## NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

### BENDIGO EAST ELECTORAL DISTRICT.

**A**N Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

"I hereby apply for a Postal Ballot-paper for the forthcoming Election for the Legislative Assembly, and I declare that [here state upon which of the above-mentioned grounds the applicant claims a Postal Ballot-paper].

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

No postage is payable thereon.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

**Caution.**—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

Voting by Post Act 1900

### NOTICE

**RESTRICTIONS ON NETTING, ETC., IN CORNER INLET AND PORT ALBERT.**

IT is hereby notified that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the first publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation revoking the Proclamation dated the tenth day of June, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th June, 1908, page 3020, and the Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of February, 1910, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd February, 1910, pages 1523 and 1524, re Restrictions on Netting, &c., in Corner Inlet and Port Albert, and in lieu thereof to impose and prescribe the following conditions and restrictions for the regulation of fishing in the Port of Corner Inlet and Port Albert and adjacent waters within or inside a line bearing north 36 degrees east (magnetic) from the south end of Rabbit Island to the eastern bank of the entrance to Shallow Inlet:—

(1) Prohibiting the use of "flounder mesh nets" with mesh measuring less than four and three-quarter inches. (The measurement of the mesh shall be ascertained by measuring the length on the diagonal, or between knot and knot of opposite corners, the net being first wetted and tanned, or otherwise prepared for use. In case of dispute or doubt a half-pound weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mesh, in order to produce a fair strain or extension, and the space between the knots shall be measured forthwith, while the mesh remains extended. If the net to be measured is dry, the part to be measured shall be soaked either in fresh or saltwater for not less than ten minutes, and the mesh so soaked shall then be measured.)

(2) Prohibiting the use of "flounder mesh nets" or lines of such nets exceeding six hundred fathoms in length for any boat with attendant boat or flatty. (The length of a net shall be ascertained by taking the measurement along the cork line on which such net is hung.)

(3) Prohibiting the leaving of mesh nets in the water for more than sixteen hours at a time after being set.

(4) Prohibiting the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing for thirty hours in each week, viz., from Noon on each Saturday until Six o'clock in the evening of each Sunday following throughout the year; and also prohibiting the removal of any boat having trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines or netting gear on board from any wharf or jetty or anchorage during such period unless it be proved that such removal was not for the purpose of engaging in fishing within the port of Corner Inlet and Port Albert and adjacent waters above described.

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than four females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said four females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

CONDITIONS, ETC.

#### AVON SHIRE.

##### BY-LAW No. 3.—"IMPOUNDING OF STOCK FOUND DEPASTURING ON SHIRE ROADS."

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Avon order as follows, viz. :—

That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock contained in section 498 of the *Local Government Act 1903* be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road within the under-mentioned boundaries, be impounded—

The whole of the South Riding, and all of the East Riding except that part west of the railway line, and north of the road commencing at allotment 16 of section 8, parish of Stratford, and along that road to allotment 54 of section 8 to the parish boundary; also north of allotment 60 of section 1, parish of Yeebung, and north of township of Lowgernt boundary to the railway line; thence by such railway line easterly to Sandy Creek.

That the above order be carried out under the following rules and regulations, that is to say—That all ratepayers within the above described boundary shall be exempt from such impounding up to a limit of 10 head of either or all cattle or horses, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted to be a team of horses or bullocks in actual use.

That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Avon Shire Council, half-yearly in advance, at the rate of 6s. per annum for every head of such cattle so exempted, and 8s. each for horses so exempted, or such other fees as the Council may from time to time determine.

When the above fee is paid to the person authorized to collect same, he shall register each head of horses or cattle in a book to be kept for the purpose as exempt from the operation of the By-law, and in the case of cattle shall place a pitch brand, or some other distinctive mark, on same, in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money, which shall also be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose for the information and use of the Council.

All calves and foals under the age of six months, the progeny of cattle or horses so exempted, shall likewise be exempted. No entire or bull shall be liable to be exempted without the special consent of the Council.

A muster of all stock so registered and exempted shall take place on a day, of which due notice shall be given by an advertisement at the close of every half-yearly period, and owners requiring exemption for the ensuing half-year are required to present their stock at the mustering yards on these occasions and complete their registration, and after three months shall have run of any half-yearly period, the exemption fee shall be 2s. in the case of cattle and 2s. 6d. in the case of horses for the remaining three months.

The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him, present a return of the same to the Council every six months on a day preceding each half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries have been made, and shall also on demand of the President of the Shire deliver up at any reasonable time, any or all of such books for inspection or audit.

The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock, by any person owning lands abutting on

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to the roads in the above described areas or owning land in any situation whatever.

No pigs, goats, or sheep are to be allowed to wander or depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of 1 mile in each hour, and in the case of sheep at the rate of not less than 6 miles in each day.

No person will be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered and exempted as above, without due notice of same beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing will be entitled without further charge to substitute for each head so removed one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of the registration period.

The Council, or its authorized officer, shall have the right to cause all stock suspected of contagious disease to be removed from such roads, and in the event of any registered stock dying the owner shall cause the same to be destroyed immediately on receiving notice, failing which the herdsman or the Inspector of Nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and cost.

Violation of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
