DETERMINATION OF THE SPECIAL BOARD

APPOINTED

TO DETERMINE THE LOWEST PRICES OR RATES WHICH MAY BE PAID TO ANY PERSON FOR WHOLLY OR PARTLY PREPARING OR MANUFACTURING, EITHER INSIDE OR OUTSIDE A FACTORY OR WORK-ROOM, BOOTS, SHOES, AND SLIPPERS OF EVERY DESCRIPTION.

DETERMINATION OF THE SPECIAL BOARD APPOINTED TO DETERMINE THE LOWEST PRICES OR RATES WHICH MAY BE PAID TO ANY PERSON FOR WHOLLY OR PARTLY PREPARING OR MANUFACTURING, EITHER INSIDE OR OUTSIDE A FACTORY OR WORK-ROOM, BOOTS, SHOES, AND SLIPPERS OF EVERY DESCRIPTION.

THE Board has fixed the 3rd April, 1911, as the date from which the following Determination of the Board shall come into force.

All previous Determinations of the Board fixing the lowest price or rate which may be paid to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, boots, shoes, and slippers of every description shall, from and after the date upon which this present Determination comes into force and be operative, be cancelled and annualled:—

ADULT MALES .- WAGES.

That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to adult males employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing boots, shoes, and slippers of every description, either by hand or machinery, shall be 1s. $1\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour or £2 14s. per week of 48 hours.

MALE IMPROVERS.—NUMBER.

That the number of male improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room shall be in the following proportion to workers engaged, that is to say:—

One male improver to ten, or over ten, workers receiving the minimum wage or earning at piece-work rate not less than the minimum wage fixed by the Board.

MALE APPRENTICES,-NUMBER.

That the number of male apprentices who may be employed within any factory or work-room shall be in the following proportion to workers engaged, that is to say:—

One male apprentice to every three, or fraction of three, workers receiving the minimum wage or earning at piece-work rate not less than the minimum wage fixed by the Board.

MALE APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS .- WAGES.

That the following shall be the lowest rates of wages to be paid to any male apprentice or improver employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing boots, shoes, and slippers of every description, viz.:—

That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any male person under twenty-one years of age (other than an improver or an apprentice) in the boot trade, employed solely on errands, sweeping, jast-carrying, sorting, and heel hail feeding shall be as follows:—

Females.—Wages.

That the lowest rate of wages to be paid to females, with five years' experience and over, employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing boots, shoes, and slippers of every description shall be Twenty-one shillings per week of forty-eight hours.

FEMALE IMPROVERS OR APPRENTICES .- NUMBER.

That the number of female improvers or apprentices who may be employed within any factory or work-room shall be in the proportion of two female improvers or apprentices to every female receiving not less than Twenty-one shillings per week or earning at piece-work rate not less than Twenty-one shillings per week.

FEMALE APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS .- WAGES.

That the following shall be the lowest rates of wages to be paid to female apprentices or improvers employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing boots, shoes, and slippers of every description, viz.:—

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

Where females are employed clicking (but not skiving or trimming) insides or outsides of uppers, or stuff cutting, stuff fitting or preparing for makers, or making or finishing (but not ironing and sizing of uppers, or socking), they shall be paid at the rate of 1s. 1½d. per hour.

INSIDE WORKERS.

Employers shall supply all grindery, colours, and materials, and also find workshop room and light for inside workers, free of charge.

OUTSIDE WORKERS.

Employers shall supply all grindery, colours, and materials (except for wax-thread work) for outside workers, free of charge.

OVERTIME.

That the wages price or rate which shall be paid to any male employé over the age of sixteen years who works for any time in excess of forty-eight hours per week as fixed by the Board shall be Three-pence per hour in addition to the wages price or rate set forth in this Determination.

HOLIDAYS-SPECIAL RATE FOR.

That the lowest price or rate of payment to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, boots, shoes, and slippers of every description, for all work done on New Years' Day, Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or such other days as may be observed as public holidays in lieu thereof, and on Good Friday and Easter Monday, shall be double the price or rate fixed by this Determination.

PIECE-WORK RATES.

That the lowest piece-work prices or rates shall be as follow:-
