THE Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in accordance with the terms of clause 32 of the Regulations for Securing the Safety of the Public, made under clause 14 of the Electric Light and Power Act 1896, has, by an Order made on the 27th day of February, 1912, given permission to The Melbourne Electric Supply Company Limited to construct a bare overhead electric line from a point near the intersection of South-road and Beach-road, Brighton, vid Beach-road, to a point near the intersection of that thoroughfare with Bay-road, Sandringham, subject to the following special conditions, viz.:—

The electric line shall be supported on poles projecting.

to the following special conditions, viz.:—

The electric line shall be supported on poles projecting at least thirty feet above the ground level, and shall be arranged in such manner that one conductor, consisting of bare hard-drawn copper cable, shall be securely fixed upon high-tension insulators placed on the top of the poles. The lower conductor, consisting of two hard-drawn copper cables in parallel, shall be fixed on insulators placed respectively at each end of a horizontal wooden arm, so as to give a distance of two feet six inches between them, the arms being placed at such a vertical distance below the

upper conductor as to make the horizontal plane joining the two lower conductors twelve inches below that of the upper conductor. The two cables forming the lower conductor shall be connected together with copper standard cables of at least 7-16 Imperial standard wire gauge sectional area at not less than three points per span, so as to make an efficient cradle construction.

The lower conductors shall be permanently connected to earth at the power house bus bars, and the maximum difference of potential between the upper and lower conductors shall not exceed 4,500 volts. Suitable lightning arresters shall be installed at the point of origin of the line and at such other points as may from time to time be found necessary.

No. 1432), the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, may, either absolutely or subject to any regulations, prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such Proclamation of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in Council likely to spread any disease or insect in Victoria, and may at any time alter or revoke any such Pröclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation of 28th July, 1911, and do order that on and after the date of this Proclamation no potatoes shall, except subject to Regulations; be taken or conveyed into any other portion of Victoria from those portions of Victoria

contained within the boundaries of the hereinafter specified municipalities or groups of municipalities which shall constitute and be known as "Potato Inspection Districts," that is to say:—

Every person who rides, drives, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle or machine, or any horse or beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, he shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, horse, or beast of burden, or other machine or foot passenger, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.

4. Every person who rides, drives, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to his machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

5. Every person riding, driving, or propelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle or machine, or any horse or other beast of burden, shall keep his machine to the right or off-side of such animal or vehicle or other machine. sengers.

6. In every case where a person riding, driving, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, or carriage, or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing or attached to such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, may on such meeting or overtaking become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of the said waggon, cart, or carriage, or of such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding, driving, or impelling such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person shall whilst riding, driving, or impelling any machine proceed across any of the street crossings within any township in the shire at a greater speed than four miles an hour.
