Reles and Regulations of the Landsborough Public Cemetery.

No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same
- o. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day, and on payment of the special fee as provided.
- 10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be ropen to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

r6. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

# STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

By LAW NO. 334.—GENERAL RATE.—LONG LAKE WATER-WORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Long Lake Waterworks District:—

1. The following general rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Long Lake Waterworks District, except within any Urban District

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands, and for water-ing cattle or other stock:—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne, and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the office of the Commission at Swan Hill, the Post Office at Goschen, the Post Office at Ultima, and the Post Office at Lulhert—a rate of Thirty pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

  (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Fifteenpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

  (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Seven and one-half pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1912, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1913, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of October, 1912, at the office of the said Commission at Swan Hill.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate, the value of the lands set out in the valuation made in accordance with the provisions of the Water Act 1905 by F. Bassett, valuer, returned on the 9th day of September, 1910, and

adopted by the said Commission on the 10th day of October, 1910, and in the supplementary valuation made by the said F. Bassett, valuer, returned on the 22nd day of September, 1911, and adopted by the said Commission on the 25th day of September, 1911, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands, unless altered or amended as provided by the Water Acts; and if so altered or amended, then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20 the trough to be exempt from rating purposes except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

  (i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of 1s, per 1,000 gallons by measurement, at the discretion of the Trust; a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.

(i) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of £1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.

(k) The service-pipe for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—

(1) For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal value, half (½) inch diameter.

For domestic supply of premises with an annual municipal valuation of Forty pounds or over, a three-quarter (¾) of an inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

(2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

(1) Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main.

(m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of 1s, per 1,000 gallons, in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for a domestic supply may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

(2) The rates and charges for water, and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law, shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or the owner or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

4. No person clothed in bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter on, or run along the beach, strand, or river bank, but shall proceed in a direct line between the dressing place and the river.

5. No person shall play games in, loiter in, misconduct

but shall proceed in a direct line between the dressing place and the river.

5. No person shall play games in, loiter in, misconduct himself in, commit a nuisance in, bring any rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter into, or damage, or disfigure, or write upon any of the dressing sheds or enclosures set apart for bathers by the Council.

6. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane or obscene language or behave in an indecent manner on any part of the beach, strand, or river bank, river, dressing sheds, or enclosures.

7. Except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident, no male over the age of ten years shall trespass in any dressing shed, latrine, or other enclosure reserved for the use of females, and except as atoresaid no female shall trespass in any dressing shed, latrine, or other enclosure reserved for the use of males.

8. This Regulation shall apply to and have operation within 300 yards of the boundary thereof, and not within any borough.
