### Municipal Grounds Act. SHIRE OF BULN BULN.

A By-law of the Shire of Buln Buln, made under section 2 of the Municipal Grounds Act 1905, and the Local Government Acts, and numbered 16. for regulating the conduct of persons whilst using or being upon or in the Drouin Recreation Ground. situate on Crown allotments 11 and 12, and portion of Crown allotment 6, section IX. township of Drouin, parish of Drouin West, and for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon such ground.

IN nursuance of the powers conferred by the Municital Grounds Act 1905, and the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Buln Buln order as follows:—

- 1. By-law No. 12 is hereby repealed.
- 2. The Drouin Recreation Ground described above, hereinafter referred to as the ground, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such davs as the ground may be set apart for sports, fêtes, hicycle races, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the ground.
- 3. No person shall enter or remain in the ground who may offend against decency as regards dress, language. or conduct.
- 4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the ground.
- 5. No person shall place in the ground any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, or light fires therein, without the written consent of the Council.
- 6. No person shall camp in the ground or in any building erected thereon.
- 7. No person shall engage in any game or sports or in dancing in the ground, or use the bicycle track on Sundays.
- 8. No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling, or occupation of a bookmaker in the ground, and every club, association, or person renting the ground for sports, fêtes, or bicycle races shall be required to enforce the provisions of the Sports Betting Suppression Act 1901, for the prohibition of betting in the ground.
- No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the ground.
- ro. No dogs shall be allowed in the ground on such days as, fees of admission thereto are charged as provided herein.
- rt. No person shall enter the ground on any day set apart for sports, fêtes, bioycle races, or holiday amusements, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Council or any dub, association, or person authorized by the Council to issue such tickets, duly authorizing the

admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date for which issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the ground, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons duly appointed to collect same.

- 12. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Council, or the club, association, or person renting the ground for the time being, to keep order, shall be liable to be removed from the ground, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.
- 13. Upon application to the Council, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of the ground for the holding of sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons, horses, carriages, or other vehicles, subject to the provisions of this By-law, and shall pay to the Council or its authorized officer the following charges for such exclusive use, that is to say:—

For any sports meeting, fête, or bicycle race held on any one day, the sum of  $\pounds_2$  ros.

For any cricket or football match, the sum of ros. The Council, however, reserves to itself the right to refuse any such application.

Any person or persons offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds (f,c), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against this By-law, and who, after he has been warned by any constable or officer of the Council, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such constable or officer of the Council and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
