

- 1. The Regulations made under the said Acts on the 20th day of September, 1910, are hereby repeated.
- 2. For the purpose of these Regulations the State of Victoria shall be divided into, and consist of divisions as follows :--
 - (a) The "Potato Growing Division" shall be that part of Victoria coloured blue upon a map of Victoria, signed by the Secretary for Agriculture, and kept for public inspection in his office at Melbourne.
 - (b) The "Non-Potato Growing Division" shall be that part of Victoria coloured green upon the said map.
 - (c) The said "Quarantined Areas" shall be those parts of Victoria coloured red on the said map.
- 3. No potatoes shall be removed from any quarantined area unless they have been inspected by an inspector appointed by the Minister of Agriculture. The said inspector shall, if satisfied that such potatoes are reasonably free from disease, issue the necessary certificates in the forms as under: forms as under :-

BY-LAWS OF THE WARRACKNABEAL DISTRICT HOSPITAL

(Incorporated February, 1891, Hospital and Charities Act 1890.)

THE Rules and By-laws of the Warracknabeal District Hospital (hereinafter referred to as the "hospital") in force up to the date of this By-law are hereby repealed, save as to all rights accrued, acts done, appointments made, or liabilities incurred thereunder.

Objects of the Institution.

2. The Hospital is established for the purpose of affording surgical and medical aid in cases of accidents and diseases to destitute persons, and under conditions hereinafter laid down to other persons in return for payment.

- Management.

 3. The Hospital shall be governed by a president, two vice-presidents, an honorary treasurer, and a committee of management, not to exceed eighteen (seven of whom shall be residents of outlying districts). At least seven members of committee shall be elected annually at the annual general meeting in the month of July in each year by duly qualified subscribers. The only person eligible for election to any of the above mentioned positions shall be annual subscribers of at least £20. The nominations for the above officers shall be in writing, placed in the hands of the secretary at or before such meeting, but nominated.

 4. The committee shall direct the general business the Hospital, frame rules for the general business the Hospital, frame rules for the meeting business the meeti

of the secretary at or before such meeting, but nominations cannot be received without the consent of the persons nominated.

4. The committee shall direct the general business of the Hospital, frame rules for its internal regulations (not inconsistent with these By-laws), and appoint, suspend, and discharge all paid officers, and arrange the terms of the employment of such.

5. The committee shall meet on the second Tuesday in each month at Eight p.m. Seven shall form a quorum.

6. The president may summon a special meeting at any time and when requested in writing to do so by any three members of committee, which writing shall specify the object of such meeting. Three clear days' notice, in writing, shall be given to each member, intimating the meeting and the object of same.

7. When a charge of irregularity is brought against any member of the staff, a specially summoned meeting may be convened to consider such charge.

8. The committee shall appoint a house committee of four of its members, who shall attend to the internal management of the Hospital, the admission and discharge of in-patients, the examination of all accounts presented for payment the supervision of the medical officer's books.

Elections and Appointments.

15. The auditors shall be appointed at the annual meeting.

16. Members to fill the vacancies of retiring members of committee shall be elected at the annual meeting.

On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year one third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be reelected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without reelection, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot (Hospital and Charities Act 1891, section 14).

At all general meetings of governors and contributors fifteen shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair will be taken, but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time named such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day and hour.

26. It shall be competent for the committee of management or any twelve or more contributors, by a writing under their hand, to require the secretary or president to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being specified in the requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.
