NOTICE TO BOATMEN, ETC.

[No. 20.]

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with their Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley course, on the Upper Yarra, on the 26th October, 1912, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz. :—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the Port Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, or unsuitable, shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or any objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such as have permission of the Port Officer or his deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the Port Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 12 noon and 12 midnight on Henley Day, provided that all motor boats shall be at their moorings not later than 12.30 p.m., and remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the Port Officer, Customs House, Flinders-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to the stern of the boat.

All motor boats to be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, unless the Port Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light, and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early application to the Port Officer for same is invited. Applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must either use the mooring pegs provided on the north side of the river, or provide their own mooring pegs at places directed by the officer controlling the course.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 12 feet.

Ships' cutters and other large boats, or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 12 noon and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE KORUMBURRA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE KORUMBURRA CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act* 1890, the Trustees of the Korumburra Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tomb-stone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.
6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day, and on payment of the fee as provided.
10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.
13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.
14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.
16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.
17. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation, namely:—

No. 351. "No lighter shall be used within the Port unless it is licensed for the purpose for which it is to be so used in addition to the licence provided for by Regulation 116.

"All applications for such licences shall be accompanied by the certificate of a duly-qualified Marine Surveyor, approved of by the Commissioners, setting out that such Marine Surveyor has personally examined such lighter, with the date of such examination, and that such lighter is stout, staunch, and in good condition, and in every respect suitable for the purpose for which the licence is sought.

"A fresh certificate shall be obtained on every application for a renewal of such licence, that is to say, once at least in every twelve months, or within such shorter period as may be found necessary by the Harbor Master.

"Every lighter shall have the number of her licence painted on both bows in 12-inch block figures, white on black ground.

"Every lighter shall have two grooves cut into the planking from stem to stern post of not less than 2 inches in width, and painted white to denote the loaded and light draught lines; the lower edge of these grooves to be on level with the water's edge to mark these measurements; such marks and corresponding draught of water shall be indorsed upon the licences.

"Every such licence may be suspended or revoked if from any cause the lighter in respect of which such licence has been issued shall become unseaworthy or in the opinion of the Harbor Master unfit for the use for which it is licensed, and every such licence when so suspended or revoked shall be delivered up to the Commissioners, and the said lighter shall be dealt with as the Harbor Master shall direct.

"This Regulation shall be incorporated with and form part of and be construed with the Regulations of the said Commissioners, made and passed on the twenty-seventh day of September, One thousand nine hundred and seven."

MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation, namely:—

No. 350 "(a) All ales, wines, spirits, or other fermented or spirituous liquor imported and landed upon any transit wharf or in any open or closed transit shed shall be removed therefrom within forty-eight hours after having been so landed or placed thereon or therein, and unless such liquor shall be so removed may be removed by the harbor-master and stored at the risk and expense of the owners or consignees thereof, and payment of the costs, charges, and expenses attending such removal and storage may be enforced and recovered in the same manner as

tolls, rates, charges, and expenses are enforceable and recoverable under section 117 of the Act. Provided that no such liquor liable to duty shall be removed unless with the consent of the landing surveyor in charge of the Customs station. If any such liquor shall not be removed from any wharf or any open or closed transit shed within the time specified there shall be payable to the Commissioners in respect of the use of such shed the sum of One shilling per ton for the first week, and for every subsequent week the sum of Threepence per ton additional to the amount per ton payable for each immediately preceding week, that is to say, One shilling and threepence for the second week, One shilling and sixpence for the third week, and so on. For the purposes of this Regulation a fraction of a ton shall be deemed a ton, and a part of a week shall be deemed a week. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the harbor-master, without notice, from removing or ordering the removal to some bonded warehouse of any such liquor at any time after the respective times hereinbefore appointed for its removal, and the owner of such liquor shall pay all such charges and expenses connected with such removal, including the warehouse rent and charges.

"(b) All such liquor may be removed by the consignee or owners to the Harbor Trust shed, situated in Mountain-street, and known as the Wet Shed, and may there remain free of charge for a period of twelve days from the date of landing from the importing vessel, but at the risk of the consignee or owner.

"(c) The owners or consignees of all such liquor remaining in the Wet Shed after the expiration of twelve days from the date of landing from the importing vessel shall pay to the Commissioners in respect of the use of such shed One shilling per ton for the first week, and for every subsequent week the sum of Threepence per ton additional to the amount per ton payable for each immediately preceding week, that is to say, One shilling and threepence per ton for the second week, One shilling and sixpence per ton for the third week, and so on. For the purposes of this Regulation a fraction of a ton shall be deemed a ton, and a part of a week shall be deemed a week.

"(d) All such liquor not removed from the Wet Shed within thirty days of having been placed therein may be removed by the Commissioners and placed in the King's Warehouse or a bonded store, subject to the lien of the Commissioners thereon for all charges and expenses incurred previously thereto.

"This Regulation shall be incorporated with and form part of and be construed with the Regulations of the said Commissioners, made and passed on the twenty-seventh day of September, One thousand nine hundred and seven."

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

PROPOSED DINGEE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Water Acts, I hereby declare that the lands included in the area defined hereunder, and shown on a plan lodged in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne, ought to be constituted an Irrigation and Water Supply District.

The source of supply is to be the Goulburn River by way of the Goulburn-Waranga Main Channel, the Waranga Reservoir, and the Main Channel westward therefrom.

The season at which such supply is to be received is to embrace the whole year.

SUNBURY WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1912.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* 1905, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1912 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of Sunbury Waterworks Trust, also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets on which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Bulla, the minimum amount to be paid in respect of any tenement to be not less than Twenty shillings.

2. For all unoccupied allotments, a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For water supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which would be equal to the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied; and where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 30,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. For any public water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of Thirty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of One shilling; and for each load in excess of 200 gallons, *pro rata* on the above scale.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable, in advance, on the 20th October, 1912, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

CROWLAND AND NAVARRE RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST.

REGULATION NO. 1.

FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST, AND GENERALLY
FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE
TRUST.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (No. 1288) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under Part I. of the said Act for the purposes following:—

"(a) The mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under the said Part of the said Act are to be convened;

"(b) The form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under the said Act; and

"(c) Generally for regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of such Trusts and the numbers of members to form quorums thereof, and the appointment of the Chairman of each Trust, and for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part of the said Act."

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts, and known as the Crowland and Navarre Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulation following, viz.:-

1. First Meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.

2. Time and place of meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.

3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least five members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of four members, exclusive of the Chairman.

4. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.

5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.

6. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and be willing to act.

7. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.

8. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

9. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

10. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.

11. Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting of a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any Committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.

12. Order of business of meetings.—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

(i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.

(ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.

(iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

(iv.) Presentation of reports of Committees.

(v.) Payments.

(vi.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.

(vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.

(viii.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.

(ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.

(x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

13. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

14. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

15. Notice of motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

16. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

17. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

18. Motion to be moved by member giving notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

19. Mover of motion appointing committee to be a member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

20. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

21. Order, &c., of debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the Chair may proceed with his subject.

22. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

23. No motion to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

24. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

25. Mover of motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

26. Motions, &c., how decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

27. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.

28. Priority of members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.

29. Members to stand while addressing the Trust.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

30. Points of order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

31. Members not to digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

32. Members to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

33. Members called to order to sit down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.

34. Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

35. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

36. Members may demand documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

37. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

38. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

39. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any other order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

40. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

41. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

43. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

44. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.

45. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

46. No debate shall take place upon petitions.—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.

47. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or Committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.

48. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

49. Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

50. Appointment, &c., of officers.—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

51. Salaries of officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

52. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

53. Common seal.—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

54. Suspension of rules.—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

55. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

And the Honorable Peter McBride, His Majesty's Minister of Railways for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BOROUGH OF OAKLEIGH.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Borough of Oakleigh, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 9, for the following purposes:—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to any such By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Oakleigh order as follows:—

1. That By-laws No. 6 of 4th June, 1907; No. 7 of 29th October, 1907; and No. 8 of 3rd May, 1910, made by the Borough of Oakleigh, are hereby repealed as and from the date of this By-law coming into operation.

2. On and after the coming into force of this By-law no person shall erect or construct, or commence to erect or construct, or cause or suffer to be erected, constructed, commenced, or placed upon any land or street within the Borough of Oakleigh any building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection without first obtaining a permit or licence from the Council to such building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection, and submitting to the Council an application, in writing, for the same, together with a properly prepared plan, drawn to scale and complete specification, together with an estimate of

the cost of the proposed building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection, and the location and dimensions of the land on which such building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection is proposed to be erected or constructed, and leaving a copy of same with the Council; and any person offending against this part of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding £20.

3. And if any building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection be commenced, erected, constructed, or placed upon any land or street within the Borough of Oakleigh without having first made the application in writing, obtained the permit or licence of the Council as aforesaid, or if any building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection be not erected, constructed, or placed in accordance with the permit or licence of the Council as aforesaid, the Council may, by notice in writing, signed by the Town Clerk, given to such person or placed on some conspicuous part of the building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or erection, require such building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection to be forthwith pulled down and removed; and if such person does not begin to pull down and remove such building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection within seven days after such notice has been given or placed as aforesaid, and complete the pulling down and removal of such building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection as speedily as the nature of the case will permit, or within a date to be fixed by the Council, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £20.

4. And in case any such building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection be not pulled down and removed within the time aforesaid the Council may, with all convenient speed, cause such building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or erection to be pulled down and removed, and for that purpose may break down any fences surrounding the land on which such building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection is situate, and may enter upon such land, and the Council may sell the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses incurred in or connected with the pulling down or removal of such building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection, and any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof, and the Council shall restore any overplus arising from such sale to the owner on demand.

5. No person shall commence, erect, construct, or place, or cause or suffer to be commenced, erected, constructed, or placed upon any land within the Borough of Oakleigh any building or dwelling having a distance between the floors and ceilings thereof of less than ten feet, except when allowed by the Council or its officers, nor of less dimensions or area on the ground floor in any street within the Borough which is specified in the following list, viz.:—

No person shall commence, erect, construct, or place, or cause or suffer to be commenced, erected, constructed, or placed upon any land within the Borough of Oakleigh any building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection constructed of wood unless the same shall be distant at least five feet from any street and four feet from any part of the boundary line of the allotment on which it is erected, constructed, or placed, and any building, dwelling, verandah, hoarding, or other erection erected, constructed, or placed contrary to the provisions of this clause may be dealt with by the Council in the manner provided in clauses 3 and 4 of this By-law.

7. No verandah upon or across any street or footway erected or constructed under these Regulations shall be of less height in every part thereof from the ground than eight feet and six inches.

8. Two or more buildings or dwelling-houses may be erected in one block on land belonging to the same owner, and shall then be separated from each other by a wall of brick or stone at least eight and one-half inches in thickness, and carried up to at least one foot above the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same, and projecting at least one inch beyond the face of the woodwork or spouting.

9. No privy shall be attached to any dwelling, wash-house, or room used for domestic purposes except at a distance of ten feet from such dwelling, wash-house, or room; and every such privy, whether already built or hereafter to be built, must have a door and be properly enclosed, screened, and fenced from public view.

10. Subject to the provisions of clause 9 of this By-law, any privy may abut on any right-of-way at a distance of not less than five feet from any street, and four feet from the adjoining allotment.

11. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, green-house, fern-house, or to any outhouse, not being a privy, abutting on any right-of-way, and being not less than five feet from any street or four feet from the adjoining allotment, or to any Government buildings, works, or operations.

12. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the Council may, under special circumstances, by resolution, exempt any proposed building or dwelling from any of the provisions of clauses 5 and 6 of this By-law.

13. The fees to be paid to the Council for inspection of any plan shall be Two shillings (2s.) per square of 10 ft. x 10 ft., and shall be lodged with the application for the permit or licence.

14. This By-law shall come into operation as and from the 11th day of July, 1912.
