### RESTRICTIONS RE FISHING (INCLUDING THE TAKING OF OYSTERS) IN WESTERN PORT.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamation dated the seventh day of May, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the nineteenth day of May, 1909, re "Taking Oysters in Western Port"; and to also revoke the Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of February, 1908, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of February, 1908, re "Restriction on Netting, &c., in Western Port"; and to also revoke the Proclamation dated the first day of February, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the tenth day of February, 1909, re "Restrictions for the Regulation of Fishing, Western Port"; and to in lieu of the said Proclamations make a Proclamation for the following purposes, namely:—

1. Prohibiting the use, during the whole of each year, of all seine nets (including garfish nets) within half-a-mile from the north-eastern and eastern shore of Western Port, between Lyall's Point (Pelican Point) and the Queensferry Jetty.

2. Prohibiting the use, in Western Port during the whole of each year, of all seine nets (including garfish nets) which contain any meshes measuring between knots more than one inch and a quarter and less than one inch and a half, and all set or mesh nets which contain any meshes measuring between knots less than one inch and three-quarters; the measurement of the meshes to be ascertained by measuring the length on the diagonal, or between knot and knot of opposite corners, the net being first wetted and tanned, or otherwise prepared for use. In case of dispute or doubt, a half-pound weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mesh in order to produce a fair strain or extension, and the space between the knots shall be measured forthwith while the mesh remains extended. If the net is dry the part to be measured shall be soaked in either fresh or salt water for not less than ten minutes, and the mesh so soaked shall then be measured; provided that the use of existing nets which are not in accordance with these conditions, and which cannot be altered to accord therewith, will be allowed for one year.

3. Prohibiting the use in Western Port of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, from noon on every Saturday until midnight on the following Sunday.

4. Prohibiting the taking of oysters from or in Western Port from midnight on every Friday until midnight on the following Sunday, and limiting the quantity of oysters to be taken by each person to seven bags, of three bushels capacity each, between midnight on any Sunday and midnight on the following Friday.

5. Prohibiting the removal of any boat having on board or attached or in tow, any trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, including any oyster dredge or oystering gear, from any wharf, pier, jetty, or anchorage within Western Port between noon on every Saturday and midnight on the following Sunday.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as \_\_\_\_\_, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of \_\_\_\_\_, viz., from \_\_\_\_\_ to \_\_\_\_\_, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of \_\_\_\_\_ years, of which have been in the field, and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature of an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

#### SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

##### Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

##### Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

##### Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, re-determination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

##### Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

##### Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments.—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

##### Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

##### Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

##### Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University

recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

#### CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

#### REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition or surveying by a qualified surveyor under which pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

(a) His articles of indenture or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or

(b) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or

(c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

#### LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor

under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

**RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES  
OF THE MELTON PUBLIC CEMETERY.**

**RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees for the Melton Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations:—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground is opened.

3. By the twenty-third section of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the Cemetery by and with the permission of the Trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges fixed by the Trustees, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone according to the tenure of such permission, to and for the sole use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives, for ever.

4. Application for such permission to be made to the resident Trustee in Melton, accompanied by a deposit of £1 sterling, as security for the due performance of any repairs rendered necessary or damage occasioned in the course of its erection, and for the removal of surplus earth, stone, or other rubbish and materials left unused, which sum of One pound will be returned when the aforesaid duties are carried out to the satisfaction of the Trustees or their Secretary.

5. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any poor person in such Cemetery on evidence showing, to the satisfaction of the Trustees, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the cost and charges.

6. Orders for interment to be given to the Sexton or other person appointed by the Trustees between the hours of Eight a.m. and Four p.m. the previous day; otherwise an extra charge will be made.

7. Parties wanting brick graves will be required to construct them under the direction of a competent person appointed by the Trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent, in writing, of the person entitled thereto must be left with the order.

8. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death must be stated at the time of giving the order.

9. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

10. Until otherwise ordered the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from 2 to 5 p.m. throughout the year.

11. All monuments, graves, and gravestones to be kept in proper repair at the expense of the respective owners.

12. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

13. A drawing of every stone, tomb, or pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the Trustees for approval, who are required by the twenty-second section of the *Cemeteries Act* to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof,

having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the position of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the scale of fees. Registers of all grants are kept by the Secretary.

15. The Secretary has orders to turn out or to take into custody (as the case may require), any person who shall behave indecorously or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the provisions of the *Cemeteries Act* or the regulations made for the protection of the cemetery, and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of sections 38, 39, 40, and 41 of the said Act.

16. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations.

17. No person shall be permitted to dig a grave in the cemetery unless he engages to sink it six feet deep. The Secretary's approval must be had before any interment takes place. Should any grave be required deeper an extra charge will be made.

18. No fence or railing around any grave in the cemetery shall be permitted to be erected except the consent, in writing, of the Trustees, or their Secretary, be first obtained. Any person who shall erect, or cause to be erected, any such railing around a grave or graves, whether public or private, without such consent shall be deemed a trespasser and punished as the law directs.

19. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Registrar of Deaths, Coroner, or Justice of the Peace has been delivered to the Secretary or to his deputy.

20. No coffin shall be buried within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than three feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

21. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

- (c) Not do or commit nor suffer to be done or committed any waste damage or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer or any firm or company of which he may be a member or lend them to any person without the consent in writing of the said employer.
- (d) Not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said employer during business hours.
- (e) Not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience.
- (f) Wherever practicable shall attend some technical school at least once a week;

and that the said \_\_\_\_\_ parent or guardian shall provide all necessary tools usually provided by the worker to enable the said apprentice during the term of this indenture to perform his work.

And it is hereby specially agreed by all the parties to this indenture that in case any of the covenants hereof are broken by any party hereto any Police Magistrate of Victoria shall have power to cancel and make an end of this indenture of apprenticeship if he is satisfied that any covenant or covenants have been broken and that it is desirable to do so.

It is hereby further agreed—

- (1) That the said apprentice shall be paid for all days named as public holidays in the Determination of the Furniture Board until he shall be in receipt of a wage in excess of 20s. a week.
- (2) That the said apprentice shall be paid for all working days the employer may close his factory or work-room or shop or place (excepting those working days between Christmas Eve and the third day of January following the factory or work-room or shop or place may be closed by mutual agreement between employer and employés) but should there be no work on which the apprentice could be employed in accordance with the terms of this indenture owing to breakdown of machinery or to any other cause over which the employer has no control the said apprentice shall be employed at any other reasonable occupation within such factory or work-room or shop or place during the time of cessation of work.
- (3) That the said apprentice shall not be paid for any time he shall be absent from his said duties through his own wilful default and neglect or through illness or through absenting himself from his said employer's service without leave or licence.
- (4) That the said apprentice shall not be entitled to a higher rate of pay until he has made up time lost through illness (in excess of six days) or through his own wilful default or neglect during the preceding six or twelve months as the case may be.

5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

**BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.**  
—RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1912.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905* :—

1. That the water rate for the year 1912 on all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District shall be One shilling and sixpence in the £1 on the municipal valuation of the Borough of Horsham for the year 1911-1912, with a minimum of One pound (£1) upon all lands and tenements valued at or under Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.), except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 259 of the above-mentioned Act.

All rates and charges shall be due and payable, in advance, on the first day of January, 1912, at the offices of the Trust, Wilson-street, Horsham, where payments will be received during office hours.

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty-six pounds, the sum of One shilling and fivepence in the pound sterling upon the amount of valuation.

On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District separately from any building, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound upon the amount of the valuation.

The rates, and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable, in advance, in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twelve.

In the construction of this By-law the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid. Also, that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter: water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per (1,000) thousand gallons.

6. The above rates shall be due and payable on the first day of February, 1912.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

**T**HE Wangaratta Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1905*, make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1912 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust:—

- (a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20 or under (except in the case of land on which there is no buildings), the sum of One pound sterling (£1).
- (b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of (£5) Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (d) The charges for the supply of water, otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Five shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.
- (f) Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of (1s.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate in respect of the premises so supplied, and (1s.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, subject to any special agreement for the supply of water that may be entered into by the Trust with any person. In cases where the supply of water is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge shall be for 10,000 gallons per annum.
- (g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (h) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1912, and the first day of July, 1912, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Acts*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

**BY-LAW NO. 4.**

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1912 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District.

1. For every house and tenement of £13 annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of £14 annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of £7 10s. per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the first day of January or the first day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.

4. For every unoccupied piece of land or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings sterling.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of £7 10s. per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

6. Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of 20s. per annum where the valuation the property on which such trough is situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate of valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20 the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

7. Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs, and to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement at 6d. (Sixpence) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 40,000 gallons per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under of the sum of Sixpence.

9. For a supply during the erection of new buildings, there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. Except as hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons: and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of Sixpence per one thousand gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

11. Water supplied to market gardens shall be charged for by measurement only.

12. For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens, the charge shall be Twopence per one thousand gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

13. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be £1, renewals 5s.

14. Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipe of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them, regarding the payment of water supplied, so as to cover their outlay.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, excepting the charge for water supplied by measurement, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Colac Waterworks Trust.

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1912 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust district, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety, and become due on the 1st day of January, 1912.

2nd. On every house and tenement of an annual municipal value of under Eight pounds sterling (£8), the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.)

3rd. On every house and tenement of an annual municipal value of Eight pounds sterling (£8) or upwards, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of the said valuation.

4th. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to a supply of domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8th. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric, and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent, on the amount of contract for stone, brick work, or plastering.

(a) For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement shall be paid, the minimum amount to be so paid to be Twenty shillings. In cases where water is supplied to land upon which there is no building, the rate shall be One shilling

and ninepence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation of such land, but in no case shall a rate of less than Ten shillings be paid.

(b) For land upon which there is no building, and to which water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein water pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof. In no case, however, shall a rate of less than Ten shillings be paid.

(c) For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the rate per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been so occupied, but in no case shall the rate be less than Ten shillings.

(d) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the 1st January, 1912, and one moiety on the 1st July, 1912.

(e) For water supplied for domestic or other than domestic purposes by the Trust by measure, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to such quantity as would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate payable in respect of the premises so supplied, and for all water consumed in excess of such quantity, a charge of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

(f) Such person as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

**HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
BY-LAW FOR 1912.**

**T**HE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1912 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of McIvor; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound.

2. A rate of Five shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. Tenements not fronting the street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter, but not exceeding half a mile distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for, in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first of January and first of July, 1912.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

**REGULATION.**

WILLIAM WESTFIELD GLEADELL,

in the room of Samuel James Willis, who has ceased to hold office as a Councillor of the said city of Richmond.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,  
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR  
RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF  
GIFFARD; KNOWN AS THE PROSPECT RE-  
CREATION RESERVE.**

**WE**, Richard James Cherry, Charles Brunell Trood, William Robert Coto, Joseph Thomas Pettit, Frank Smith, Ernest Bock, and William Arthur McLachlan, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 7th January, 1878, as a site for Recreation purposes in the Parish of Giffard, known as the Prospect Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

**REGULATIONS:**

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the fences, buildings, or other improvements in the reserve; or the trees, shrubs, or flowers therein, or leave in the reserve any cast-off clothing, rubbish, or litter of any kind.
4. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works. Provided, nevertheless, that no one person shall during the months of December, January, February, and March in each year put in the reserve more than three (3) horses.
5. No person shall put in the enclosures around the buildings on the reserve any cattle, goats, or other animals.
6. No person shall camp in the reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, or any booth or other structure for any purpose whatsoever, or offer for sale any article in the reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the



Committee of Management first obtained; and such written permission shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to demand production of such permission.

7. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

8. No person shall discharge any firearm or gun in the reserve on the south side of the causeway and the line running east therefrom to the fence on the sand hummocks, and no person shall discharge any firearm or gun in the reserve north of the causeway and line aforesaid without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall use the hall in the reserve for camping purposes.

10. No person shall use the water from the tanks at the hall in the reserve except for domestic purposes.

11. Every person camping in the reserve shall, before leaving, clean up and burn all rubbish and breakwinds.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations; and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist

from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10:

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act* 1890 in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

16. The licensee shall keep the land free from vermin, and, should he fail to do so, the licence shall be liable to forfeiture.

17. This licence is issued subject to the right of saw-millers to graze on this area such horses and bullocks as are actually used in connexion with their licensed operations on this land.

18. In the event of the area being damaged by fire, the licence may be forfeited unless the licensee satisfy the Minister that neither he, directly or indirectly, nor his workmen or servants were in any way responsible therefor.

#### Special Conditions.

1. The period of occupation will, except where otherwise specified, be for nineteen months from 1st March, 1912, to 30th September, 1913.

2. The fee for the period as shown in the head-lines— for which the licence will be issued, and fee for licence— must accompany the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who complies with this condition may be accepted.

3. Separate tenders must be lodged for each block.
  4. *Tenders to be addressed to the Secretary for Lands (Tender Box), Melbourne.*
  5. The highest or any tender not necessarily accepted.
  6. Tenderers must give their full name and ordinary postal address.
  7. The areas are given as more or less, and all appropriated, alienated, or licensed lands (if any) within the boundaries is excluded.
  8. The outgoing tenant has the option to remove any existing fencing within one month, or to require the incoming tenant to pay for it in accordance with the provisions of section 190, *Land Act 1901.*

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station over and above five, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for, and for the State Plantation at Wail, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £10, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates. The contract for the supply of forage to the Military Barracks may be terminated by three months' notice being given by the Secretary to the Tender Board to the contractor of such determination.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

## TOWN OF PORT MELBOURNE.

## REGULATION No. 21.

A Regulation of the Town of Port Melbourne, numbered 21, made under section 1 of Part IX of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1903*, in force by virtue of a By-law of the above-named town, numbered 85, and of section 228 of the said Act, for the purpose of altering part of Regulation No. 20.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Port Melbourne, order as follows:—

1. That clause 2 be made sub-clause (a) of clause 2, and that the following additional sub-clauses to clause 2 be inserted:—

(b) Every person about to bathe, shall proceed from the dressing place direct to the sea by the nearest practicable line, and on leaving the sea shall return thereto in the same manner.

(c) Except as aforesaid, or when rendering aid in case of accident, no person in bathing costume shall walk, run, exercise, stand, loiter, lie down or sit down upon any part of the beach, or in any place whatever which is exposed to the public view.

(d) No person shall dress or undress for bathing or bathe within the following areas:—

(1) The area between the Town Pier and a line parallel thereto, and distant one hundred (100) yards westerly therefrom.

(2) The area between lines parallel to the Railway Pier, distant one hundred (100) yards easterly and westerly therefrom.

(3) The area between lines parallel to the New Pier and distant one hundred (100) yards easterly and westerly therefrom.

2. That clause 4, sub-clause (b) be altered by the insertion of the words "papers, rags, glass, debris of any sort or," immediately following the word "filth."

3. That clause 11, sub-clause (a) be altered by striking out the word "or" in the first line, and by inserting the words "glass or debris of any sort," immediately after the word "refuse." And that the following sub-clauses be added to clause 11:—

(d) Subject to the provisions of sub-clauses (b) and (c) of this section, horses may be exercised on the foreshore and bathed in the sea at Port Melbourne, but only before the hour of 9 a.m. and within the following limits, that is to say:—

(1) Between the drainage jetty at Pickles-street and a line parallel thereto and distant 75 yards westerly therefrom.

(2) Between the mouth of the River Yarra and a line bearing south, distant three-quarters of a mile from the Railway Pier.

(e) Every person riding, leading, or swimming any horses shall be clothed from neck to knee.

4. That clause 12 be made sub-clause (a) of clause 12, and that the following additional sub-clause to clause 12 be inserted:—

(b) Any person committing any breach of this Regulation, who refuses to state his name and place of abode to any officer or employé of the Council, or any person authorized by the Council, in writing, under seal of the Council, or who in the opinion of such employé, or any person authorized by the Council, in writing, under seal of the Council, states a false name or place of abode, shall be guilty of an offence under this Regulation.

## BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.—REGULATION No. 30.

A Regulation of the Borough of Eaglehawk numbered 24, made under section 4 of Part VI. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1903*, in force in the borough by virtue of a By-law of the above-named borough numbered 24, for appointing the times and hours during or at which respectively any registered building or ground shall be used for the purpose for which it is registered or shall be closed; for appointing the day on which the registration of any such building or ground shall expire, as well as the sum which shall be paid for such registration, and for every renewal thereof. Regulation number 27 is hereby repealed.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

## REGULATION No. 30.

1. The hour for closing any hall or other building used for public meetings, or of any building or any ground in which public amusements are conducted or held within the Borough of Eaglehawk, shall be not later than Twelve o'clock midnight on each week night, save Saturday, when it shall be closed as hereinafter provided; and no such place shall be re-opened before the hour of Eight o'clock in the morning of the next succeeding week day.

2. The hour for closing any hall or other building used for public meetings, or of any building or any ground in which public amusements are conducted or held within the Borough of Eaglehawk, shall be not later than half-past Eleven o'clock p.m. on each Saturday night; and no such place shall be re-opened before the hour of Eight o'clock on the next succeeding Monday morning.

3. The registration of any hall or other building used for public meetings, or of any building or any ground in which public amusements are conducted or held within the Borough of Eaglehawk, shall, unless sooner suspended or cancelled by the Council of the Borough of Eaglehawk, expire on the thirty-first day of December in each and every year.

4. For every such registration, and for every renewal thereof, there shall be paid to the treasurer of the Borough of Eaglehawk, in aid of the funds of the said borough by the person for whom such registration shall be made, the sum of One pound sterling.

Provided always that nothing in this Regulation contained shall extend or be applied to any hall or other building or any ground registered hereunder to prevent the holding of Divine service therein, or to prevent its use for any purpose of a religious nature on Sundays.

Provided always that when any hall or other building used for public meetings, or any building or any ground in which public amusements are conducted or held, is used for the purpose of balls or any amusement ending in dancing, the provision of this Regulation in respect to the hour for closing on week-day nights shall not be deemed to apply, save and except on Saturday nights, when it shall be closed at the hour hereinbefore provided.
