TOWN OF CAMBERWELL.

BY-LAW 34.—REMOVAL OF HOUSE REFUSE.

A By-law of the Town of Camberwell, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 34.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the Town of Camberwell shall provide, or cause to be provided and kept, a receptacle or receptacles of the description hereinafter prescribed, and shall cause all house refuse or garbage produced, collected, or accumulated on such premises to be from time to time deposited and kept in such receptacle or receptacles. Every such receptacle shall be kept in a clean and inoffensive state, and shall be kept constantly covered except when refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom.

2. *Receptacles.*—Every receptacle shall be constructed of 24-gauge galvanized iron of a uniform pattern cylindrical in shape, of a capacity not exceeding 2 cub. ft. for 16 in. in diameter by 18 in. in depth, and coated inside with distilled tar. Top edge to be wired on a wrought-iron ring not less than $\frac{1}{4}$ in. in diameter and bottom edge strengthened with a wrought-iron band $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. in width by $\frac{1}{2}$ of an inch in thickness projecting $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch below the bottom of the receptacle. Side joint to be beaded, folded, and soldered to make a flush surface on the inside. The bottom to be stiffened with two 20-gauge hoop-iron bands crossing each other at right angles soldered to bottom plate and ends turned up under and riveted to bottom rim. To be provided with two rigid side handles for lifting. All joints to be well soldered so as to be watertight.

Every receptacle shall be provided with a cover of 24-gauge galvanized iron. Top to be conical with a rise of not less than 2 in. and provided with handle. The edge of the rim to be wired, and shall fit loosely over the outside of the top of the receptacle, and shall project downward not less than 2 in.

3. The occupier of every house, building, or premises shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed in the yard thereof close to the entrance from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such premises abut once a week, on such day in each week as may from time to time be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse.

4. No person shall place or cause to be placed any receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

5. No person shall place or cause to be placed or deposited any house refuse, garbage, or garden refuse in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Camberwell.

7. This By-law shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1912.

8. Clauses *a* and *b* of section 4 of By-law No. 30 are hereby repealed.

9. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five shillings for each and every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING AUSTRALIAN PORTS.

To be substituted for the Notice to Mariners issued by the Naval Board on 15th March, 1912.

IN connexion with periodical exercises or manoeuvres, or in the event of relations becoming strained between Great Britain and any Naval Power, an Examination Service may come into force at the ports or localities mentioned at the end of this notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permission from the Examination Officer.

The institution of an Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with foreign powers are

known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night, to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination Steamer, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

If the entrance to a port is closed, three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

If the Examination Service is in force the Examination Steamer will be distinguished at night—

(a) When the port is closed, by three red vertical lights.

(b) When the port is open, by three white vertical lights.

The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

The astronomical positions are only approximate unless seconds are given. The bearings are given both true and magnetic.

for a period of eight weeks from the 16th September, 1912, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than sixty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said sixty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

BY-LAW NO. 33.—A BY-LAW FOR THE MAKING AND LEVYING
OF RATES FOR THE YEAR COMMENCING THE 1ST DAY OF
JULY, 1912.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (here-
inafter called the "Trust"), in pursuance of and
in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such
Trust by the Water Acts and of any other powers and
authorities in anywise enabling the said Trust in that
behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following for the
area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply
Works or any extension of such works:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be
levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements
liable to be rated within the said area, and supplied
with water for domestic purposes other than by
measure:—

- (I.) On any tenement (other than land on which
there is no building), the annual valuation
whereof does not exceed £16, Twenty shillings
per annum.
- (II.) On any such tenement, the annual valuation
whereof exceeds £16, Six pounds five shillings
per centum on the amount of the annual valua-
tion up to £300; Five pounds per centum on
the amount of the annual valuation exceeding
£300 and up to £700; and Three pounds fifteen
shillings per centum on the amount of the
annual valuation exceeding £700.
- (III.) On lands on which there is no building, Six
pounds five shillings per centum on the amount
of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the
year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1912, and ending
with the 30th day of June, 1913, and shall be payable
in two equal instalments on the 14th day of September,
1912, and the 2nd day of January, 1913.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time
appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby author-
ized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the
said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said
area, the valuation for the time being for all lands and
tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in
the municipal district of which such lands and tenements
are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation
of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any
of such lands and tenements are not included in a
valuation in force for the municipality in whose district
they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net
annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rate
be determined by a Police Magistrate.

CLAUSE RESCINDED, REGULATION MADE.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54, Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind clause 26 of Regulation XI.—“Military Drill”—of the Regulations under the *Education Act 1890*, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XI. (26).—CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY IN PHYSICAL TRAINING.

A Certificate of Competency in Physical Training will be granted upon examination in the subjects specified below:—

(1) *Practical*.—

- (a) Physical Exercises, as laid down in the Syllabus of Physical Exercises for schools 1909 London Board of Education, or approved equivalent.
- (b) Marching Drill, as prescribed in Appendix V., Regulations and Instructions for Universal Training under the *Defence Act 1903-1910*, or approved equivalent.
- (c) *Compulsory for Male Teachers Only*.—Miniature Rifle Shooting, as prescribed in Appendix VI., Regulations and Instructions for Universal Training under the *Defence Act 1903-1910*, or approved equivalent.

(d) Swimming, as prescribed in Appendix VII., Regulations and Instructions for Universal Training under the *Defence Act 1903-1910*, or approved equivalent.

(e) Running Exercises in Organized Games, as prescribed in Appendix VIII., Regulations and Instructions for Universal Training under *Defence Act 1903-1910*, or approved equivalent.

(f) First Aid, as prescribed in Appendix IX., Regulations and Instructions for Universal Training under *Defence Act 1903-1910*, or approved equivalent.

(2) *Theoretical*.—

Hygiene, as set forth in the first eleven chapters of Porter's "School Hygiene and the Laws of Health," pages 1-3, 12-44, 60-65, 76-83, 85-93, 102-105, 123-128, 133-136, 145-154, 166-187, 209-217, or approved equivalent.

No. 2071), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, exempt from the operation of such Act for such time as he thinks fit, any boilers which are used exclusively in any particular trade or business: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this Order exempt from the operation of the said Act, from and after the date hereof, boilers used exclusively in the trade or business of removing wallpaper by steaming, and constructed of sheet iron with shell—approximately cylindrical, fitted with dead-weight safety valve, steam valve, gauge-glass mounting, feed-water opening; capacity up to two cubic feet, and working pressure not exceeding five pounds per square inch.
