REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE CLEANSING OF DRINKING VESSELS.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth make the following Regulations for securing the cleanliness of receptacles used for the serving of liquid food and liquid refreshments and ice cream, that is to say :—

- All glass tumblers or wine glasses or ice cream glasses or cups or other vessels or spoons or forks in any licensed premises or restaurant or bar or counter or refreshment stall or booth or dining room or tea room or other place where drinking vessels or spoons or forks are used in common shall be thoroughly cleansed immediately after use.
- In any of the aforementioned places where clean water under pressure is available or where it can be made available the cleansing of such tumblers glasses and cups shall be carried out by means of clean and clear running water.
- "Licensed Premises" as used in these Regulations shall mean all premises licensed under the Licensing Acts of Victoria.
- The following regulation is hereby repealed :— Regulation made by the Board of Public Health relating to the cleansing of drinking vessels and dated 8th April, 1908.

Any person who is guilty of an offence against the Health Acts is liable, on conviction, to the penalty prescribed therein.

These Regulations shall take effect from the first day of May, 1911.

MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners repeal Regulation No. 224, and in lieu thereof make the following Regulation:—

No. 224. Horses may be bathed before the hour of Nine o'clock in the forenoon of any day at the following places, that is to say—

- (a) From a point 75 yards on the north-west side of Pickles-street drain to a point 75 yards on the south-east side of the said drain.
- (b) From that portion of the said foreshore commencing at a point distant 100 yards from the north side of the torpedo jetty and extending to the left bank of the River Yarra.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Water Act* 1905, it is enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust shall have first been advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister (if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with) shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendation as to the granting of the application, or as to any alteration or addition he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council approves of the construction of such waterworks, with or without any alterations, additions, or conditions, he may, by Order in Council, constitute a Waterworks Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the waterworks in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the said Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the proposed waterworks.
- (b) State what are the principal works proposed to be constructed.
- (c) Specify the boundaries of the district to be called the Waterworks District of the Waterworks Trust, whether the lands contained therein are within or without the municipal district of any municipality, the Council whereof, or the councillors of any riding whereof, were applicants for the construction of such waterworks.
- (d) Subject to the provisions of the said Act, specify the number of Commissioners of the Trust, and state how many of them are to be appointed by the Governor in Council, and how many (if any) are to be elected by the several councils named in the Order, or by the ratepayers of the Waterworks District, as the case may be.
- (e) Assign a corporate name to the Waterworks Trust.
- (f) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the said Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of the case, the Governor in Council may think fit:

And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a Waterworks District is either

wholly or with the exception of the waterworks, or proposed waterworks thereof, within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for the time being for such riding or ridings to be, so long as they remain such councillors, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the councillors for the Trentham Riding of the Shire of Kyneton, for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust and for a loan to carry out works for the supply of the township of Trentham with water, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

1. The construction of the said waterworks.
2. That the councillors for the Trentham Riding of the municipal district of the Shire of Kyneton for the time being and one other person shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.
3. That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Five thousand pounds (£5,000).
4. That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

PORTION I.

Commencing at a point where the Tyers River intersects the north boundary of the shire of Traralgon; thence southerly by that river to the River Latrobe; thence easterly by the latter river to a point opposite the north-east angle of allotment 29; being the selection of John Lindsay, parish of Maryvale; thence southerly by a road to the north-west corner of allotment 3, Joseph Smith's selection, same parish; and thence south to the old Melbourne and Sale road; thence east by said road to the west boundary of the parish of Traralgon; thence following that boundary southerly to the north boundary of the parish of Iceralang; thence east by that boundary to the road leading to the west boundary of Allan Walker's selection; thence southerly by said road or continuation thereof to its intersection with the road from Rosedale to Foster; thence south-westerly by that road through the parishes of Jumbuk, Binginwarri, Wonvip, and Gunyah Gunyah to the south-west angle of allotment 14A; thence northerly by a road through allotments 11, 9, and 8 to the south-east angle of allotment 3; thence west by a road being the south boundary of allotments 3 and 2, and the south boundary of allotments 21, 22, and 4, parish of Mirboo South, to the south-west angle of the allotment last named; thence north by a road to the south boundary of allotment 1000, parish of Mirboo; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of said allotment; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 1004; thence east by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 83; thence north-easterly by a road through allotment 83 to the north-west angle of allotment 118; thence east by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 62; thence north by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 62; thence easterly and northerly by a road, being the south and east boundary of allotment last named to its north-east angle; thence west by a road, being the north boundary of allotments 64, 65, 66, 67, and 68, to the north-west angle of the allotment last named; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 50; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 122; thence north by the eastern boundary of said allotment to the north-east angle thereof; thence west by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 15; thence north by a road being the west boundary of allotments 15, 14, 7, 6, 5, to the south-west angle of M. Roub's selection; thence north-westerly and north-easterly by the western and north boundaries of that selection to the intersection of the north boundary of same with the Mirboo Railway; thence westerly by said railway to the west boundary of the township of Darlimurla; thence north by that boundary to the south boundary of the parish of Narracan South; thence west by that boundary to its south-west angle; thence north by the west boundary of said parish to the north-west angle of allotment 28; thence east by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 20; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 25; thence east by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 5; thence north by the west boundary and easterly by the northern boundary of said allotment to its north-east angle; thence north-easterly and east by the western and north boundaries of allotment 20 to its north-east angle; thence northerly by a road, being the western boundary of allotments 20, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, Narracan South, and 26 and 27, parish of Narracan, to its intersection with McDonald's Track; thence northerly by McDonald's Track to its intersection with the Gippsland Railway line; thence easterly by said railway to a point on same due south of the highest point on the Haunted Hill; thence due north to the Haunted Hill; thence further north by a line to the River Latrobe; thence easterly by that river to a point on same due south of the south-west angle of allotment 18, parish of Tanjil East; thence north to and by the west boundary of that allotment and allotment 54 to the north-west angle of the allotment last named; thence east and

south by the north and east boundaries of allotment 54 to the north boundary of allotment 15; thence east by the north boundary of said allotment to the west boundary of allotment 16; thence north and east by the west and north boundaries of said allotments 16 to the west boundary of allotment 51; thence north and east by the west and north boundaries of allotment 51 to the west boundary of allotment 69; thence north by the west boundaries of allotment 69, parish of Tanjil East, and 104 and part of 105, parish of Boola Boola, to the commencing point.

And the Honorable William Haslam Edgar, His Majesty's Acting Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Education Acts.

REGULATIONS RESCINDED, REGULATIONS MADE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of April, 1911.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Brown

Mr. Edgar.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind Regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in accordance with provisions contained in the *Education Act 1890*, the *Education Act 1905*, and the *Education Act 1910*, doth hereby rescind the following Regulations made under the *Education Act 1910*, namely, Regulation XIX., School Entertainments; XX., Religious Instruction; XXIII., Compulsory Attendance; XXIV., Conveyance of Children to School; XXV., School Committees; and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXIII.—COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE.

1. The following returns shall be furnished by head teachers:—

- (a) The head teacher of every State school shall, on the last Saturday in each month, furnish a certified return showing the names and ages of, and other particulars (as set forth in the form issued by the Department) in regard to, all children of school age who attended such school during that month, but who failed to attend on every school half-day in the said month as required by the *Education Act 1910*. The head teachers of part-time schools shall supply a like return for each branch.
- (b) The head teacher shall also furnish, as often as may be necessary, a return of all children of school age who were absent from school for a full week, and who were not under efficient and regular instruction in some other manner. This return must include children known to be not attending any school, whether on the roll or not.
- (c) The head teacher shall furnish a return of children who were in attendance at his school during the previous month, but who were not in attendance during the period covered by the certified return under (a) above.

2. Should any child on the roll be absent on any school half-day, the head teacher shall, in writing, require the parent or guardian of such child to forward an excuse for such non-attendance, and the excuse offered shall be reduced to writing and entered in the certified monthly return. All such excuses shall be filed by the head teacher for inspection by the truant officer. In the event of the parent or guardian, after being called upon to do so by the head teacher, neglecting or refusing to furnish such excuse within five days, an entry to that effect must be made in the return.

Transfer Notes.

3. Where a child is presented for enrolment in any State school, such child shall furnish to the head teacher of such school a transfer note from the head teacher of the State school last attended by him. No exception can be made in the case of a child so enrolled at the beginning of the half-year. Parents or guardians are to be permitted to transfer their children from a State school to any other State school at the commencement of the half-year ending the 30th June, or the 31st December, or at any time in the event of the parent or guardian removing his residence nearer to another State school. Should, however, transfer be desired under any other circumstances, the written consent of the School Committee in whose

district the school is situated from which transfer is desired must first be obtained. Head teachers shall not receive children presented for enrolment who fail to produce such written consent.

4. In the event of a child leaving a State school to attend any other State school, and such child having complied with the conditions of clause 3 above, the head teacher shall provide such child with a transfer note giving the particulars of the last week's attendance of such child, and the number of half-days the school was open during such period. The head teacher of the school to which transfer is desired shall not enrol any child who fails to produce a transfer note.

When a child is presented for enrolment without a transfer note, and it is evident that this cannot speedily be obtained, the head teacher should admit such child to his school, and should at once write to the head teacher of the school which the child last attended and ask for the required transfer note.

A record of the attendance of such child should be kept for the information of the truant officer, but his name should not be entered upon the roll until the transfer note comes to hand.

It should be clearly understood that the above course is to be followed only in the case of children who, if refused admission, would lose several days' school pending the receipt of the transfer notes.

Admission Forms.

5. When a child is admitted to any school, the parent or guardian shall be required to fill up and sign the admission form supplied by the Department. It shall be the duty of the head teacher to enter at once the name of the child and all necessary information in the School Register.

All admission forms are to be kept for inspection by the truant officer on his visits to the school. The name of a child shall not be removed from the roll unless a satisfactory reason has been given for the child's permanent withdrawal from the school. The truant officer must be notified of all names removed. Teachers must revise the addresses of parents at least twice a year, so that the register may contain accurate information for the truant officer.

General Certificates of Exemption for Children Attending Registered Schools.

6. The Minister of Public Instruction may grant a general certificate of exemption for children attending any registered school in which he has been satisfied that the following conditions are being complied with:—

- (a) That on each school day at least two hours' instruction is given before noon, and two hours after noon.
- (b) That the attendances of the children are marked on the rolls provided by the Department and in strict accordance with the directions printed thereon.
- (c) That an inspector of schools has certified in writing that instruction in the subjects of the standard of education as prescribed by the Regulations under the Education Act is efficiently and regularly given in such school.

7. Such general certificate of exemption shall be in the following form:—

REGULATION XXIV.—CONVEYANCE OF CHILDREN TO SCHOOL.

1. Allowances for conveyance will be granted under the following conditions:—

- (a) For each day's attendance of children over six and under twelve years of age, and whose residences are beyond two and a half miles and under three miles from the nearest existing school by the shortest practicable road ... 3d
- (b) For each day's attendance of children between the ages of six and fourteen years whose residences are not less than three miles from the nearest existing school by the shortest practicable road ... 4d.
- (c) Payments under the preceding sub-clauses will be restricted to—
 - (i.) Cases where schools are closed through low average attendance,

(ii.) Cases where the number of children in the neighbourhood would under ordinary circumstances warrant the Department in establishing a school.

(d) For each day's attendance of children between the ages of six and fourteen years, residing in sparsely populated localities, whose residences are not less than four miles from the nearest existing school, and who, as certified by the Director, would without such allowance be unable to attend a school ... 4d.

2. Payments will be granted from the day on which children reach the age of six years, and will cease on the last day of the month in which they reach the age of twelve or fourteen years, as the case may be.

3. Such payments will be made monthly through the head teacher, who will certify that such children are duly conveyed in accordance with sub-clauses (a), (b), or (d) in clause 1 above.

4. Parents must make all arrangements for the conveyance of their children, and must accept all responsibility in connexion therewith.

5. No claim for a conveyance allowance will be recognised until the sanction of the Director has first been obtained.

6. Subject to the conditions of clause 1, special State-school tickets will be issued by the Railway Department to and from certain stations, and these tickets must be paid for by the children at the time of issue. The return half will not be available unless initiated by the head teacher as a guarantee that the child has been in attendance.

(a) Head teachers will be required to keep a record of the number of tickets issued to each child, and to furnish a return each month to the Education Department, upon receipt of which the parents will be reimbursed.

(b) The fares by rail are as follow:—Up to six miles, 2d. daily; from six miles and upwards, 4d. daily.

REGULATION XXV.—DUTIES OF SCHOOL COMMITTEES.

1. The duties of a School Committee with regard to the school or group of schools for which it is appointed shall be:—

- (i.) to exercise a general oversight of the buildings and grounds, and to report to the Minister on the condition thereof when necessary;
- (ii.) to carry out any necessary work referred to the Committee in connexion with the maintenance or repair of, or additions to the buildings or the teacher's residence, or the school grounds;
- (iii.) to promote the beautifying and improvement of the school grounds, the establishment and maintenance of the school gardens and agricultural plots, the decoration of the school rooms, and the formation of a school library and museum;
- (iv.) to visit the school from time to time and to record the opinion of the Committee as to the general condition of the school, and its efficient management;
- (v.) to use every endeavour to induce parents to send their children regularly to school;
- (vi.) to arrange, where necessary, for suitable board and lodging at reasonable rates for the accommodation of teachers (especially women teachers) appointed to the school;
- (vii.) generally to stimulate interest in the school;
- (viii.) to provide for the necessary cleaning and for the sanitary services of the school (no expense in this connexion to be incurred unless the consent of the Minister has been obtained);
- (ix.) to carry out any other duties that may be prescribed by the Regulations;
- (x.) to recommend for the approval of the Minister what use shall be made of school buildings, subject to the conditions hereinafter provided, after the children are dismissed from school, or on days when no school is held therein;
- (xi.) to furnish recommendations for the guidance of the Minister upon applications from persons desirous of giving religious instruction in schools subject to the conditions of Regulation XX;
- (xii.) to authorize the issue of transfer notes to pupils during the currency of the school half-year when so requested by parents who have not removed their residence nearer to another State school.

Use of School Buildings.*

2. The Minister may grant permission, subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned, for the use of any school building at times when school is not being held in

* See also Articles 471, 472, 473.

such building. Applications for the use of buildings should be accompanied by a recommendation of the School Committee.

3. A guarantee, in the form approved by the Director, must be given to repair any damage to the premises or school property.

4. If it is necessary to displace the furniture or school apparatus, this must be done at the expense and risk of the persons using the room, and everything must be replaced at least one hour before the commencement of the next school meeting.

5. For the use of each room, when used for general purposes, Five shillings must be paid to the School Committee, who will apply it towards the expenses of maintenance and furnishing the school.

6. When school rooms are used periodically for local purposes, the fee may, with the consent of the School Committee, be reduced to Two shillings.

7. When school rooms are used for religious instruction on school days, and immediately before or after the ordinary school hours, no charge will be made. When so used on other than school days, a fee of One shilling will be charged for each room. This fee will be retained by the School Committee towards the expense of cleaning the rooms.

8. No charge will be made for the use of school rooms for meetings of School Committees, or meeting of parents held for the nomination of School Committees.

9. The Minister will not approve of the use of State-school buildings for social evenings where dancing or card-playing is indulged in, or for any purpose likely to interfere with the comfort of the teacher and his family when they reside upon the school premises.

10. Permission for the occasional use of a school building may be granted by the Director for the purpose of school entertainments for private profit, if he is satisfied as to the educational nature of the entertainments and of the personal character of the applicant. Persons making application should forward recommendations from School Committees or from teachers. The names of persons receiving general permits for the purpose of holding entertainments will be inserted in the *Education Gazette* as authority to the head teachers.

Works that may be done under the direction of School Committees.

11. School Committees are authorized to incur expenditure on State-school buildings under their supervision, according to the following scale:—

For Schools with an average attendance of—	Amount per annum.
Under 75 scholars	£6
75 to 150 „	£8
150 to 300 „	£10
300 to 450 „	£12
450 to 600 „	£14
600 to 750 „	£16
750 to 900 „	£18
Over 900 „	£20

12. The average attendance at the schools during the six months ending the 30th April in each year will be generally adopted as the basis for determining the amounts which may be expended by each Committee in the financial year beginning the 1st July next ensuing; but in cases where exceptional fluctuations in attendance have occurred, the average attendance of any other month or months may, with the sanction of the Minister, be adopted.

13. Payments will be made by the Education Department upon the presentation of claims setting forth clearly the character of the work done, and certified by the Chairman or the Correspondent of the Committee.

14. The accounts for each Committee will be made up to the 30th June in each year, when all unexpended balances will lapse.

15. The following works may be done under the provisions of section (1) above:—

- (a) Small repairs to floors, door-steps, galleries, and furniture, especially where prompt action might prevent accidents to the teachers or children.
- (b) Repairs to tank-stands, tanks, and taps, well and pump, or other means of supplying the school with water.
- (c) Repairs to roofs, spouting, and down-pipes, so as to secure—(1) the building from damage, (2) the proper storage of rainfall, and (3) absence of contamination of water storage. Repairs and additions to drains.
- (d) Repairs to hobs, hearths, and backs of fire-places; re-setting ovens; prevention of smoking chimneys.
- (e) New door hinges, locks, or other fastenings when the old ones are missing or past repair.
- (f) New fastenings and cords to windows; supply of window blinds; repairs to window blinds.

(g) Repairs to out-offices and guard fences, also to urinals.

(h) Repairs to fences and gates.

(i) Removing dangerous trees, stumps, or logs, and filling up and grading school grounds.

(j) Generally, small repairs of works necessary to prevent further damage or dilapidation to the school property, to prevent accidents to the teachers or children, or to ensure greater comfort to scholars and teachers, and make the building more efficient for school purposes.

16. New work which involves structural alterations to buildings must not be undertaken until the Director has been advised in writing of what is intended and has given sanction to the alteration.

17. In addition to the amounts provided in clause 11 above, School Committees will be authorized to expend sums not exceeding £10 per annum in connexion with teachers' residences, provided that in each case the permission of the Minister is first obtained.

18. To encourage School Committees to improve the conditions of the schools and grounds under their charge, the Minister will be prepared to subsidize at the rate of £1 for £1 all moneys raised locally and expended wholly upon the improvement of the school property, e.g., by asphaltting grounds, renewal or erection of fencing of school premises, erecting shelter sheds, improvement of teachers' residences. A subsidy shall on no account be paid unless the Minister's sanction to the expenditure has been obtained prior to the works being carried out, and all applications for such sanction must be accompanied by a full statement of the proposed works, and an estimate of their cost. All payments, however, by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature.

19. No member of a School Committee may be directly or indirectly interested pecuniarily in any work submitted by the Committee for the approval of the Minister.

Relations to Teachers.

20. Members of the School Committees are expected to foster the schools under their care by showing an active interest in, and sympathy with the work of the teachers and scholars. While exercising general supervision over the school, they should make it their special care to see that the health and comfort of teachers and children are provided for, that the school is well equipped and well maintained, that regular and punctual attendance is insisted upon from both teachers and pupils, and that sympathetic relations are encouraged as between teachers and parents. It is no part of their duties to interfere with the curriculum of instruction or with the methods employed by the teacher. At their visits to schools, members of the School Committee are entitled to inspect any of the records of the school, and they should check and sign the attendance registers at each visit. Any remarks they desire to make upon matters arising out of their visit should appear in the column for "remarks" upon the class rolls.

21. School Committees for schools in small communities are expected to make arrangements for suitable board and lodging at reasonable rates for teachers appointed to such schools. This especially applies to the case of women teachers. If suitable accommodation is not provided the school will be closed.

22. Teachers taking charge of schools will report the fact to the Correspondent of the School Committee upon the prescribed form.

23. School Committees are empowered to investigate any complaints that may be made to them as to the conduct of teachers and their relations to parents. They are, however, expected to protect the teachers from vexatious and frivolous complaints. They must report to the Minister the result of their investigations.

24. Members of School Committees are authorized to make suggestions, but not to give orders to teachers.

School Committees: Nomination and Appointment.

1. For each school or group of schools, the Governor in Council may appoint a School Committee, such Committee to consist of not more than seven persons. Before any arrangements are made for the appointment of a School Committee for a group of schools, the approval of the Minister must first be obtained.

2. As soon as convenient after the passing of the *Education Act 1910* authorizing such appointments, the first meeting of the parents of children attending the school or group of schools shall be summoned by the head teacher for the purpose of nominating candidates for appointment to the School Committee, and parents' meetings for a like purpose shall thereafter be held during the month of February once every three years.

3. If from any unforeseen cause a parents' meeting as provided for above shall not be held, arrangements may be made by the Minister of Public Instruction for a special parents' meeting at a time and on a date to be fixed.

4. No person shall be appointed a member of a School Committee for more than three years.

5. All members of the School Committee shall retire on the day preceding the date of the next triennial parents' meeting succeeding the date of their appointment.

6. Whenever, during a period which elapses between two triennial appointments, a vacancy occurs through death, resignation, or other cause, in any School Committee, and it may not be advisable or practicable to hold a ballot for nomination to fill such vacancy, the Governor in Council may appoint some suitable person to fill up such vacancy, and the person so appointed shall hold office until the date of the next triennial parents' meeting succeeding the date of his appointment.

7. Seven days prior to the date fixed for the parents' meeting, the head teachers shall announce to the children attending the school the date, hour, place, and object of such meeting, and shall notify parents. A notice containing these particulars shall be posted on the door of the school building seven days prior to the parents' meeting.

8. The head teacher shall preside at such meeting or appoint a deputy.

9. Nominations shall be made at the meeting, and received by the head teacher or his deputy. If any person so nominated be not present at the meeting, his written consent to such nomination must be produced.

10. If for any cause no nominations, or a less number of nominations than is necessary for the School Committee, shall be made at the parents' meeting called for the purpose, a report to that effect shall be sent by the head teacher to the Minister of Public Instruction, who may order arrangements for a further meeting, or may take such steps as may be considered desirable for appointment of the Committee.

11. If the number of persons who shall have become candidates shall not exceed the number of persons to be appointed to the School Committee, the head teacher or his deputy shall then declare such candidates to be duly nominated, and shall notify same to the Minister of Public Instruction, and the names of the persons appointed shall be published in the Government Gazette.

12. If, however, the number of candidates shall exceed the number of members to be appointed, the head teacher or his deputy shall at the parents' meeting hereinbefore provided for proceed to hold a ballot. Two scrutineers shall be appointed by those present at the meeting.

13. The ballot shall be held in the school building.

14. The head teacher shall have entire control of the ballot, and may appoint a deputy, or deputies, to act for or on his behalf.

15. The scrutineers shall hand to each parent entitled to vote a paper on which the voter shall write the names of not more than the number of candidates for whom there are vacancies. The list of candidates may be written by the head teacher on a blackboard.

16. Should any question or dispute arise during the progress of the ballot, and having reference to the same, the matter shall be referred at once to the head teacher, or his deputy, who shall have power to decide the same. The scrutineers shall collect the voting papers, count the number of votes given to each candidate, and report to the head teacher the result of the voting. Both parents of a child attending the school shall be entitled to vote. The head teacher shall declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes, to be duly nominated for appointment to the School Committee, shall post a notice to like effect on the school door, and shall notify the Minister of Public Instruction, in the form of the First Schedule, of the names of the persons so nominated. The names of the persons appointed shall be published in the Government Gazette.

17. If two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the names of these candidates shall be announced; and, if a further ballot is thus rendered necessary, the head teacher, or his deputy, shall forthwith take steps to hold a ballot to determine which of such candidates shall be included in the required number of persons to be nominated for appointment.

18. If from any cause, after a parents' meeting shall have been duly summoned for the purpose of a ballot, no such ballot shall take place, the parents' meeting shall stand adjourned until the same day of the following week, and the head teacher shall give not less than three days' previous notice thereof by announcement to the children.

19. Three members of the School Committee shall form a quorum.

20. Any member of a School Committee who shall absent himself from the meetings of the Committee for three months consecutively, having been duly summoned to attend, shall be liable to be removed, and may thereupon be removed by the Governor in Council.

21. The removal by the Governor in Council of any member of a School Committee for misconduct shall render every such person ineligible for re-election, and incapable of holding the position of a member of a School Committee for a period of three years from the date of such removal, or for such further period as may be determined by the Governor in Council.

22. It shall be the duty of the head teacher to summon the School Committee to its first meeting within a reasonable time after appointment for the purpose of electing officers and arranging for the carrying out of the duties of the Committee.

REGULATION XIX.—SCHOOL ENTERTAINMENTS.

1. When, in connexion with any school, any entertainment is held, and the public charged for admission, the head teacher shall forward to the School Committee of such school a balance-sheet showing the receipts and expenditure of the entertainment, and also the expenditure of the balance.

2. When, with the sanction of the School Committee or of the Director, any school entertainment is being given by the school children, or is provided for the school children, all members of the teaching staff of such school may be required to attend for the purpose of aiding in the maintenance of order among the children and giving such other legitimate assistance as may be necessary. Teachers shall, however, not be required to attend at gatherings not strictly confined to the school children and their parents.

REGULATION XX.—RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN STATE SCHOOLS.

1. (a) With the view of affording facilities for giving religious instruction in State schools by persons other than State-school teachers, half-an-hour may, by order of the Minister, or on the recommendation of the School Committee and with the approval of the Minister, be set apart for the purpose on one or two school days in each week. The time for such instruction, when it is to be given in the morning, shall be from 9.15 to 9.45 a.m. When such instruction is to be given in the afternoon, the time shall be from 3.30 to 4 p.m. where the afternoon meeting begins at 1.30 p.m.; and from 3.15 to 3.45 p.m. where the afternoon meeting begins at 1.15 p.m.

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation XIII., in schools in which religious instruction is given in the afternoon, the afternoon meeting shall, on days on which such instruction is given, begin at such an hour as will allow of not less than two hours being devoted to secular instruction before the time fixed for religious instruction.

2. No child will be required to attend for religious instruction unless his parent or guardian has signified in writing his willingness to allow his child to receive such instruction.

3. During the time when religious instruction is given in any school, no secular instruction shall be given to children not attending the classes for religious instruction.

4. On days of inclement weather, the religious instruction, unless it is given during the last half-hour of the afternoon meeting, shall be omitted in schools in which there is no adequate outdoor shelter for the children and the accommodation is not such as to admit of the children who do not receive religious instruction being assembled in rooms other than those in which such instruction is being given.

And the Honorable Alfred Arthur Billson, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria aforesaid, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

If previous to such signature any question or dispute as to the last and best bidder shall arise between the sellers and bidders, or amongst the bidders themselves, the lot in question shall be put up again. Subsequent to such signature no dispute whatever can be admitted, nor can any alteration of name or transfer from the actual purchaser to another person be allowed. No bid made after the fall of the auctioneer's hammer will be received. In cases of question or dispute, the decision of the officer conducting the sale on behalf of the Government shall be final and conclusive.

3. Persons having affixed their signatures to the lists of the descriptions of the lots annexed to these presents, in token of their having become lessees (or agents for lessees) of the lots to which their signatures are respectively so affixed, will be held to have previously obtained all necessary information, and not entitled to allege ignorance or any other cause for their not fulfilling all and every obligation incumbent upon them by these Articles and Conditions.

4. It shall be lawful for the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, at any time within thirty (30) days from the date of sale to annul the sale of the right to the lease of any lot or lots, and to repay to the purchaser the amount of rent paid by him, without interest, cost, or damages of any description, in full

satisfaction of all claims and demands whatsoever by such purchaser, and the publication of a notice to the effect that the Governor has as aforesaid annulled any such sale shall be conclusive evidence that such sale has been completely and effectually annulled.

6. The lessee shall be bound to keep all buildings insured to their full value, as fixed from time to time by the Surveyor-General for the time being, the insurance to be in the name of the Treasurer of the State of Victoria, and the policy in respect thereof to be deposited at the Treasury.

CONDITIONS OF LEASE.

SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.—BY-LAW No. 56.

GREENSBOROUGH WATER SUPPLY.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1903, and numbered 56, for regulating the supply and distribution of water to the township of Greensborough.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. That the charge for water shall be at the rate of not less than One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, with a maximum of not more than One shilling and sixpence.

2. That the supply of water shall in all cases be by measure.

3. Application for water service must be made to the Council by the plumber laying such service, and three days' notice thereof, in writing, must be given. He shall also lodge with such application 10s. for $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. service, and 20s. for $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. service, in addition to the usual deposit required for opening the road. The amount thus lodged shall entitle the consumer to 8,000 gallons of water for $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. connexion, and 16,000 gallons of water for $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. connexion.

4. All connexions shall be paid for by the consumer, and shall be made under the supervision and subject to the approval of the Shire Engineer.

5. No person shall, without proper notice, interfere with any pipe or connexion between the main and the meter.

6. Every consumer shall, at his own expense, provide a meter and maintain the same in good working order to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer, such meter shall not be placed at a greater distance than three feet from the building line.

7. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, shall be placed on each service between the main and the building line.

8. All connexions, meters, taps, &c., must be approved by the Shire Engineer.

9. Any person desiring to remove or alter the position of a meter must give three days' notice, in writing, and the registration of the quantity of the water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration.

10. No person shall affix any service pipe to any of the Council's mains, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe belonging to the Council, or any service pipe, tap, or fitting, except he shall be a licensed plumber.

11. No person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, shall uncover any pipe without giving three days' notice to the Council, or shall tamper with or alter any pipe without permission, in writing, or shall wilfully or negligently break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Council.

12. All connexions with the Council's mains must be made in the same manner as required by the M. and M. Board of Works.

13. The person appointed by the Council may at any time enter into any house or premises supplied from the Council's main, in order to examine if there be any misuse of water, or for the purpose of checking the meter, and if such person be refused admission or prevented from entering such house or premises, the Council may refuse to continue the supply of water to such premises, and the occupier of the said premises shall in addition be liable to the penalties hereunder.

For any breach of the above conditions every person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20. The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 8th day of February, 1911, and confirmed on the 12th day of April, 1911.
