RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE LANDSBOROUGH PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LANDSBOROUGH PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Landsborough Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.
6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day, and on payment of the special fee as provided.
10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

1. The following general rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Long Lake Waterworks District, except within any Urban District thereof:—

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands, and for watering cattle or other stock:—

- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Seven and one-half pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1912, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1913, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of October, 1912, at the office of the said Commission at Swan Hill.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate, the value of the lands set out in the valuation made in accordance with the provisions of the Water Act 1905 by F. Bassett, valuer, returned on the 9th day of September, 1910, and

adopted by the said Commission on the 10th day of October, 1910, and in the supplementary valuation made by the said F. Bassett, valuer, returned on the 22nd day of September, 1911, and adopted by the said Commission on the 25th day of September, 1911, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands, unless altered or amended as provided by the Water Acts; and if so altered or amended, then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1913, NO. 17.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1913 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.
2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling.
3. For every unoccupied allotment of land and for every vacant piece of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land, provided that in no case shall a rate less than Ten shillings be charged.

For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates, and all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.
5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, there shall be paid the sum of Five pounds (£5) sterling.
6. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1913.

Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

BY-LAW No. 33.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1913 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Fifteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound five shillings sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of One shilling and eightpence in the One pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust, of Twelve pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of more than Twelve pounds annual municipal value, an amount of One shilling and eightpence in the One pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every water-trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied by measurement by the Trust, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market-gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purpose, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for market-gardens), equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate charged for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, and the first day of July in each year.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. For water supplied to market-gardens, the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 200,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply is to be by meter only.

11. For water supplied to breweries, the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

13. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

14. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

15. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1913, excepting the charge for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

For every house or tenement above the annual value of Fourteen pounds six shillings, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling on the net annual value of such rateable property.

For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on the streets in which the pipes for the supply of water are laid, and which tenements are not supplied with water by the reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter (¼) of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, half (½) of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter (¼) of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half (½) a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation for the time being.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1913, commencing on the first day of January, and terminating on the thirty-first day of December, 1913, and shall be payable on the first day of January, 1913.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, sue for, and recover such rates.

BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 26.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1905*, hereby make the following By-law for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied, or available for supply, within the Urban District of the Trust during the calendar year 1913:—

(1) The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands, houses, and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied, or available for supply, to such land, houses, tenements, situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1913, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1913; and such person or persons, as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

(a) On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.

(b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.

(c) On all vacant allotments of land, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of the municipal valuation thereof.

(d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

(e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of subsection (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

(g) Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by agreement at the discretion of the Trust.

(h) Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20 the trough to be exempt from rating purposes except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

(i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons by measurement, at the discretion of the Trust; a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.

(j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of £1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.

(k) The service-pipe for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—

(1) For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal value, half (½) inch diameter.

For domestic supply of premises with an annual municipal valuation of Forty pounds or over, a three-quarter (¾) of an inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

(2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

(l) Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main.

(m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons, in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for a domestic supply may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

(2) The rates and charges for water, and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law, shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or the owner or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

(3) The said rates and all charges for water supplied, otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the first day of January, 1913, and on the first day of July, 1913.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when the occupier or owner shall become liable to pay the rates for the supply of water hereinbefore mentioned.

In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

5. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st December shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

6. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense provide a meter.

7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

8. The foregoing rates are made payable on the 1st March, 1913.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

UNDER the provisions of section 23 of the *Education Act 1890*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation as an addition to the Regulations under the *Education Act 1890*, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXXIX.—ESTABLISHMENT OF SCHOOLS FOR FEEBLE-MINDED CHILDREN, FOR THE DEAF AND DUMB, AND FOR THE BLIND.

1. That schools be established for feeble-minded children, for the deaf and dumb, and for the blind.

2. That a School Committee, consisting of not less than seven members, may be appointed by the Governor in Council for each of such schools.

3. That the course of study in such schools shall include such subjects as may be determined upon by the Director with the approval of the Minister of Public Instruction.

4. That teachers appointed to such schools shall be classified in the Professional Division of the Public Service, in accordance with the provisions of the Public Service Acts.

5. That pupils presented for admission to such schools or in attendance at such schools may at any time be required to undergo examination by a school medical officer, and the Minister shall have power to admit or exclude any pupil presented for admission, or exclude from further attendance any child in attendance at such school.

And the Honorable Alfred Arthur Billson, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

UNDER the provisions of section 23 of the *Education Act 1890*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation X.—Continuation Schools for the Training of Junior Teachers—Clause 7 (c). A Regulation of the City of Essendon (numbered 36) made under Part IX. of By-law No. 12 of the City of Essendon, for regulating bathing in the open.

1. Regulation No. 18 is hereby repealed.
2. No person shall dress or undress, or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.
3. No person shall bathe unless dressed in a "Canadian" bathing costume, which shall effectually cover the body from the neck to the knees, so as to observe proper decency; such costume to be similar to the sample on view at the Town Hall, Essendon.
4. No person clothed in bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter on, or run along the beach, strand, or river bank, but shall proceed in a direct line between the dressing place and the river.
5. No person shall play games in, loiter in, misconduct himself in, commit a nuisance in, bring any rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter into, or damage, or disfigure, or write upon any of the dressing sheds or enclosures set apart for bathers by the Council.
6. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane or obscene language or behave in an indecent manner on any part of the beach, strand, or river bank, river, dressing sheds, or enclosures.
7. Except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident, no male over the age of ten years shall trespass in any dressing shed, latrine, or other enclosure reserved for the use of females, and except as aforesaid no female shall trespass in any dressing shed, latrine, or other enclosure reserved for the use of males.
8. This Regulation shall apply to and have operation within the municipal district of the City of Essendon, or within 300 yards of the boundary thereof, and not within any borough.
