Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE CORDAGE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of rope, twine, cordage, halters, coir mats, or coir matting has made the following Determination namely:—

1. That this Determination shall come into force on the 2nd day of September, 1912.

#### OVERTIME.

10. (a) That any rope splicer on driving ropes, wheresoever employed, who works in any week for any time in excess of 48 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of one shilling and sixpence per hour.

(b) That any employé other than a rope splicer on driving ropes, who works in any week for any time in excess of 48 hours, shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

#### SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

The Board determines under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 98 of the Factories and Shops Act 1905, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which this Board has not fixed piece-work prices but has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.
