Municipal Grounds Act.

SHIRE OF BULN BULN.

A By-law of the Shire of Buln Buln, made under section 2 of the *Municipal Grounds Act* 1905, and the Local Government Acts, and numbered 16, for regulating the conduct of persons whilst using or being upon or in the Drouin Recreation Ground, situate on Crown allotments 11 and 12, and portion of Crown allotment 6, section IX., township of Drouin, parish of Drouin West, and for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon such ground.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Municipal Grounds Act* 1905, and the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Buln Buln order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 12 is hereby repealed.
2. The Drouin Recreation Ground described above, hereinafter referred to as the ground, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the ground may be set apart for sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the ground.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the ground who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the ground.
5. No person shall place in the ground any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, or light fires therein, without the written consent of the Council.
6. No person shall camp in the ground or in any building erected thereon.
7. No person shall engage in any game or sports or in dancing in the ground, or use the bicycle track on Sundays.
8. No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling, or occupation of a bookmaker in the ground, and every club, association, or person renting the ground for sports, fêtes, or bicycle races shall be required to enforce the provisions of the *Sports Betting Suppression Act* 1901, for the prohibition of betting in the ground.
9. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the ground.
10. No dogs shall be allowed in the ground on such days as fees of admission thereto are charged as provided herein.
11. No person shall enter the ground on any day set apart for sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or holiday amusements, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Council, or any club, association, or person authorized by the Council to issue such tickets, duly authorizing the

admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date for which issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the ground, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons duly appointed to collect same.

12. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Council, or the club, association, or person renting the ground for the time being, to keep order, shall be liable to be removed from the ground, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

13. Upon application to the Council, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of the ground for the holding of sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons, horses, carriages, or other vehicles, subject to the provisions of this By-law, and shall pay to the Council or its authorized officer the following charges for such exclusive use, that is to say:—

For any sports meeting, fête, or bicycle race held on any one day, the sum of £2 10s.

For any cricket or football match, the sum of 10s. The Council, however, reserves to itself the right to refuse any such application.

Any person or persons offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against this By-law, and who, after he has been warned by any constable or officer of the Council, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such constable or officer of the Council and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Resolution for passing this By-law, No. 16, agreed to by the Council the 27th day of July, 1912, and confirmed the 26th day of August, 1912.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No tender will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each tender.
3. Tenders must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge and at the expense of the licensee. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 2nd December, 1912, and the second payment covering all bark removed by 28th February, 1913, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.
5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.
8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.
9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.
10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.
11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.
12. No live tree, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.
13. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Honorable the Minister of Forests shall have power to absolutely forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown, and to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of forfeiture. (2) Lights for Carts.

71. The driver of every cart, during the hours after sunset of any day and before sunrise of the following day, in any street or public place within the prescribed space for any municipality or other place where this By-law is in force, shall keep a light attached to or suspended from the off or right side of such cart so as to be plainly visible to the driver of any carriage proceeding along or through such street or place in a contrary direction to that in which such first-mentioned cart is directed, and in the case of a night cart only such light shall be such and be so disposed as to appear white in front and red at the outer side; and every driver who fails to comply with this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.
