Health Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE CLEANLINESS AND FREEDOM FROM CONTAMINATION OF ARTICLES OF FOOD.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the power conferred by the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations for securing the cleanliness and freedom from contamination of certain articles of food, to wit, bread, meat, milk, and any other articles of food not usually contained in sealed packages:—

1. Every person engaged in the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, carriage, delivery, or sale of any of the above-described articles of food shall keep and maintain his clothing and body clean.

2. No person shall spit, smoke, or chew tobacco while engaged in the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, delivery, or sale of any of the above-described articles of food.

3. No person shall spit, smoke, or chew tobacco in any place where any of the above-described articles of food are manufactured, prepared, stored, packed, carried, delivered, or sold.

4. No person who is suffering from any contagious or infectious disease shall engage in the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, carriage, delivery, or sale of any of the above-described articles of food.

5. No person shall engage in the process known as repacking tea by means of stamping with the feet, whether in boots or overalls; all such repacking shall be done by means of clean iron weights, or wood blocks, or other methods, approved by the Board, and the tea shall be protected from contamination during the process.

6. No person shall sell, carry for sale, or deliver, or allow to be sold, carried for sale, or delivered any of the above-described articles of food in any place; or in any round from house to house, from any vehicle or can or other utensil unless his name and address are conspicuously inscribed thereon.

7. No person shall carry for sale or delivery on the footboard, or any part of the exterior of any vehicle, any of the above-described articles of food unless it is contained in a box, or receptacle, or appliance so constructed as to prevent such article of food from becoming contaminated with dust and flies.

8. No person shall receive, nor shall any person seek to return any of the above-described articles of food which has been delivered to any person or at any house or premises.

9. Any person who sells or exposes for sale, or stores for sale, or has in his possession for sale or delivery, or who exposes for human consumption on any counter, or in any bar, restaurant, hotel, or other premises, whether for sale or not, any of the above-described articles of food, shall protect such articles of food from flies, and as far as practicable from dust, by storage in covered receptacles or by means of metal covers or glass or other suitable covers; or by protecting all open windows, ventilators, and apertures by means of fly-proof wire gauze or other similar and effective material, and by providing automatically closing doors made of the same or a similar and effective material.

10. No person shall transport through any street or road or place any of the above-described articles of food for sale, or intended for sale or delivery, unless the same is protected from flies, and as far as practicable from dust.

11. Every person engaged in the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, carrying, delivery, or sale of any of the above-described articles of food, shall by the provision of suitable and effective means at all times protect the above-described articles of food and all ingredients used in the manufacture of such articles of food from rats, mice, cockroaches, flies, spiders, bugs, moths, and all other vermin, and from any unwholesome substance, odour, or smell.

12. Every person who uses any room or compartment, premises, or place for the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, carriage, delivery, or sale of any of the above-described articles of food, shall keep or cause to be kept every such room, compartment, premises, or place free from rats, mice, cockroaches, flies, spiders, bugs, moths, and all other vermin.

13. Every person who uses any room, compartment, premises, or place for the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, carriage, delivery, or sale of any of the above-described articles of food, shall keep such room, compartment, premises, or place clean, and shall cause the walls to be constructed or lined with some impervious

material, or other method approved by the Board, and shall cause all floors and ceilings to be properly constructed and kept in good repair, and to be constructed of such material as may be approved by the Board.

14. No person shall manufacture, prepare, store, pack, carry, deliver, sell, or offer or expose for sale, any of the above-described articles of food in any place which is at any time used as a sleeping compartment, or in which any animal is allowed to be or in which anything is kept or in which any work is carried on which would be likely to contaminate such articles of food, or injuriously affect its wholesomeness or cleanliness.

15. Every person engaged in the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, carriage, delivery, or sale of any of the above-described articles of food, shall keep or cause to be kept clean all vehicles, receptacles, articles, utensils, tools of trade, benches, fittings, machinery, or other appliance used for the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, carriage, delivery, or sale of the above-described articles of food.

16. No person shall use any vehicle, receptacle, articles, utensils, tools of trade, benches, fittings, machinery, or other appliances used for the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, carriage, delivery, or sale of any of the above-described articles of food for any other purpose, or which has been used for any other purpose, which would be likely to contaminate or injuriously affect the wholesomeness or cleanliness of any of the above-described articles of food.

17. No person shall enclose or carry or store wheat, oats, maize, potatoes, onions, fruit, or any other article of food in any bag or sack or similar receptacle which has at any time contained, or has been used for the conveyance of bone-dust or superphosphate or any other manure or mixture of manures.

18. Every person who consigns or sends milk in a wholesale quantity to a milk vendor for retail sale shall, prior to despatch, cause the cans or other receptacles by which it is conveyed to be securely closed by means of a leaden seal or a lock.

19. Every seal used, in pursuance of Regulation 18 of these Regulations, for the purpose of sealing any milk can shall be legibly impressed with not less than two distinctive capital letters which shall be the initials of the name of the producer, and shall be so placed that it shall be destroyed or broken by the act of opening the said milk can.

20. No wire or cord or string or other such article used in connexion with the sealing of a milk can shall be joined or tied at more than one point, and the said seal shall be placed upon the knot formed by the joining or tying of the said wire or cord or string or other such article.

21. No person shall sell from or carry for sale or deliver in any can or other vessel any skimmed milk or separated milk unless the said can or vessel is durably marked with, or bears a non-detachable label durably marked with, the following words:—

"Skim Milk," or "Skimmed Milk," or "Separated Milk."

The said words shall be conspicuously situated on the side, shoulder, or neck of the said vessel, and shall be formed of plainly legible black letters of not less than 14 inches in height on a white or light-coloured ground. The said can or vessel shall be placed or carried in a conspicuous position so that the words "Skim Milk," "Skimmed Milk" or "Separated Milk" shall at all times be exposed and clearly legible to the public.

22. No person shall use any milk can or other vessel for transport of milk from the place of production to the retail or wholesale vendor unless such milk can or other vessel is distinctly and permanently inscribed with the name and address of the producer of the milk.

23. No person shall use or allow to be used any milk can or vessel for the preparation, storage, carriage, or delivery of milk or cream or any other preparation of milk, unless such milk can or vessel is kept in a clean and wholesome condition, and in such a state of repair as to prevent leakage, and as to be free from dents such as would interfere with the easy and thorough cleansing of such milk can or vessel, and it shall be provided with a properly fitting lid so as to prevent leakage.

24. No person shall stop any hole or crack in any milk can or pack or stop any improperly fitting lid with paper or soap or rags or other temporary stopping of a like nature.

25. No person shall store, carry, deliver, sell, or expose for sale, or cause or allow to be stored, carried, delivered, sold, or exposed for sale for human consumption any milk which has been kept or stored in any premises or in any cooling or freezing chamber or store for a longer period of time than seventy-two hours from the time of the natural production of such milk from the cow.

26. Every person who serves food, liquors, refreshments, or causes or allows the same to be served in any licensed premises or restaurant or bar or counter or refreshment stall or booth or dining room or tea room or other place where drinking vessels or plates or other vessels or spoons or forks or knives are used in common shall cause every such drinking vessel or plate or other vessel or spoon or fork or knife to be thoroughly cleansed immediately after use.

27. In any of the aforementioned places named or described in Regulation 26 of these Regulations, where clean water under pressure is available, or where it can be made available, the cleansing of such drinking vessels or plates or other vessels or spoons or forks or knives shall be completed by means of clean and clear running water.

28. No person in any licensed premises or restaurant or bar or counter or refreshment stall or booth or dining room or tea room or other place where serviettes or table napkins are placed on a table used for serving meals to any customer, boarder, or any other person, shall place or allow to be placed on such table any serviette or table napkin which has been used as such by any other person unless such serviette or table napkin shall have been thoroughly washed and cleansed since the last occasion of use.

29. "Licensed premises" as used in these Regulations shall mean all premises licensed under the Licensing Acts of Victoria.

30. Any person contravening any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in addition to any penalty which may be incurred by any person for any contravention of these Regulations, any officer of the Board or any officer of any council may seize and the Board or any Council may confiscate any of the above-described articles of food, or any vehicle, receptacle, article, utensil, tool of trade, bench, fitting, machinery, or appliance used for the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, carriage, delivery, or sale of any of the above-described articles of food which he has reason to believe are used or may be used contrary to the provisions of these Regulations.

31. These Regulations shall apply to all vehicles and receptacles used for transport, hawking, or sale on any street or any place of the above-described articles of food.

32. The following Regulations are hereby repealed:—

Regulations made by the Board of Public Health—

- (a) For securing the cleanliness and freedom from contamination of articles of food, and dated 25th May, 1906.
- (b) Regulations for securing the cleanliness and freedom from contamination of articles of food, and dated 6th July, 1906.
- (c) A Regulation to secure the cleanliness and freedom from contamination and adulteration of milk during transport from place of production to the retail vendor, and dated 28th June, 1907.
- (d) Regulations for the protection of meat from contamination by dust and flies, and dated 7th April, 1909.
- (e) Further Regulations to secure the cleanliness and freedom from contamination and adulteration of milk, and dated 7th April, 1909.
- (f) Regulations prescribing the methods of labelling of vessels containing skimmed milk or separated milk, and dated 7th April, 1909.
- (g) Regulations prohibiting the use of manure bags and sacks for the conveyance of articles of food, and dated 7th April, 1909.
- (h) Regulation for securing the cleanliness and freedom from contamination of bread, and dated 28th July, 1909.
- (i) Further Regulations to secure the cleanliness and freedom from contamination and adulteration of milk, and dated 9th March, 1910.
- (j) Regulations relating to the cleansing of drinking vessels, and dated 11th January, 1911.

These Regulations shall take effect from the first day of October, 1912.

THE DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE Dental Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth, by virtue of the powers vested in it by the *Dentists Act 1898*, make the following Regulation:—

"Any student who was indentured on or before the 31st of December 1901 and shall before the 23rd day of August 1912, have completed the four years of the course of professional study necessary to obtain the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria but shall not have passed the prescribed Preliminary Examination shall upon passing the Preliminary Examination referred to in Regulation II. of the Regulations made by the Dental Board of Victoria on the 28th day of April 1899 and approved by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of May, 1899, and upon fulfilling the other conditions necessary for the said Diploma be entitled to such Diploma."

This Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria, held on the twenty-third day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twelve.

Health Act 1890.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OF OVERCROWDING AND OBSTRUCTION IN GANGWAYS, PASSAGES, AND AISLES IN ANY PUBLIC BUILDING.

THE Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 233 of the *Health Act 1890* and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth make the following Regulation with a view to the prevention of overcrowding and obstruction in gangways, passages, and aisles, and generally to secure public safety in public buildings, that is to say:—

1. *Overcrowding.*—The seating space assigned for each person throughout the auditorium shall be not less than 17 inches by 30 inches. Where continuous seating is provided each seat shall be clearly defined, and no more tickets shall be issued than the number of seats actually available.

No standing space shall be permitted except in those parts of the auditorium specially set apart and approved by the Board of Public Health, and not more than one person to every 2 feet superficial of floor area shall be allowed in any such space.

Unless otherwise exempted by the Board of Public Health all seats in the auditorium of every public building shall be firmly secured to the floor, and where it is found impracticable to fix the seating as aforesaid, all movable seats shall be secured together in rows from gangway to gangway, and no single loose seat or seats shall be placed in any part of the auditorium except in positions specially allowed by the Board.

2. *Gangways, &c., to be kept Clear.*—All aisles, gangways, and passages throughout the auditorium of every public building shall be kept clear and free from obstruction of any kind, and no person shall be allowed to stand in or occupy any aisle, passageway, or gangway of any public building during any performance, lecture, concert, or any public assemblage.

The person or persons in charge of any public entertainment, or the owner or lessee under whom or by whose authority such person or persons occupy the said building, shall be responsible for keeping the said aisles, passages, and gangways clear and free from obstruction.

3. Regulation 1 shall not apply to any public building, the floor area of the auditorium of which, including gangways, contains less than 1,000 superficial feet.

Regulation No. 2 of Part II. of the Regulations made on 24th September, 1886, under section one hundred and ten of the *Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, is hereby repealed.

4. *Penalties*.—Any person who fails to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section three hundred and twenty-six of the *Health Act 1890*, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

No. 2106) it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations for prescribing all matters necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

Regulation 15. Cancel existing regulation and substitute the following:—

Every inmate shall work at some trade or vocation or be employed in some labour—

- (a) An inmate employed at a trade at which he is proficient, whose conduct is satisfactory and the products of whose work are sold or disposed of, shall be credited with one-half of the net proceeds remaining after deducting the cost of his maintenance in the prison. Provided always that inmates in the second grade shall be credited with not more than one-fourth, and inmates in the third grade with not more than one-eighth of the net proceeds remaining after deducting the cost of their maintenance in the prison.
- (b) An inmate of the first grade employed as a skilled artisan or tradesman, whose conduct is good, and the products of whose work are not sold, shall be credited with an amount not exceeding 1s. 6d. per diem according to the nature and quality of the work. An inmate of the first grade employed in the service of the prison or on unskilled labour, whose conduct is good and whose work is satisfactory, shall be credited with an amount not exceeding 1s. per diem. Inmates of the second grade shall be credited in like manner with not more than one-half, and inmates of the third grade with not more than one-fourth of the above rates.
- (c) Provided that after an inmate has been in the first grade for a period of twelve months the amount with which he is to be credited as herein provided shall be reduced by one-fourth, and after remaining in the first division for eighteen months such amount shall be reduced by one-half.

Regulation No. 21. After "Reformatory" add, "and for the purposes of dealing with offences against such rules and regulations the Superintendent may exercise all or any of the powers conferred by the said Act on the Governor of a gaol."

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF WARRANDYTE.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The survey fee must be paid within 28 days of demand, and will range from £9 to £11 per allotment.

The lease will be subject to the following conditions:—

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land if in the first class, to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the lease, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of each year of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease.
