#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller,  
Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished  
Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor  
of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the  
Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Com-  
monwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I  
have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the  
Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title  
whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue  
the sum of Six hundred and twelve thousand and  
fifty-six pounds to the service of the year One  
thousand nine hundred and eleven and One  
thousand nine hundred and twelve."

of December, in the year of our Lord One  
thousand nine hundred and eleven, and in the

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller,  
Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished  
Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor  
of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the  
Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Com-  
monwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I  
have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the  
Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the  
titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to further amend the Savings Banks Acts."

"An Act to authorize the Construction by the State  
of a Line of Railway from Beualla to Tatong."

"An Act to authorize the Construction by the State  
of a Line of Railway from Rushworth to Colbin-  
abbin."

"An Act to authorize the Construction by the State  
of a Line of Railway from Crowland to Navarre."

"An Act to sanction the issue and application of  
certain Sums of Money available under Loan  
Acts for Railways."

"An Act to amend Section 15 of the *Victorian Mangan-  
ese Mines Iron and Steel Company's Railway  
Act 1911.*"

"An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation as  
Endowments for State Agricultural Colleges and  
Experimental Farms of certain Crown Lands in  
the County of Millewa and for other purposes."

"An Act to sanction the issue and application of  
certain Sums of Money available under Loan  
Acts for Public Works and other purposes."

"An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated  
Revenue to the service of the year ending on the  
thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred  
and twelve and to appropriate the Supplies  
granted in this and the last preceding Session of  
Parliament."

BOARD TO INQUIRE INTO AND REPORT UPON CERTAIN MATTERS IN CONNEXION WITH THE TRAINING SHIP *JOHN MURRAY*.

NEWLY DETERMINED POSITION OF WEST ISLAND OF THREE KINGS.

Marine Department,  
Wellington, N.Z., 16th December, 1911.

LIEUTENANT HARRY PENNELL, R.N., commanding the British Antarctic Expedition R.Y.S. *Terra Nova*, who has lately been surveying and taking soundings round the Three Kings Islands, reports as follows:—

“The true bearings taken from stations (Hiriki, Maria Lighthouse, Unuwahao) on the mainland to the Three Kings Group to check the accuracy of Lieutenant Smythe's observations agree very closely with his position, and in view of the fact that the angles between the extreme bearings is so small Lieutenant Smythe's astronomical position should be taken as the correct one.

“West Island summit is situated S. 71 deg. W., 5.69 min. from the dépot on Great King, *i.e.*, its position as charted *relatively* to the Great King is correct, which makes its position—

34 deg. 11 min. 2 sec. S.  
172 deg. 2 min. 32 sec. E.

“By reference to the chart prepared by Lieutenant Rennick it will be seen that the contour of all the islands in the group is charted considerably in error on the Admiralty Chart, and the position of the S.W. King (marked 600 feet on the Admiralty Chart) is in reality further north relatively to the other islands of the group than the position shown, while the height of West Island is nearly twice that originally assigned to it.”

The chart referred to has been sent to the Hydrographer of the British Admiralty, and when published will no doubt be a great relief to shipmasters who are navigating this coast in thick or foggy weather.

**SHIRE OF McIVOR.—BY-LAW No. 6.**

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of McIvor, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in Central Riding of the Shire of McIvor.
4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
6. The occupier aforesaid, or other person having control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a sufficient quantity of such deodorizing material to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
7. The Council shall at least once every week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed, with its contents, from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.
8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleaned by superheated steam and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.
9. The occupier aforesaid, or other person, shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.
10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil, and the

other work herein directed, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

**CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.—BY-LAW No. 171.**

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 171, for the purpose of amending part of By-law No. 136, and for regulating the disposal of soil, dung, or other manure, and for the prevention of nuisances arising from stables, cow-yards, and dung-pits.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the City of South Melbourne, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens thereof, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 171 of the City, that is to say:—

1. That clause 5, Part 2, of By-law No. 136 of the City, made under the *Health Act 1890*, be and the same is hereby repealed.
2. That in lieu of the said clause 5, Part 2, of By-law No. 136 of the City, the following be enacted:—

“The occupier of any land in the said City on which is erected any stable, cow-yard, or cattle shed, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein, to be removed from such premises once a week, or from time to time, as may be ordered by the City Inspector. The floors and drains of such stables, cow-yards, or cattle sheds shall be constructed and paved or flagged with brick, stone, cement, or other approved impervious material.

“Receptacles constructed of brickwork walls nine inches in thickness with brick on concrete floor six inches in thickness, lined throughout internally with cement rendering composed of 2½ parts sand to 1 of cement, and fitted with approved covering, shall be provided, and all offal, dung, and other filth and refuse accumulated on such premises placed therein. Such receptacles shall be cleaned with lime or other approved disinfectant on all occasions after being emptied, and the contents of such receptacles shall be treated with lime or other approved disinfectant when ordered by the City Inspector.”

Conditional Purchase Lease.

The leases issued to successful applicants may be for such a term of years, not exceeding 31½, as may be agreed upon between the lessee and the Board.

An applicant may apply for more than one allotment, but will only be required to lodge one deposit, being the amount chargeable on the most valuable allotment applied for.

Only one allotment can be granted to any one person.

No conditional purchase lease of a farm allotment can be granted to any person who is already the holder of land of the value of £2,500 (township land excepted), or who would thereby become the holder of land exceeding such value.

Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt (in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board), or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Where samples are provided for, the supplies are to be equal in quality, finish, and in all other respects to, and of the same colour as, the contract sample, but as to weight and otherwise are to conform to the specification. In cases where supplies of a particular make or of a particular brand or trade mark or of a particular distinguishing mark of such maker, brand, or trade mark are required, the supplies shall conform in all respects with the specified requirements. All supplies are to be delivered as directed by the Government Printer, either at the Government Printing Office or at a store situate in the city of Melbourne, but delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

2. The quantity mentioned in the schedules will be required from the contractor, who will be bound, however, to supply any further quantities, at the scheduled price, that may be ordered by the Government Printer during the currency of the contract. Four (4) months' notice of the ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS will be given to the contractor by the Government Printer.

3. In the event of the supplies not being delivered by the time specified in the schedule or order as the case may be, it will be competent for the Government Printer to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense that may be incurred over and above the contract price will be deducted.

4. The supplies on delivery will be surveyed by a board appointed by the Government for that purpose, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. Payment will be made on the board's certificate that the goods are of contract quality and in good order and condition.

5. If the board of survey shall decide that the goods are not of contract quality, the contractor must in that case remove the goods objected to and supply others in their stead, failing which the supplies may be purchased as in condition 3.

6. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

7. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, as the Government may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3, or from the contractor's security.
