"SEALARK" reports a pinnacle rock with a least depth of 11 feet over it at L.W.O.S. exists in the undermentioned position from the rock, north Barnard Island Lighthouse bears south 17 degrees east distance 6 9-10ths miles, and the 867-ft. summit about 1 1/4 miles north-westward of entrance to Mourilyan Harbor bears south 64 degrees west distance 2 6-10ths miles on chart 2350. RESTRICTIONS RE FISHING (INCLUDING THE TAKING OF OYSTERS) IN WESTERN PORT.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamation dated the seventh day of May, 1900, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the nineteenth day of May, 1909, re "Taking Oysters in Western Port"; and to also revoke the Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of February, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of February, 1908, re "Restriction on Netting, &c., in Western Port"; and to also revoke the Proclamation dated the first day of February, 1900, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the tenth day of February, 1909, re "Restrictions for the Regulation of Fishing, Western Port"; and to in lieu of the said Proclamations make a Proclamation for the following purposes, namely:—

1. Prohibiting the use, during the whole of each year, of all seine nets (including garfish nets) within half-a-mile from the north-eastern and eastern shore of Western Port, between Lyall's Point (Pelican Point) and the Queens-ferry Jetty.
2. Prohibiting the use, in Western Port during the whole of each year, of all seine nets (including garfish nets) which contain any meshes measuring between knots more than one inch and a quarter and less than one inch and a half, and all set or mesh nets which contain any meshes measuring between knots less than one inch and three-quarters; the measurement of the meshes to be ascertained by measuring the length on the diagonal, or between knot and knot of opposite corners, the net being first wetted and tanned, or otherwise prepared for use. In case of dispute or doubt, a half-pound weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mesh in order to produce a fair strain or extension, and the space between the knots shall be measured forthwith while the mesh remains extended. If the net is dry the part to be measured shall be soaked in either fresh or salt water for not less than ten minutes, and the mesh so soaked shall then be measured; provided that the use of existing nets which are not in accordance with these conditions, and which cannot be altered to accord therewith, will be allowed for one year.
3. Prohibiting the use in Western Port of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, from noon on every Saturday until midnight on the following Sunday.
4. Prohibiting the taking of oysters from or in Western Port from midnight on every Friday until midnight on the following Sunday, and limiting the quantity of oysters to be taken by each person to seven bags, of three bushels capacity each, between midnight on any Sunday and midnight on the following Friday.
5. Prohibiting the removal of any boat having on board or attached or in tow, any trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, including any oyster dredge or oystering gear, from any wharf, pier, jetty, or anchorage within Western Port between noon on every Saturday and midnight on the following Sunday.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 14 (1) (a) of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1907* (7 Edward VII. The balance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments, calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. THE land is situated on the west side of the Mildura line, near Carwarp and Yatpool railway stations, and is from 10 to 20 miles from Mildura.

#### CITY OF MALVERN.

##### By-LAW No. 53.

A By-law of the City of Malvern, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 53, for suppressing nuisances and for compelling residents or occupiers of premises to keep them free from offensive or unwholesome matters, and for providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district, and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases, and for the destruction of rats.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Malvern order as follows:—

1. Every occupier of premises within the municipal district shall cause to be provided and kept therein a sufficient number of covered galvanized-iron receptacles, each such receptacle not exceeding one and one-half cubic feet in contents, and of a uniform size and pattern, for the reception of the garbage and refuse arising from or upon such premises and corresponding with the following:—

Each such receptacle to be cylindrical in shape, of galvanized-iron of twenty-four gauge, coated on the inside with distilled tar, strengthened at the top with a wrought-iron band and at bottom with wrought-iron band one and one-half inches wide by one-eighth of an inch thick to keep bottom off ground, stiffened with two hoop-iron bands crossing beneath the bottom and carried up sides to rim, and to be fourteen inches in diameter and fifteen inches deep, and to be provided with good stout rigid side handles and a flat conical cover, fitting easily over receptacle.

2. Every such occupier shall cause all refuse or garbage receptacles in use on his premises and the covers thereof to be kept as clean as practicable, and shall cause such receptacles to be sufficiently disinfected with some efficient disinfectant and deodorant when necessary, and shall also cause such receptacles to be maintained in good order and condition, and all refuse or garbage arising from or upon such premises from time to time to be deposited in such receptacles, and shall cause such receptacles to be continuously covered save when garbage or refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom.

3. Every such occupier shall cause such receptacles to be placed within four feet of the gate or door of his premises, whichever shall be nearest to the street on which the said premises abut, upon the day or days as may from time to time be appointed by the Council for emptying the same.

4. Every occupier of premises within the municipal district shall from time to time—

- (a) Suppress or destroy, or cause to be suppressed or destroyed, all rats from time to time in, about, or upon any premises occupied by him.
- (b) Remove or cause to be removed all rubbish and filth in, upon, or about such premises which is or may be a harborage for rats.
- (c) Dig out, stop up, or fill up, or otherwise suppress all holes and burrows in or upon such premises which are or may be a harborage for rats.

5. The occupier of any premises within the municipal district shall not leave or suffer to be left on such premises the carcass of any rat or any part thereof, and shall cause the same to be burnt or otherwise completely destroyed.

6. The owner of any building other than a produce store within the municipal district, the floors or skirtings of which are in such a condition as to permit the harboring of rats in, upon, or about such building shall, within one month after service upon him of a notice from the Council, signed by the Town Clerk, requiring him so to do, cause such floors or skirtings to be so repaired as to prevent, as far as practicable, the harboring of rats in, upon, or about such building.

7. The owner of any premises within the municipal district upon which is a produce store shall, within one month after service upon him of a notice from the Council, signed by the Town Clerk, requiring him so to do, cause the floors thereof to be so constructed of stone, bricks, concrete, asphalt, or such other material impervious to rats as shall prevent as far as practicable the harboring of rats in or about such store.

8. Any owner of premises within the municipal district who shall after the coming into operation of this By-law construct, use, or let any building thereon for the purpose of a produce store, or who shall convert or allow, or suffer to be converted, any building thereon into a produce store, shall cause the floors thereof to be constructed of stone, bricks, concrete, asphalt, or such other material impervious to rats as shall prevent as far as practicable the harboring of rats in or about such building.

9. The owner of any premises within the municipal district upon which is a fodder store shall, within one month after service upon him of a notice from the Council, signed by the Town Clerk, requiring him so to do, cause such fodder store to be floored with concrete, bricks, stone, asphalt, or other material impervious to rats, and the walls, ceilings, and partitions (if any) thereof to be so reconstructed, altered, or repaired as to prevent as far as practicable the harborage of rats therein or the access of rats thereto.

10. Any person who shall hereafter construct any building within the municipal district for the purpose of, or who shall convert any building within the said district into, a fodder store, shall cause the same to be floored with concrete, stone, bricks, asphalt, or other material impervious to rats, and the walls, ceilings, and partitions (if any) thereof to be so constructed or altered as to prevent as far as practicable the harborage of rats therein or the access of rats thereto.

11. The owner of any building upon any premises within the municipal district on which there is any private drain or sewer of such a nature as to permit the entry of rats to such premises shall, within fourteen days after the service upon him of a notice from the Council, signed by the Town Clerk, requiring him so to do, cause such drain or sewer to be covered at the end thereof out of which the drainage or sewage shall flow or be emptied with a grating of such a kind or wire netting of such a mesh and strength as to prevent the entry of rats through such drain or sewer into or upon such premises.

12. The occupier of any premises within the municipal district shall, upon production of any notice served upon the owner thereof, under the provisions of this By-law, allow such owner, his servants and workmen, or any of them, free access to such premises and every part thereof, for the purpose of enabling him and them, or any of them, to comply with the terms of such notice.

13. In case where notice to any owner, occupier, or other person is required to be served under this By-law, such notice may be served upon such owner, occupier, or person by delivering the same to him personally or by posting the same in a prepaid letter addressed to such owner, occupier, or person at his last-known place of abode.

14. In the construction of this By-law—

“Municipal district” means the City of Malvern.

“Council” means the Council of the City of Malvern.

“Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk, or the person for the time being acting as Town Clerk, of the City of Malvern.

“Premises” includes land and buildings.

“Building” includes portion of a building.

“Produce store” includes any building wherein wheat, oats, barley, maize, bran, pollard, hay, lucerne, and chaff, or any one or more of them, are exposed for sale.

“Fodder store” includes any building used on premises within the municipal district in connexion with any stable, cow yard, or cattle shed on such premises in which building wheat, oats, barley, maize, bran, pollard, hay, lucerne, and chaff, or any one or more of them, are kept or stored.

“Occupier” includes the owner of premises where the same are unoccupied.

And words and expressions not hereinbefore defined shall in this By-law have the meanings (if any) assigned to them respectively by the *Local Government Act 1903*, and with regard to all other words, terms, and expressions a similar construction shall be applied as the *Acts Interpretation Act 1890* provides for the interpretation of Acts of Parliament.

15. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five shillings for each such breach.

16. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

17. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication as provided by the *Local Government Act 1903* in the *Government Gazette*.
