WHEREAS by section 75 of the Licensing Act 1890 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make (and when made, may at any time alter or repeal) rules for regulating the practice and proceedings of the Licensing Courts and for prescribing the forms to be used in proceedings in the said Courts: And whereas by section 106 of the Licensing Act 1906 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, pursuant to the provisions of section 75 of the Licensing Act 1890, make regulations prescribing the forms of certificates, licences, permits, applications, orders, and forms required under the Licensing Acts: And whereas it is amongst other things enacted by section 14 of the Spirit Merchants' Licences Act 1912, that the provisions of the Licensing Acts, with regard to the making by the Governor in Council of rules, regulations, and forms, shall extend and apply to the making by the Governor in Council of rules, regulations, and forms necessary or convenient for carrying out and giving effect to the provisions of the said Spirit Merchants' Licences Act 1912: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the said recited powers, doth hereby prescribe that the forms numbered respectively I., II., and III. in the Schedule hereto, with such alterations or additions thereto as the case may require, shall, from the date of the passing of this Rule, be the forms to be used under the said Spirit Merchants' Cicences Act 1912, for making any application for a Spirit Merchant's pricences act 1912, for making any application for a Spirit Merchant's pricences act 1912, for making any application for a Spirit Merchant's cicences Act 1912, for making any application for a Spirit Merchant's cicences act 1912, for making any application for a Spirit Merchant's cicences Act 1912, for making any application for
