Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE BEDSTEAD-MAKERS BOARD.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (including the moulders of bedsteads and excluding the moulders of fenders) employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, has made the following Determination, namely:—

- (1) That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 2nd day of September, 1912. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.
  - (2) That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following persons shall be:-

#### PIECE-WORK.

The Board determines under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of Section 98 of the Factories and Shops Act 1905, No. 1975, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices or rates to any person employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices or rates on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices or rates shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.
