In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of East Loddon (hereinafter called "the Council"), for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within their jurisdiction, do hereby enact that:—All former By-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, and make the following By-law (that is to say):—

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

1. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of July in every year, register himself with the Council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Dairy Inspector an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay the fee hereunder specified: specified :-

(a) If the person to be registered keeps cows and the number of cows so kept be:—

(1) Not more than 5, a fee of 2s. 6d.
(2) More than 5, but not more than 15, a fee of 7s. 6d.
(3) More than 15, but not more than 3o, a fee of 15s.

(4) More than 30, a fee of £1.

(b) If the person to be registered do not keep cows, a fee of 2s.

DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

WHEREAS under section 16 of the Dentists Act 1898 the Dental Board of Victoria may, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make regulations prescribing the mode in which elections of members of the Dental Board by Dentists shall be conducted, and generally for carrying the Dentists Act 1898 and the principal Act (viz., the Medical Act 1890, Part II.) into effect: Now therefore the Dental Board of Victoria does, with the approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations relating to such elections, viz.:—

Regulations.

- r. Appointment of Returning Officer.—The Board shall from time to time appoint (and may remove) some fit and proper person who is registered under the Medical Act 1890, Part II, or under the Dentists Acts 1898 or 1910, and not being a member of the Board, to be the Returning Officer, and to conduct the election of members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.
- 2. Expense of Elections.—The Board shall pay to the Keturning Officer for his own use, out of the moneys accruing under the Medical Act 1890, Part II., or under the Dentists Acts 1898 or 1910. a fee of \mathcal{L}_2 2s. for each and every election conducted by such Returning Officer, together with a sum of money sufficient to recoup him all expenses incurred for the purpose of holding and conducting such election.
- 3. Election of Members.—In the month of February in every year in which the vacancies on the Board are filled by election by the Dentists, the Returning Officer shall proceed to the election of as many persons who are eligible to be members of the Board as there are vacancies to be filled by election (not being extraordinary vacancies) occurring in each such year.
- 4. Extraordinary Vacancies, How Filled.—If any member who has been elected by the Dentists to be a member of the Board die, or by notice under his hand delivered

to the President or Registrar, resign his office as member, or become incapable of being a member, or be declared ousted from such office by the Supreme Court, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Board without leave obtained from the Board in that behalf, then in every such case the office of such member shall become vacant, and such vacancy shall be an extraordinary vacancy, and shall be notified to the Returning Officer by the Board, and the Returning Officer shall, upon receiving such notification, proceed to the election of a person eligible under the Act to fill such extraordinary vacancy.

- 5. Returning Officer to give Notice of Day of Election, and Day of Nomination, Time and Place, When and Where Nominations will be Received.—At every election for a member or members to serve on the Board the Returning Officer shall give twenty-one days' notice by advertisement in such paper or papers as may be approved of by the Board, of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of a fit and proper person or fit and proper persons (fis the case may be) to serve as a member or members on such Board; and he shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than fifteen days nor more than eighteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also, in such advertisement, name the time and place, when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.
- 6. Who may Nominate, and How.—Any person registered under the Medical Act 1800. Part II., or under the Dentists Acts 1808 or 1010, desirous of nominating any other person as a candidate, shall fill up a nomination paper in the form of the First Schedule hereto, stating therein the Christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars renuired by such schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such election or elections, and the person therein named as a candidate shall signify his acceptance of such nomination by notification in writing to the Registrar of the Board.
- 7. If the number of duly nominated candidates be reduced by death to the number or less than the number to be elected, the Returning Officer shall declare the remaining candidates duly elected. If the Returning Officer is satisfied of the death of a duly nominated candidate before the voting papers are printed, he shall omit the name of such candidate from the voting papers, or if any of such papers have been printed but not issued he shall crase therefrom the name of the deceased candidate.
- shall erase therefrom the name of the deceased candidate.

 8. When Returning Officer may Declare Members Elected Without a Poll; When a Poll shall be Taken.—
 The Returning Officer shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of persons nominated than are required to fill the vacancies created, make a return to the Registrar of the Board, and declare such person or persons to have been duly elected member or members of the Board; but if the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies, a poll shall be taken. For this purpose the Registrar shall prepare a Roll of Registered Dentists in alphabetical order of surnames, and shall prefix to each name on the roll a number beginning at the first name with the number one and continuing the numbers in regular arithmetical series to the last name on the roll; and the Returning Officer shall cause voting papers, ach with a counterfoil and also on the back, near the lower edge of each of such papers on the face thereof and shall write on the counterfoil and also on the back, near the lower edge of each of the voting papers so signed or initialed, the number corresponding with the number prefixed to the voter's name on the roll, and shall cause one of such voting papers (with counterfoil attached) to be enclosed in an envelope not fastened with the name and address of the Returning Officer printed or written thereon, and shall post such voting paper and envelope under a fastened cover to the address of each and every registered dentist. The voter shall enclose such voting paper in the addressed envelope, and shall post the same so that it shall be received by the Returning Officer in course of post before Ten o'clock of the morning of the day fixed for holding such election.
- o. Voting Paper may become Invalid, Voting Paper to be Posted to Address of Returning Officer.—If any voter shall suffer to remain not struck out upon any voting paper a greater or less number of names than the number

of members to be elected, or shall fail to write his signature on the counterfoil, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the Returning Officer. Provided that the fact that a name not struck out is that of a candidate who is dead shall not invalidate the voting paper.

ro. Appointment of Scrutineers.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer, to be present when the Returning Officer shall open the envelopes containing the voting papers on the day of holding the election.

lopes containing the voting papers on the day of holding the election.

11. Returning Officer to Ascertain Number of Voters for each Candidate in presence of Registrar and Scrutineers; Candidates Declared Duly Elected; Casting Vote of Returning Officer.—The Returning Officer shall in the presence of the Registrar, or in his absence in the presence of any person appointed on that behalf by the Board, and of any scrutineers appointed by any candidate. on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, proceed to open the envelopes with his printed or written address thereon, and which have been returned to him, and to take out the voting papers therein contained, and without unfolding such voting paper or allowing it to be inspected, he shall inspect and allow the scrutineers to inspect the signature of the voter on the counterfoil; and if the vote is allowed by the Returning Officer he shall tear off the counterfoil without seeing or allowing the scrutineers to see the names of the candidates on the voting paper, and shall insert the voting papers in a separate ballot-box; and when all such voting papers have been so inserted he shall proceed to inspect the same, and also to allow the scrutineers to inspect them, but subject to the proviso that he shall not allow the scrutineers to see the number on the back of the voting paper; and if he is satisfied that each vote is properly given, he shall proceed to ascertain the number of such votes given for each candidate: and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election, the Returning Officer shall give public notice, by advertisement, of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Dental Board of Victoria, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

By-Law No. 272.—Irrigation Charge,—Merbein Irrigation Area.

(Formerly White Cliffs Irrigation Area.)

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by Part II. of the Murray Settlement Act 1907, No. 2123, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Merbein Irrigation Area:—

1. The following Irrigation Charge is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all homestead allotments to which water rights have, under the provisions of Part II. of the Murray Settlement Act 1907, been apportioned by the Commission within the Merbein Irrigation Area, which area is by notice given in the Government Gaettle of 24th August, 1910, declared to be supplied with water for irrigation under the provisions of the said Act:—

For the supply of water (apportioned as water rights) for the irrigation of such lands to which water rights have been apportioned as aforesaid, an Irrigation Charge of Twenty-two shillings and sixpence for each and every acre to which water has been apportioned as water rights.

- 2. Such charge is made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the 1st day of September, 1912, and ending with the 30th day of April, 1913, and shall be payable on the 10th day of October, 1912, at the office of the Commission, at Merbein.
- 3. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said Irrigation Charge.

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Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890 the Veterinary Board of Victoria is empowered from time to time to make, alter, and rescind regulations for the purpose of carrying the said Act into effect, and whereas such regulations require to be confirmed by the Governor in Council, therefore the said Board doth hereby rescind all previous regulations made under the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890, and make the subjoined regulations in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act (that is to say):—

ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF BOARD.

- 1. Appointment of returning officer.—The Board shall, from time to time, appoint (and may remove) some fit and proper person who is registered as a qualified veterinary surgeon, and not being a member of the Board, to be returning officer, and to conduct the election of members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.
- 2. Date of triennial election.—In the month of May, in the year 1891, and in the month of May, 1894, and in the month of May in every next succeeding third year thenceforward, the returning officer shall proceed to the election of seven persons, being registered veterinary surgeons of Victoria, to serve as members of the Veterinary Board of Victoria.
- 3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—If an extraordinary vacancy shall occur in the Board after the period of the first election hereinbefore mentioned, and before the triennial election then next ensuing, the returning officer shall, upon being notified by the Board that an extraordinary vacancy has occurred, proceed to the election of a person being a registered veterinary surgeon to fill such extraordinary vacancy, and the person so elected shall hold office until the next ensuing triennial election and no longer.
- 4. Returning officer to give notice of day of election and day of nomination, and of the time and place when and where nominations will be received.—At every election of members to serve on the Board, the returning officer shall give twenty-one days notice by advertisement in the Argus and Age, or such other papers as may from time to time be approved of by the Board, of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of fit and proper persons to serve as members on such Board, and he shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than twelve days nor more than fifteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided, and he shall also in such advertisement name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.
- 5. How elections shall be made.—Should the nominations exceed the number of vacancies to be filled, an election by ballot shall be held, otherwise the returning officer shall declare those nominated duly elected.
- 6. Candidates to give twelve days' notice to registrar.—Each candidate for election to serve on the Board shall give the registrar at least twelve days' notice of his intention to become a candidate for a seat on the Board.
- 7. Returning officer to ascertain number of votes of each candidate in presence of registrar and scrutineers-Casting vote of returning officer-Candidates declared duly elected.-The returning officer shall, on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, having six days previously posted to every registered veterinary surgeon to his address appearing in the Veterinary Register of Victoria, a voting paper in the form given in Schedule IV. to these regulations, proceed in the presence of the registrar and of any scrutineers appointed by any candidate to open the envelopes with his printed address thereon, and which have been returned to him and to take out the voting-papers therein contained, and if he is satisfied after comparing each of the signatures in such voting papers with signatures of the voters in the signature-book hereinafter referred to and that each vote is properly given, he shall proceed to ascertain the number of such votes for each candidate, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote. Provided always that if any person

entitled to vote be unable to write the returning officer if requested by such person before the expiration of the time fixed for receiving votes, and being satisfied with the voter's identity, shall fill up for him his voting-paper as directed by the voter and obtain and attest his mark thereto and receive and deal with the same as the vote of such voter; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election the returning officer shall give public notice by advertisement of the number of votes given to each candidate and shall declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Veterinary Board of Victoria.

- 8. Voting-paper may become invalid—Voting-paper to be delivered to address of returning officer.—If any voter shall suffer to remain upon any voting-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of members to be elected, or shall fail to attach his signature thereto, the vote given in and by such paper shall be rejected by the returning officer. The voter shall enclose such voting-paper in an envelope furnished to him with the printed address of the returning officer thereon, and shall cause the same to be received by the returning officer before the hour fixed for holding such election.
- 9. How candidates may retire.—If any person who shall duly have become a candidate for such election desire to retire before the day of holding such election from such candidature, such candidate, not later than eight clear days before the day of holding such election, may sign and deliver a notice stating that he so retires, and the returning officer on receipt of such notice shall omit the name of such person so retiring from the voting-paper, and if the number of candidates shall by such retirement be reduced to the number of members to be elected, the returning officer shall declare the remaining members duly elected.
- 10. Appointment of scrutineers.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present when the returning officer shall open the envelopes containing the voting-papers on the day of holding the election.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

- 11. Election of president.—The president shall be elected at the first meeting after the election of the Board by a majority of the members present, and if for want of a quorum, or from any other cause, a president shall not be elected at such first meeting he shall be elected at the next meeting, a week's notice having been given by the registrar to each member of the Board.
- 12. Meetings of Board—Special meetings.—The Board shall meet at least once a month at the office of the registrar, Public Offices, Melbourne, or some other suitable place appointed by the Board, or oftener as the president or any two members of the Board shall desire by requisition, in writing, addressed to the registrar, who shall thereupon summon the members of the Board to meet on the day at the time fixed by such requisition, and the registrar shall give at least three clear days' notice, in writing, by post to their addresses in the register, to each member of the Board of all meetings to be held.
- 13. Meeting to lapse when quorum not present.—If at the expiration of thirty minutes after the hour appointed for the meeting of the Board there shall not be a quorum of members present, no business shall be transacted, and the meeting shall lapse.
- 14. Order of business.—At every meeting of the Board the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the previous meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to the accuracy as a record of the proceedings; such minutes when confirmed shall be signed by the president or chairman presiding at the time of confirmation. After signing the minutes as aforesaid the order of the business of the meeting shall be as follows unless altered by a resolution of the Board to that effect:—
 - 1st. Reading copies of letters sent by the authority of the Board.
 - 2nd. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
 - 3rd. Payments.

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- 4th. Ordinary business, including postponed or adjourned business.
- 5th. Motions of which a week's notice has been previously given.
- 6th. New rules or amended regulations of which twentyeight days' notice have been given by the mover.
- 15. Seal of the Board.—The Board may adopt, by resolution, a seal as and for the common seal of the Board.
- 16. Custody of seal.—The registrar shall have custody of such seal, which shall be deposited in the office of the Board, and shall not be used except as hereinafter provided.
- 17. Seal, how affixed.—The seal of the Board may be affixed by the registrar in the presence of a member of the Board to any instrument or writing when authorised by a resolution passed for that purpose, and entered upon the minutes of the proceedings of the Board but not otherwise.
- 18. Certificate of seal.—Whenever the seal of the Board is affixed as hereinbefore provided the registrar shall append thereto his certificate that it has been affixed by order of the Board with the date of such order as follows:—

Form of diploma.—The Board shall issue a certificate of qualification, to be called a diploma, to duly qualified veterinary surgeons being persons who shall be qualified by examination under this Act, and such diplomas shall be signed by the president and members of the Board, examiners, and registrar, and shall have affixed thereto the common seal of the Board and shall be in the form specified in Schedule I. to these regulations.
- 20. Seat of member, how vacated.—If any member die, or, by notice under his hand delivered to the president or registrar, resign his office as member, or become incapable of becoming a member, be or be declared ousted of such office by the Supreme Court, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Board without leave obtained from the Board in that behalf, then in every such case the office of every such member shall become vacant, and every such vacancy shall be an extraordinary vacancy and notified to the returning officer by the Board.

REGISTRAR AND REGISTRATION.

- 21. Duties of registrar.—The registrar shall be in attendance at his office at such hours as from time to time may be appointed by the Board for that purpose, and be present at all meetings of the Board. It shall be his duty to superintend the affairs of the Board under the directions of the Board. The registrar shall keep the books in a neat and orderly manner, he shall conduct the correspondence and issue all summonses, take the minutes of all the meetings for business, and read them and make a report of all matters that come under his cognisance for the information of the Board. He shall consult the president in any business requiring attention between the various meetings and be responsible for the safe custody of all the documents and property belonging to the Board which shall be under his control, and he shall find security in the sum of One hundred pounds sterling in some fidelity or guarantee society, the premium upon which shall be recouped to him by the Board.
- 22. The registrar to receive all fees, fines, &c.—The registrar shall receive all fees, fines, subscriptions, donations, and other moneys which may be imposed or become due or payable under the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890, or under these regulations, for which he shall give a printed receipt and no other for the same, retaining the block counterpart of such receipt. He shall, once in each week, pay over to the treasurer the amount of money received by him during the week, and obtain the treasurer's signature upon each block counterpart for the money therein mentioned.
- 23. Registrar to preserve certificates.—The registrar shall receive and preserve certificates, cards, or tickets issued by the examiners signifying that examinations have been passed.

- 24. Form of register for veterinary surgeons.—The registrar shall keep "The Veterinary Register of Victoria" in the form prescribed in the second Schedule to the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890.
- 25. Signature of registered veterinary surgeons.—The registrar shall from time to time keep and maintain a signature-book, containing the signature of each and every registered veterinary surgeon, which shall be arranged in alphabetical order, and shall produce such book for the inspection of the returning officer appointed by the Board on the day of the holding each and every election provided for by these regulations.

TREASURER.

- 26. Appointment of honorary treasurer.—The Board may from time to time appoint one of their number as honorary treasurer, who shall find security in the sum of One hundred pounds sterling, and may pay to such honorary treasurer out of the moneys accruing under this Act, a sum sufficient to recoup him for any premiums he may have to pay to any fidelity or guarantee society for obtaining such security as aforesaid.
- 27. Duties of treasurer.—It shall be the duty of the honorary treasurer to receive all moneys from the registrar, and to lodge the same in some bank appointed by the Board, to the credit of an account, headed "Veterinary Board of Victoria," and to pay by cheque, signed by the treasurer and two members of the Board, such accounts as the Board may from time to time order by resolution, which shall specify the sums of money to be paid and to whom.
- 28. Monthly statement of treasurer and annual balance-sheet.— The treasurer shall present to the Board a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month, and he shall also, in the month of January in each year, prepare and present to the Board an annual balance-sheet showing the exact financial position of the affairs of the Board.

AUDITORS.

- 29. Appointment of auditors and term of office.—The Board may appoint, in the month of March in each year, two fit and proper persons as auditors, who shall hold office until the month of March in the following year, and the Board may pay out of the moneys accruing under the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890 a fee of Two pounds two shillings to each of such auditors.
- 30. Duties of auditors.—The auditors shall inspect the books and accounts of the Board, and examine the annual balance-sheet prepared by the treasurer, and shall certify to the same if correct, and they shall also investigate and examine all contracts, accounts, invoices, parcels, bills, and vouchers in anywise relating to or concerning the same which may be kept by or in the possession of the treasurer and registrar, and they shall also examine the bank pass-book, and ascertain that it corresponds with the account of the Board in the bank, and they shall present an annual report to the Board stating the result of their inspection and examination.

FEES.

- 31. Fees, Schedule III.—The scale of fees specified in Schedule III. to these regulations shall be those payable to the registrar of the Board before registration, as provided by section 14 of the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890, in lieu of, and in substitution for, the fees specified in the Second Schedule to the said Act.
- 32. Appropriation of fees.—The Board shall be at liberty, out of any moneys coming to its hands under the provisions of the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890, or of these regulations, to pay and discharge all costs, charges, and expenses, debts, liabilities, and obligations incurred by it howsoever in connexion with framing these regulations or carrying out the provisions of the said Act and regulations, and all matters and things done thereunder.

APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION.

33. Schedules V. and VI.—Every application for registration shall be in the form of a declaration by the applicant, showing that he is entitled thereto under the provisions of the Veterinary

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Surgeons Act 1890, supported by such corroborative evidence as the Board may in each case, in its absolute discretion, require; and the application of a person other than a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons of Great Britain, or of any college or school recognised by the Board, shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule V. and shall be supported by a declaration in the form prescribed in Schedule VI. to those regulations; and every applicant shall, before registration, sign his name in the registrar's signature-book hereinbefore referred to.

34. The veterinary colleges and schools whose certificates or diplomas of competency as a veterinary surgeon will be recognised by the Board are the following:—

The Melbourne University.
The College of Alfort, at Paris, in France.

The College of Lyons, in France. The College at Berlin, in Prussia.

And such other colleges and schools as may from time to time be approved and recognised by a regulation of the Board.

35. The Board shall, on approval of the application and payment of the proper fees of a person entitled otherwise than by examination or by registration under the said Act, grant and cause to be issued to him a certificate of registration in the form specified in Schedule II. to these regulations under the seal of the Board.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE COAL MINES REGULATION ACT 1909, NO. 2240, DIVISION 14-MINERS' ACCIDENTS RELIEF.

Constitution of Joint Committee.

14. Where the Minister is satisfied that a joint Committee of two or more mines in a district is desirable he shall so notify in the Gazette, and thereupon a joint Committee for such mines shall be constituted, consisting

- (a) an inspector of mines appointed by the Minister;
 (b) two persons in respect of each mine as in regulation 13 from among those employed in or about such mine and appointed for the prescribed period by the persons so employed; and
 (c) one person in respect of each mine as in regulation 13 appointed by the owner or owners of such mine or a representative thereof.

Such joint Committee shall, with respect to the said mines and the owners thereof, and the persons employed in or about the same, have the same powers and duties as a Committee has under the Act with respect to a single mine and the owner thereof and the persons employed in or about the same.

Continuation of Relief.

22. Before making a second or succeeding payment of an allowance to any person claiming to be entitled to the same, the Committee may, if considered necessary, demand satisfactory evidence that the applicant is entitled to a continuance of the relief prescribed by the Act.

The Committee may discontinue or reduce any allowance where the Board and the Committee are satisfied that the person to whom relief has been granted so misconducts himself that in their judgment he should be deprived of the allowance in whole or in part.

Any person being in receipt of, or claiming to be entitled to, an allowance for permanent disablement shall, if directed by the Board, subject himself to examination by the Government Medical Officer, who shall determine finally and conclusively the condition of the grantee or applicant.
