the same time produce to the Council, its Town Clerk, or Building Surveyor, satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation. On receipt of such notice the Building Surveyor shall inspect such building or erection before removal, and shall report to the Council whether, in his opinion, such building when removed and re-erected will be in compliance with the provisions of this By-law and the building regulations and By-laws of the Council or not. If the Building Surveyor certifies that such building or erection when removed and re-erected will be in accordance with this By-law then the Council shall grant a permit for its removal and re-erection in the town, but not otherwise.

4. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation shall be removed or re-erected within the town.

5. No building or erection which is intended to be used as a dwelling-house in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding three months shall be removed into or re-erected within the town, unless the same has been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner, or of the Health Inspector of any municipal council.

6. No building or erection intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house shall be removed into or re-erected within the town unless the same when re-erected shall cover an area of 800 sq. ft. at the least. Such building shall be properly framed, and shall comply with the following conditions as to spacing and scantlings of timbers, &c.:—

- (a) Stumps to be not less than 4 in. x 4 in. redgum or jarrah, spaced to 4 ft. centres, and fixed on 8 in. x 8 in. x 2 in. sole plates.
- (b) Studs and ceiling joists to be not less than 4 in. x 1½ in., spaced not less than 18 in. apart, centre to centre, and properly braced.
- (c) Rafters not less than 4 in. x 1½ in., spaced 3 ft., centre to centre.
- Floor joists to be not less than 4 in. x 2 in., spaced 18 in. apart, centre to centre, on 4 in. x 3 in. bearers, spaced 6 ft. apart.
- (d) Vermin plates to be provided to all walls.
- (e) Floors to be fixed level and to be in no part less than 12 in. above the surface of the ground.
- (f) All window sashes to be made to open, and sufficient ventilation to be provided in each room.
- (g) The height of the main or living rooms to be not less than 10 ft. 6 in., between the floors and ceilings.
- (h) The internal lining of walls and ceilings to be of lath and plaster, stamped steel or sheet asbestos preparations, matchboard lining may be retained in rooms other than the main or living rooms, but if so retained must be thoroughly cleaned down and painted with three coats of oil and whitelead.
- (i) All roof coverings to be of incombustible material.

All timber and material which in the opinion of the Building Surveyor is unsound or defective, shall be removed and replaced with sound material. Such building when completed shall also comply with the building regulations and By-laws of the Council. (The conditions in this section shall not apply to buildings to be used as stables or sheds, provided the same comply in all other respects with this By-law.)

7. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands.

8. If the Building Surveyor shall certify in writing that any building or erection has been removed into or re-erected within the town contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building, erection, or structure is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owners of such building, erection, or structure upon receiving from the Council, its Town Clerk, or Building Surveyor, a notice in writing requiring him to alter, or repair, or pull down, or remove the said building, erection, or structure, shall alter, or repair, or remove, or pull down such building, erection, or structure within the time limited by such notice. And if default shall be made in complying with such notice, the Council may, on the expiration of the time therein limited, pull down or remove such building, erection, or structure, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the costs and expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or structure, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.



9. The following fees shall be payable by the owner or person removing any building upon giving the notice mentioned in section 3 of this By-law:—

- (a) For examining any building which it is proposed to remove into the town of Camberwell, whether the same is approved or not ... £2 0 0
- (b) For issue of a permit to remove any building and re-erect the same in the town of Camberwell, additional to the fee for inspection ... £1 0 0

10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the town of Camberwell, but shall not apply to any Government, railway, or municipal building.

11. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds.

And if such offence is a continuing one to a further penalty of not less than One pound per day, and not exceeding Five pounds per day for each day such offence is continued.
