2. A candidate must produce a certificate of competency, issued by the Board of Examiners for the Survey Branch of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey of Victoria, or a certificate of competency or diploma issued by one of the Federated Surveyors Board of Australia and New Zealand.

3. He must also show to the satisfaction of the Board—

(a) That he has served during not less than four months under some authorized mining surveyor, in obtaining practical experience in the conduct of underground surveys; or, that he has been engaged for not less than twelve months in the conduct of such surveys.

(b) That he has acquired a knowledge of the methods and appliances used in mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) *Mining Surveying*.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) *Practical Mining*.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.

(c) *Hydraulic Engineering*.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels; estimation of sources of water supply; dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) *Geology*.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. Candidates who have obtained the certificate of the Board of Examiners for Engineers of Water Supply in Victoria will be exempt from the examination required by sub-clause (c) of Regulation 4. Candidates who have taken a degree in Mining Engineering in the University of Melbourne, or in some University whose degrees in Engineering are recognised by that University, and whose Engineering graduates are admitted by it *ad eundem gradum*, or who have taken a like degree in Civil Engineering and have passed the University examination in Mining Surveying and Practical Mining, will be exempt from the whole of the examinations prescribed by Regulation 4.

6. Examinations are held half-yearly in April and October.

THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

BY-LAW NO. 13.—WATER SUPPLY.

Preamble.—The Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, and by so much of the Water Acts as are incorporated therewith, and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any-wise enabling the said Board in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. *Repeal of By-laws.*—By-laws No. 4, No. 6, No. 8, and No. 10 are hereby revoked as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law, but nothing herein contained shall affect the validity or enforcement of any rate made before the coming into operation of this By-law, and every such rate shall be levied and the payment thereof enforced as if this By-law had not been made; and nothing herein contained shall relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the said By-laws; nor abrogate or alter the power of the Board to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; nor withdraw any permission given, nor cancel any licence granted, by or on behalf of the Board; nor annul or stay any proceedings taken, prosecution commenced, or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the said By-laws prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation; but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion, and all offences against any provision of the said By-laws committed before the date of this By-law coming into operation may be prosecuted for and punished as if this By-law had not been made and passed.

WATER RATE.

2. *Rate.*—The rate to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes on and after the 1st day of July, 1912, is hereby determined as follows, that is to say:—

For all such lands and tenements a rate of Sevenpence in the pound of the valuation of such lands and tenements.

Provided that where a rate of Sevenpence in the pound of such valuation would amount to less than 10s., the sum of 10s. is fixed as the amount of the rate to be paid in respect of any such lands and tenements.

Valuation.—The valuation of the said lands and tenements for the purpose of such water supply shall for every year be the valuation of such lands and tenements as on the first day of July of such year by the Corporation of the City of Melbourne or the Council of the municipality in which such lands and tenements are situated; or if there be no such valuation, the valuation of such lands and tenements by some police magistrate.

3. *The Water Rate.*—The said rate shall be and remain in force for the year commencing on the first day of July, 1912, and each and every year thereafter until revoked or altered.

SUPPLY BY MEASURE.

4. Every owner or occupier of lands and tenements, or other persons supplied with or using water for private water troughs, steam boilers, engines, building purposes, brickwork, concrete, masonry, syphons, hydraulic power blasts, watering of horses, cattle, or other stock, glass-washing machines, cooling windows, washing or cleaning vehicles, watering gardens, yards, pathways, or drives, or for use in any trade, industry, or business, shall be supplied by measure.

The amounts to be charged for the supply of water by measure shall be as follow:—

- (a) *Shipping.*—To shipping at wharfs and piers through fixed meters, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; but wherever it is necessary for the Board to provide hose or labour for the supply of water the charge shall be at the rate of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, subject in all cases to control of the Board as to quantity and time of supply.
- (b) *Municipal Parks and Gardens.*—For parks and gardens under municipal control, Ninepence per 1,000 gallons.

(c) *Meter Charge.*—In all cases other than the foregoing, water supplied by the Board by measurement in the metropolis will be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

5. *Compulsory fixing of Meters.*—The Board may, by notice in writing, require any person—

- (a) being a consumer supplied with water whether for domestic purposes solely or not;
- (b) supplied with or desiring to be supplied with water;
- (c) whose premises are directly or indirectly connected with the mains or pipes of the Board, or are about to be so connected—

to be supplied by measure, and to fix a meter in a position or place, to be approved of by the proper officer of the Board, to register the quantity of water so supplied.

Any person so required who shall not within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice duly and properly fix a meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and to a further penalty of Twenty shillings for every day after the first day during which he shall fail or neglect to fix such meter.

MINIMUM METER CHARGE.

6. (a) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement where water is supplied to any lands and tenements by measure shall be the quantity which at One shilling per thousand gallons would produce an amount equal to the amount of the water rate which under the Board's Acts and By-laws would be payable for the said lands and tenements if so supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) Save as aforesaid, in every case where the supply is by measure the minimum charge per annum will be the equivalent of 20,000 gallons.

SPECIAL RATES AND CHARGES.

7. *Charges for Special Supplies.*—Notwithstanding anything contained in section 4 hereof, the Board may grant special supplies of water according to the following terms and charges, which shall be payable in advance, viz:—

I. *Water Troughs.*—To private water troughs at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each. Troughs of such materials, form, and construction as shall be approved by the Board, and erected in any public highway with the consent of the Council of the municipal district, shall not be deemed to be private troughs.

II. *Mixing Concrete.*—For the making and mixing of concrete, and for masonry and brickwork, at the rate of One penny per cubic yard of such materials as measured in the work.

III. *Building Rates.*—For general building purposes at the following charges, viz., on the scale of Ninepence in the pound upon the estimated assessable value of the completed building, during (from date of commencement) three months in cases where such value does not exceed Fifty pounds; four months where such value exceeds Fifty pounds and does not exceed One hundred pounds; and six months where such value exceeds One hundred pounds. But for wooden buildings the charge shall be one-half of the foregoing rate. After the termination of each such period to date of completion in each case the charge will be at the scale of Sevenpence in the pound upon such value.

IV. *Steam Boilers.*—For steam boilers, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each such boiler.

V. *Gas Engines.*—For gas engines, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each such engine; or, if the supply be from an approved cistern, Five shillings per annum per horse-power.

VI. *Plumbers' Blasts.*—For plumbers' blasts, Twenty shillings each per annum.

VII. *Horses and Cattle.*—For horses, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse, and for cows wholly or partially kept upon the premises, at the rate of Five shillings for each cow.

VIII. *Gardens.*—Taps will be allowed to be fixed in gardens not exceeding 100 square yards in area, and hoses allowed to be used therein, on payment of a special rate (in addition to the assessment rate) of Ten shillings per annum; all gardens above 100 square yards in area will be supplied only through meter. The measurement of such area shall include all paths and portions of paved areas within 3 feet of any cultivated area, and shall include all areas which, in the opinion of the Board, are capable of cultivation.

IX. *Glass-washing Machines.*—For glass-washing machines, the waste discharge from which is into a portable receptacle, and not connected with the sewers, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each machine. Where the machine is connected with the sewers, the supply must be through meter.

Special Rate may be fixed in cases not provided for.—Supplies of water for purposes not otherwise specified in this By-law must be paid for at such rate as the Board shall in each case determine, and a preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Board before a supply can be taken or used.

GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS AND CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS.

8. In all the pipes to which any fire plug is fixed, the Board will provide and keep constantly laid on, unless prevented by unusual drought or other unavoidable accident or during necessary repairs, a sufficient supply of water without charge for use in houses, lands, or premises, the property of His Majesty, whether unoccupied or used for public purposes, and houses, lands, or premises in the occupation of the Crown, or of the Government of Victoria, or of the Board of Land and Works, or the Victorian Railways Commissioners, or the Minister of Public Instruction, and also for supplying any public hospitals or charitable institutions and such public baths and wash-houses as are mentioned in sub-section 2 of the Seventeenth Schedule to the *Water Act 1905*, and subject to the terms, conditions, and provisos mentioned in the said sub-section, provided that such houses, lands, or premises, public hospitals, or charitable institutions, or baths or wash-houses be situated within the limits of the metropolis. But as by the provisions of section 183 of the *Water Act 1905*, it is not compulsory upon the Board to supply any water to any person whomsoever, and as the Board is, by sub-section 3 of the Seventeenth Schedule to the said Act, authorized and empowered to make By-laws for, *inter alia*, preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the Board, and it is necessary to guard against and prevent such waste or misuse, and for that purpose to provide that the quantity of water used should in each case be known and recorded, the Board will require in every case that a meter or meters of capacity sufficient to record the quantity of water used be provided and maintained by and at the expense of the owner or managing body of every such house, land, or premises, hospital or charitable institution, or the municipal council which shall have established such bath or wash-house; otherwise the Board will decline to supply any water thereto.

METERS.

9. *Meters to be tested and approved.*—No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each $\frac{1}{2}$ -in., $\frac{3}{4}$ -in., and 1-in. meter must be capable of registering any flow not less than 10, 15, and 30 gallons per hour respectively.

Meters—how to be fixed.—Every meter must be fixed truly level, with connexions above ground, approved by the Board's supervising officer, in an easily accessible position, and properly protected, on a proper foundation of timber, stone, brick, or concrete, approved by the Board's supervising officer, which must wherever practicable be level with the surface of the ground, and within 3 feet of the building line of the property. If it be impracticable to place the meter above the surface of the ground, it may be fixed in a pit approved by the Board's supervising officer, which must be properly constructed and drained. Lead connexions, approved by the Board's supervising officer, must be fixed on each side of the meter, except where the use of two wrought-iron quarter bends shall have been allowed by such officer. The use of elbows will not be permitted.

Leather washers to be used.—Wherever washers are necessary for meter connexion couplings, leather washers must in all cases be used.

Whole supply to property to be registered.—Every meter must be fixed to register the whole of the water supplied to any tenement or premises, except where otherwise allowed by the Board.

Removal of Meters.—Every person desiring to remove or alter the position of a meter must make written application for consent of the Board to such removal or alteration, and no such removal or alteration may be effected until the Board's permission in writing shall have been given.

Meters to be available for inspection.—No person shall construct, place, stack, store, or permit to be constructed, placed, stacked, or stored, any building, erection, materials, or goods over or upon any meter through which

water is supplied by the Board, or do or permit anything which shall prevent or interfere with the inspection at any time by any officer of the Board of any such meter.

10. *Where Meter ceases registering, &c., average may be charged.*—If any meter in use cease registering, or be reported as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Board will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, (1) by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year; (2) on the basis of subsequent consumption after repairing; or (3) the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

Testing large Meters in position.—In all cases of fixing and refixing 2-in. meters, and meters of larger sizes, provision must be made for testing the working of the meters in position by the affixing of a stop-tap or valve on the outlet side of the meter, with a stop-cock ferrule between the stop-tap and the meter. No branches are to be taken off between the stop-tap or valve and the meter. The sizes of the stop-cock ferrules must be as follows:—

For 2-in. and 3-in. meters	$\frac{3}{4}$ inch.
For 4-in. meters	1 inch.
For meters larger than 4 inch	...	$1\frac{1}{2}$ inch.

Delay in refixing Meters.—Meters removed owing to being out of order must be repaired, adjusted, and submitted for test by a licensed plumber employed for the purpose with the least possible delay. For any unnecessary delay in refixing meter, such licensed plumber shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 or suspension of his licence.

Refixing of Meters.—Any meter fixed prior to this By-law coming into operation shall, if removed for any purpose whatever, be refixed in manner and position in strict accordance with the provisions of this By-law.

HIRE OF METERS.

11. *Hire of Meter and rate of rent thereof.*—The Board may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which, if inferential meters, shall be at the rate per annum of—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. meter, Five shillings.
For $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. meter, Six shillings.
For 1-in. meter, Eight shillings.
For $1\frac{1}{4}$ -in. meter, Ten shillings and sixpence.
For $1\frac{1}{2}$ -in. meter, Fourteen shillings.

Meter rent to be exclusive of rate.—Such rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to, the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid quarterly in advance, on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current quarter.

Hired Meter to be fixed at cost of hirer and maintained at cost of Board.—Meters shall be fixed by a licensed plumber at cost of the hirer on his premises in the position directed by an officer of the Board, but shall be kept in repair at cost of the Board, except in case of receiving external injury, in which case the hirer must bear the cost of repair.

Testing Meters.—In event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a hired meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Board to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of One pound, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it at cost of the Board, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him.

Hirer to give notice of removal.—Any person hiring a meter from the Board who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Board of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

ALLOWANCE FOR SANITARY FLUSHING.

12. *Water supply to closets.*—Every consumer of water who shall receive his supply of water through a meter, and shall pay for such supply by measure an amount exceeding the sum which he would be required to pay upon the rating of his premises, shall, out of such excess, be allowed, so far as such excess will admit thereof, a deduction equal to Ten shillings per annum on account of each water closet on his premises the supply of water for the flushing thereof shall pass through, and be recorded by, such meter, save and except in the case of factories or premises having a range of privy closets receiving their water flush from one flushing cistern, in each of which cases the allowance or deduction shall be Seven shillings per annum for each privy seat in such range.

TAPPINGS AND SERVICES.

13. *Application of provisions regarding connexions, &c.*—All work, connexions, fittings, apparatus, and material in connexion with the supply of water from the pipes of the Board shall be in strict accordance with the provisions of this By-law, and where any service existing at the time of the coming into operation of this By-law, and supplying water from the pipes of the Board, or any fitting or apparatus connected therewith, is not in accordance with the provisions of this By-law, all renewals, alterations, or replacements thereof or thereto must be effected in strict accordance with the provisions of this By-law.

14. *Ordinary connexions.—Special size services.*—Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which for iron services a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted. For tenements rated at Twenty pounds per annum or under the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ inch; and for tenements rated at over Twenty pounds per annum the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ inch, unless permission for a larger service shall have been received in writing from the Board, and the supply be taken through a meter; and no such larger service shall exceed 1 inch in diameter unless the average number of persons residing in the tenement be more than twenty-five, or the tenement be rated at not less than One hundred and fifty pounds per annum, nor shall it exceed $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch in diameter unless the average number of persons residing in the tenement be more than one hundred, or the tenement be rated at not less than Two hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

15. *Maximum tappings without clip.*—The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clip for each size of cast-iron main is as follows:—

For 3-in. and 4-in. pipes, $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. tapping.

For 5-in., 6-in., and 7-in. pipes, 1-in. tapping.

For 8-in. pipes, $1\frac{1}{4}$ -in. tapping.

For 9-in. pipes, $1\frac{1}{2}$ -in. tapping.

Over 9-in. pipes, 2-in. tapping.

A clip shall be used for tappings to all pipes other than cast iron except where otherwise permitted by the Board.

Branches for large tappings.—A branch must be inserted for all connexions of 2 inch diameter or over to mains of 5 inch diameter or less, and for all connexions of 3 inch diameter or over to mains of 6 inch diameter or over. All such branches must be of pattern and material approved by and be fixed only in accordance with the directions of the Board's supervising officer.

16. *Tappings under pressure by an officer of the Board, at cost of consumer.*—Upon any person giving notice of his desire to lay a pipe to connect with and tap the pipes of the Board, he shall be informed on behalf of the Board whether it is or is not required that such tapping should be made under pressure by an officer of the Board; and if it be so required, such person shall not tap any such pipe, but shall provide for and be at the cost of all labour and material necessary for such connexion, and for the restoration of the ground to the satisfaction of the local authority, and be liable for the consequences of failure in so doing, and shall pay in advance to the Board the expense of such tapping, including the stop-cock and ferrule, as follows, viz., for $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch pipe, Seven shillings and sixpence; for $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch pipe, Ten shillings; for 1-inch pipe, Fifteen shillings; for $1\frac{1}{4}$ -inch pipe, Twenty five shillings; for $1\frac{1}{2}$ -inch pipe, Forty shillings;

for 2-inch pipe, Sixty shillings; and where the place at which such tapping is to be made shall be distant more than five miles from the General Post Office, in the city of Melbourne, there shall be paid by the person for whom the same is to be made a further sum sufficient to defray the cost of conveying the officer of the Board who shall make such tapping to and from the work, and also the value of the time occupied by such officer in going to and returning from the work, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per hour. If it become necessary to effect repairs, removals, or replacements to any such tappings as aforesaid, the fee of Ten shillings must be paid on each occasion where the main is 24 inches in diameter or less. In all cases where larger mains than 24 inches are shut off, special charges will be fixed by the Board for each individual case.

17. *Connexions: Brass couplings.*—All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings.

18. *Stop-cock and cover box.*—A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron box must be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line.

19. *Mains under wood blocks, &c.*—Where mains are under wood blocks, concrete or other special pavements, an approved iron box must be fixed over the stop-cock ferrule in the main.

Position of stop-cocks.—Except where otherwise permitted by the Board, stop-cocks and stop-cock ferrules must be opposite the tenement supplied, and in one line at right angles to the main on which such stop-cock ferrule is fixed. Every service which does not enter the building line of the tenement supplied at a point opposite to the main to which such service is connected shall be provided with two high-pressure screw-down stop-cocks and approved cast-iron covers, one of which shall be fixed opposite the main, and the other in a position approved by the Board's supervising officer, immediately outside the building line where the service enters the tenement.

20. *All lead joints to be "wiped."*—All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber who by himself or his workmen shall break these Regulations.

21. *Services to be separate except by permission.*—Excepting with the permission of the Board, not more than one tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Board may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each tenement shall be independent of the supply to the remaining tenements, and be controlled by a stop-cock fixed in a public thoroughfare on such sub-service.

Renewal of services.—Whenever any service existing at the time of the coming into operation of this By-law supplies more than one tenement, and such service is not laid in accordance with the provisions of this section, repair of such service will not be permitted should the repair involve the replacement of more than one pipe length of the service, but the service must be renewed strictly in accordance with the before mentioned provisions.

Any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

22. *Extensions subject to consent of Board.*—No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

Plans.—In connexion with every application to lay a water service of 2 inches and upwards in diameter, or to alter the position of any such water service, the plumber's notice must be accompanied by a properly dimensioned plan, showing the locality of the premises at which the work is to be effected, and the position in which it is intended to lay the pipes and fix meters, plugs, stop-taps, &c., thereto.

Block tracings.—In such cases the Board will, if desired, supply block tracings (as far as same may be available) on payment of a fee of One shilling for each tenement shown on the tracing.

23. *Service-pipes to be repaired by owner or occupier.—Penalty for refusal or neglect to repair service.*—The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenement supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier (if any), or (if none) the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same; and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default of so repairing he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice; and the Board may stop the water from flowing into such tenement either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

WASTE OF WATER.

24. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

TAKING OR SUPPLYING WATER WITHOUT AUTHORITY.

25. *Water not to be used or supplied without written authority.*—Any person receiving water from the Board who, without the written permission of the Board, shall take or carry away such water from his tenement, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

26. *Unlawful taking of water.*—Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board, who shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

LICENSED PLUMBERS.

27. *Unlicensed persons not to interfere with pipes or services.*—Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with, any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

28. *Licences to Plumbers to be during pleasure of the Board.*—Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Board, and be subject to review from time to time, and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being adjudged by the Board to be incompetent, or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Acts or of this By-law.

Special licences to pipe-fitters.—The Board may, if it see fit, grant special licences to pipe-fitters in continuous employment of large firms who require their services on the premises or in the business. Where the supply is through meter the licensed fitter shall only be permitted to work upon water supply pipes and fittings within the premises, and on the outlet side of the meter; and he shall not be permitted to execute any lead work. The special licence as aforesaid shall be subject to review from time to time and also to cancellation, as provided in the first paragraph of this section.

Licence to Plumbers under Water Act and By-law not to apply to sewerage.—A licence issued in conformity with the provisions of the Water Act 1905, or any Act repeated thereby, or any By-law or regulation thereunder, shall not authorize the holder thereof to do any kind of work connected with the sanitary fittings of houses or the sewerage system.

29. *Proof of fitness to be given by the applicant before granting of licence.*—Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Board relating to Water Supply,

with Part II. of the Board's Act, and with the sections of the Water Acts 1905 and 1909, incorporated in the Board's Act; but the Board may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

NOTICES.

30. *Notice of work proposed to be given.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board of his intention so to do; or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Board, without the permission, in writing, of the Board being first obtained; or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work; or engine the property of the Board, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Notices to be signed by licensed plumber.—Notices must be signed by the licensed plumber actually engaged in carrying out the works referred to on the notice, or by a licensed plumber employing another plumber to carry out the work under his supervision.

Any licensed plumber signing a notice for work which is not actually done either by himself or by a plumber employed under his supervision, or carrying out work under a notice not signed by himself, shall be liable to suspension of his licence.

31. *Notice to lay service, &c., to be given.—Material to be approved and work inspected.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall alter, repair, or replace pipes or fittings in communication with the pipes of the Board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such work is to be carried out, or who shall make such communication, alteration, repair, or replacement, except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipe of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. In the case of service communication with the pipes of the Board being made through the intervening medium of storage tanks, the provisions of this clause shall have as full application as if the communication were by direct service.

Urgent repairs.—The giving of two days' notice as aforesaid will only be dispensed with in the event of urgent repairs being required to stop the waste or escape of water, in which case notice must be sent to the Board by the licensed plumber concurrently with, or immediately after, the execution of such urgent repairs. The penalty for not giving notice, as herein required, will be as mentioned in the first part of this section.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

32. *Fittings to be of the best quality and subject to approval.*—No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, bib-cock, ball-cock, valve, closet-cistern, service-box, bath-tap or valve, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Board which is not of the best quality, tested, stamped, and approved by the Board.

33. No person shall use any stop or bib cocks which are not screw-down, high-pressure cocks, made of hard brass or gun-metal, and in every respect of best quality and workmanship, tested, stamped, and approved by the Board.

34. *Lead piping.—Specification of material to be used.*—Lead piping shall be of the following weights:—

Galvanized-iron piping.—Except with the written consent of the Board, only galvanized-iron piping of approved quality, tested and stamped by the Board, will be allowed for external and internal services. The fixing of lead pipes on water supply to filters will not be permitted. Tin-lined lead pipes or galvanized wrought-iron pipes of approved quality must be used.

CISTERNS AND TANKS.

35. No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball-valve, and with the overflow-pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner, open to inspection, and in a position approved by the Board. Every such cistern or tank must be constructed, protected, made accessible, and provided with inlet and outlet pipes, as required by the Board, so as to reduce the risk of pollution and waste of water to a minimum.

URINALS.

36. Private urinals will receive water without meter and public urinals will receive water without charge and without meter, provided they be constructed to the satisfaction of the Board.

BATHS.

37. No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons except with the special permission of the Board.

FIRE SERVICES.

38. *Private fire services.*—Subject to previous written consent of the Board, private fire services will be allowed, but every such service must be sealed, except in cases where the Board's officer shall have certified, in writing, that sealing is unnecessary. For each such private fire service there shall be paid a sum of Ten shillings upon the fixing thereof, and a sum of Ten shillings per annum thereafter. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of such service except for extinction of fire. Except in case of fire, no person shall, without authority of the Board, wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service, and in the event of any such seal having been broken, accidentally or otherwise, the occupier of the tenement shall, within twenty-four hours thereafter, give notice, in writing, of the fact at the office of the Board, and failing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and to a further penalty of Ten shillings for every day during which he shall neglect to give such notice.

GENERAL.

39. *Reflux valve to be fixed in steam services.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

40. *Street watering to be by permission.*—No person, other than an employé of a municipality, shall, without the written permission of the Board, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrant and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

41. *Supply to public parks and gardens.*—The water supply of all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Board; and any person not duly authorized who shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

42. *Hose not to be affixed without meter.*—No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe for any purpose whatsoever, except where authorized by this By-law, unless a meter be fixed and the water be supplied by measure; and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

43. *Consent of Board.*—Notices to be addressed to Secretary.—Conditions as to notice.—In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Board before doing any act or commencing any work such consent must be asked for by notice in writing, addressed to the Secretary of the Board, and delivered at his office, of such length as is required by the *Water Act 1905* or by this By-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work; and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be com-

menced save upon the Board's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified.

Consent may be given by Chairman, Secretary, Engineer-in-Chief, or Engineer of Water Supply.—Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the Chairman of the Board, the Secretary, the Engineer-in-Chief, or the Engineer of Water Supply, who, severally, shall be competent to give the Board's consent, and on behalf of the Board to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given.

PENALTY.

44. *Penalty.*—Any person who is guilty by act or omission of any contravention or evasion of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and where no other penalty is provided shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

INTERPRETATION.

45. *Interpretation Clause.*—In the construction of this By-law, the meaning which in the Water Acts is assigned to any word shall be the meaning of the same word where occurring in this By-law, unless inconsistent with the subject-matter or context.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by The Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed the twentieth day of February, 1912, in the presence of—

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature of an irregular road.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, re-determination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.)

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading, setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, the micrometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these Regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor under which pupils are serving at the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within six months of such date. And all such articles or agreements made thereafter shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) His articles of indenture or other similar agreement were executed prior to the date upon which these Regulations shall commence and take effect; or
- (b) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (c) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 is.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

3.
