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EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban excepted), and at the Victorian Tourist Bureau, corner Collins and Swanston streets, from 11th till 17th April (both days inclusive), available for return on and after 14th April, and till 8th May inclusive. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued (see exception below), and may be broken (see posters). Holiday excursion tickets issued on 11th till 13th April are not available for the return journey till 14th April.

NOTE.—On Holiday Excursion Tickets issued at Spencer-street, Flinders-street, Prince's-bridge, and the Victorian Tourist Bureau, from 11th till 17th April, the journey may be commenced on any day during that period, and the tickets will be available for return from 14th April till 8th May inclusive.

Sydney, Adelaide, Brisbane.—Excursion tickets available for return for three calendar months will be issued at Melbourne from 8th till 17th April inclusive, at the following return fares, viz.:—Sydney, *via* Southern Line, first class, £5; second class, £3 15s.; Sydney, *via* Harden and Blayney, first class, £5 6s.; second class, £3 19s. Adelaide, first class, £4; second class, £2 10s. Broken Hill, first class, £7 3s.; second class, £4 10s. Brisbane, first class, £10; second class, £6 15s.

Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line, except on payment of 20s. first class and 15s. second class. In all cases the journey may be broken for one month on the forward, and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

Barrier Tickets.—Platform tickets will not be issued at Spencer-street or Ballarat on 12th and 13th April.

Tickets for sleeping cars between Melbourne and Adelaide and Albury and Sydney will be issued at Spencer-street station only, from 12th till 18th April inclusive.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and the address fixed in such a way that it will not come off. This particularly refers to dress baskets, which should bear some distinctive brand so that they can be readily and correctly recognised.

Horses.—From 13th till 18th April (both dates inclusive) the Department cannot engage to forward horses by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From 12th till 18th April (both dates inclusive) Commercial Travellers' samples will only be taken to or from roadside stations by mixed or goods trains. They will not be despatched to or from Spencer-street or Flinders-street by passenger or mixed trains, but must be sent by goods trains.

Parcels.—From 12th till 17th April inclusive parcels must be at the parcels office at Spencer-street and Flinders-street stations half-an-hour before the starting times of ordinary trains.

Goods Sheds Holidays.—The 14th and 17th April will be observed as holidays in the Goods Branch, and only dairy produce goods trains will be run. Perishable goods will be delivered at all stations on application. On all holidays empty milk cans will be received at the Goods Shed, Spencer-street, up till 12 noon. On 14th, 15th, 17th, and 18th April, fruit and dairy produce will not be carried by purely passenger trains between Melbourne, Ballarat, and Bendigo, nor on the North-Eastern line, unless full parcels rates are paid.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—BAIRNSDALE AND ORBOST RAILWAY.

ORDER NOTIFYING THE INTENTION OF THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO CONSTITUTE CERTAIN LANDS A RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION DISTRICT UNDER THE NAME OF THE BAIRNSDALE AND ORBOST RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION DISTRICT.

WHEREAS the construction of a line of railway to be called the Bairnsdale and Orbost Railway has been authorized by the *Bairnsdale and Orbost Railway Construction Act 1900*, subject to the provisions of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Acts*; And whereas it is necessary that the requirements of section 8 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* be now complied with: Now therefore I, Sir Thomas David Gibson Carmichael, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, hereby announce that unless I receive within the period by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* mentioned, a petition signed as therein required, praying that such Railway Construction District be not constituted, and that the said Bairnsdale and Orbost Railway be not constructed, it is my intention to constitute, after the expiration of one month from the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this Order, the lands hereinafter described a Railway Construction District, under the name, style, or title of the Bairnsdale and Orbost Railway Construction District, that is to say, all the land included within the following boundaries:—

Description of the boundaries of land in the shires of Bairnsdale, Tambo, Omeo, and Orbost, being parts of the counties of Dargo, Tambo, and Croajingolong, and comprising the whole of the parishes of Colquhoun North, Colquhoun East, Tildesley East, Wavgara, Newmerella, Tabbara, Jilwain, Jirrah, Orbost, Rete Bolong South, Rete Bolong North, Nowa Nowa South, Nowa Nowa, Ninnie, Maneroo, Boonderoot, Yonduk, Kaerwut, Loongelaat, Curlip, Murrungowar, Nerran, Pinnak, Buchan, Gillingal, Timbarra, and Windarra, and parts of the parishes of Broadlands, Sarsfield, Tambo, Kianeeck, Nurong, Yambulla, Yalmy, Wibenduck, Kuark, Purgazoolah, Orbost East, Tildesley West, Colquhoun, and Bunberrah included within the foregoing document, which

will, in the opinion of the Board, be materially enhanced in value by the construction of the above-mentioned railway.—Commencing on the shore of Jones Bay at the south-western corner of allotment 10A, section A, parish of Broadlands; HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 23rd day of March, 1911, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Horsham, directed that the provisions of the *Voting by Post Act 1900*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the elections of Councillors for the Municipality of the said borough, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied, and to give effect to the requirements of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said Act.

His Excellency has also directed that the official to give the public notices required by the said section as altered shall be the Municipal Clerk of the said Borough.

And His Excellency, by the Order hereinbefore mentioned, has further directed that the Regulations following shall have effect:—

1. The following persons are hereby appointed officers within the meaning of section 21 of the *Voting by Post Act 1900* as applied to Municipal Elections, viz.:—

All Head-masters of State Schools,	
And every member of the Police Force,	

2. Every letter or envelope transmitted through the post-office, pursuant to the Voting by Post Act as applied to Municipal Elections, either by or to a Returning Officer, shall have the necessary postage upon same prepaid.

Section 5 shall apply, omitting the words "any electoral" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "the Voters"; and omitting the words "province or district" in the third and fourth lines, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 6 shall apply unaltered.

Section 7 shall apply, omitting the words "initial letter" in the third line, and substituting therefor the words "special mark"; omitting all the words after the word "section" in the third line down to the word "and" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the words "one hundred and forty-one of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the eighth line down to the word "in" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "electoral" in the twelfth line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters'."

Section 8 shall apply, omitting the word "electoral" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "Voters"; omitting the words "province or district" wherever they appear, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 13 shall apply, omitting all the words from the beginning of the section down to the word "the" where it appears the second time in the second line; omitting the words "province or district" in the fourth line, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality"; omitting the word "any" in the eighth line, and substituting therefor the word "the"; omitting all the words after the word "for" in the eighth line down to the word "to-day" in the ninth line, and substituting therefor the words "Councillor or Councillors for the Borough of Horsham."

Section 14 shall apply, omitting the words "pursuant to the Constitution Acts Amendment Acts" in the second line, and substituting therefor the words "in pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all the words after the word "together" in the twenty-sixth line down to the word "such" in the twenty-ninth line; omitting the words "said sections" in the thirtieth line, substituting therefor the words "*Local Government Act 1903*"; omitting all

the words after the word "the" where it appears the second time in the thirty-ninth line down to the end of the section, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

Section 16 shall apply, omitting the word "posted" in the first line, and substituting therefor the words "sent through the post"; omitting all the words after the word "shall" in the second line down to the word "every" in the seventh line, and substituting therefor the words "have the necessary postage thereon prepaid."

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR THE RECREATION, CONVENIENCE, AND AMUSE- MENT OF THE PEOPLE IN THE CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

WE, John Cockbill, West Outtrim Strangward, Frederick George Farr, James Williamson Skene, Peter Campbell, and Augustus Albert Peverill, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land in the City of South Melbourne, reserved by Order in Council of 26th July, 1910, as a site for the Recreation, Convenience, and Amusement of the people, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199, *Land Act 1901*—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall in any way damage the trees, shrubs, flowers, shelter sheds, or other property in the Reserve, nor shall any fires be lighted therein.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or shelter sheds, or post bills, or cut any names, letter, or figure on, or in any way disfigure the fences, gates, trees, seats, buildings, or erections in the Reserve.
4. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs, flowers, or grasses.
5. No person shall throw any stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance, in the Reserve, or leave therein any bottles, cast off clothing, dead animals, fish, or other matter, except orange peel, paper, or other litter, which must be placed in the bins provided for the purpose.

6. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using obscene language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance in the Reserve, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom and to be prosecuted.

7. No person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse or other animal in the Reserve at any other than a walking pace.

8. No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained:—

- (a) Bring any cattle, horses, goats, or pigs into the Reserve.
- (b) Erect or place any dwelling, booth, stand, or other structure in the Reserve, and every such building or structure shall conform in all respects to the plans approved by the Committee of Management.
- (c) Hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or articles.
- (d) Conduct or play any sports, games, bands of music, or entertainments in the Reserve.
- (e) Remove any sand or other material from the Reserve.
- (f) Hold in the Reserve any fête or concert, or assemblage for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or speaking of any kind, or any meeting of a like character.
- (g) Occupy any site or enjoy any other privilege in the Reserve.

9. The fee to be charged for admission of every person to the Reserve, or any portion thereof, shall be such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

10 per cent. on total amount of tender accepted, except when otherwise specified in the tender form, but in no case will security of less than £5 be received.

Schedules as above, with full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown to persons tendering.

In certain schedules where doubt exists as to whether the articles enumerated may or may not be manufactured within the Commonwealth, double columns are inserted for the rates, "A" for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth and "B" for articles manufactured elsewhere.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule and the rates charged are considered reasonable.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ——" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office. Supplies for s.s. *John Murray* must be delivered at the Railway Pier, Port Melbourne.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only

which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 15 of these conditions.

12. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railway Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

13. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

14. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 7.

15. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

16. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

17. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, or on account of the Federal Government, or for the Railway Department, or for supplies for Technical Schools, or for the Metropolitan Parks and Gardens, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings for Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

18. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect.

19. As regards Contracts for Supplies used expressly for the Defence Department, however, it will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the whole or any item of the contract by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given as in Clause 18.

20. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clauses 18 and 19 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

21. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

22. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; the terms of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles

tendered for in those schedules, and the wages paid to any such person shall be in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour clauses thus indorsed on the schedules affected shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

23. The contractor shall, before any account is passed for payment for services rendered, furnish a statutory declaration that all the workmen under this contract have been employed in accordance with clause 22 of these conditions, and have been paid not less than the minimum rate of wages for such workmen as is provided for under that clause.

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip panels in suitable

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 189 of the *Land Act* 1901 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

PLACES OF AMUSEMENT.

1. On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of each week, from the hour of Eight o'clock in the forenoon until the hour of Twelve o'clock midnight. Provided this Regulation shall not apply in the case of any Ball, Private Party, or Social held in any registered hall or other building on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday.

2. All registered halls and other buildings used for public meetings, and all registered buildings and grounds in which public amusements are conducted, shall be closed between the hours of Twelve o'clock midnight on Saturday and Eight o'clock in the forenoon on Monday in each week. This provision shall not apply in the case of any religious services conducted in any registered hall or building.

(e) The applicant at present contemplates the laying down or erecting of electric lines in the following streets or roads, viz.:—West-street, from Victoria-street to a point 5 chains north of Raglan-street; Millar-street, between Victoria and Raglan streets; Bridport-street, between Victoria and Raglan streets; Vincent-street, whole length; King-street, from Vincent-street to a point 25 chains south of Grant-street; Vincent-street, north from Vincent-street to a point 16 chains north of Westwood-street; Duke-street, between Stanbridge and Albert streets; Camp-street, between Stanbridge and Hill streets; Daly-street, from Victoria-street, 7 chains north; Queensberry-street, between Victoria and Stanbridge streets,

Stanley-street, between Victoria and Stanbridge streets; Howe-street, whole length; Jamieson-street, between Raglan and Trimble streets; Victoria-street, between Camp and Stanhope streets; Albert-lane, between Perrins and West streets, Albert-street, whole length; Hill-street, between Camp and Wombat streets; Raglan-street, between West and East streets; Trimble-street, between Vincent-street north and Little-street.

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THE VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE.

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The Title (£5 Reward, Dissolution of Partnership, &c.) forms one or more lines, as a heading.

On an average, ten words make a line, but for the description of a brand consisting of more than one letter, &c., placed perpendicularly, thus, B, each additional letter B

under the first is charged as a line.

Every signature must likewise be counted as a line.

The final words of a paragraph, though only a portion of a line, must be counted as one line.

Signatures (in particular) and Proper names must be written very plainly in the text; ONE SIDE ONLY of each slip of paper should be WRITTEN UPON.

ALL DOCUMENTS illegibly written will be returned unpublished, and, where brands occur unprovided for by the ordinary letters of the alphabet, a worded explanatory description must be furnished.

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
