SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

BY-LAW NO. 7.

A By-law of the Shire of Dundas, made under the Health Acts, and numbered 7, for the regulation of and prevention of nuisances in or about slaughter-yards.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the Council of the Shire of Dundas, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, hereby orders as follows, that is to say:—

(1) All buildings or yards in which cattle or other stock for slaughtering are kept, and also all pig-styes and pig-yards, shall be cleansed daily, and all manure and other fifth-removed therefrom and placed in such receptacles as the Council shall by order from time to time direct, and all such receptacles shall be emptied at least once a week.

(2) In every slaughter-yard the slaughter-pen and the hanging and dressing shed shall be used exclusively for the purpose proper to each and all; offal, blood, and other refuse shall, as soon as may be after slaughtering, be removed from them and disposed of as hereafter provided.

- (3) At the end of each slaughtering day, after the car-casses are hung, and before refuse begins to decay, the slaughter-pen and hanging and dressing shed, together with all drains and blood receptacles connected therewith, shall be, where necessary, thoroughly washed down with clean water and left in a sweet and wholesome condi-
- (4) All the water used in cleansing carcasses shall be either clean roof water or other water properly cleared and well boiled.
- (5) The bone store or yard shall be emptied at such regular and frequent intervals as the Council may from time to time direct.
- (6) The boiling-down apparatus and brickwork shall be thoroughly cleansed and emptied and scrubbed at such regular and convenient intervals as the Council may pre-
- (7) No blood or uncooked offal shall under any circumstances be fed to the pigs. All blood shall, as soon as practicable after slaughtering, and at least once daily, be collected and buried.
- (8) Al! materials intended to be passed through digestors shall be kept in a sweet and wholesome condition until so treated.

(9) All stock intended for slaughtering, and all pigs kept on slaughtering premises, shall be provided with a sufficient supply of good water, free from contamination by drainage of slaughter-yards, piggeries, and residences into the catchment area of such supply.

(10) All yards and buildings on slaughtering premises shall be kept clean, and shall be whitewashed with lime regularly, and at least as frequently as may be prescribed from time to time by the Council.

(11) Any person found guilty of infringing any of the provisions of this By-law shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every breach of such By-law, or a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. continued.

(12) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district. Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the fourth day of January, 1912, and confirmed the first day of February, 1912.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE VEGETATION DISEASES ACTS REGARDING THE TRANSFER OR REMOVAL WITHIN VICTORIA OF ONIONS.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council is empowered by the Vegetation Diseases Acts to make Regulations regarding the transfer or removal within Vetoria of any particular kind of tree, plant, or vegetable likely, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, to spread any disease or insect: And whereas the Governor in Council is of opinion that the onion is a vegetable likely to spread disease: And whereas the Governor in Council has, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, prohibited, subject to Regulations, the bringing of onions into any portion of Victoria from certain other parts of Victoria specified in such Proclamation, and hereinafter (together with any further parts of Victoria which may hereafter be likewise proclaimed) referred to as "Onion Inspection Districts": Now the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following Regulations:—

INTERPRETATION.

- 1. For the purposes of these Regulations-
 - "Inspector" means an inspector appointed in accordance with the provisions of the Vegetation Diseases Acts.
 - "Registered Mark" means any mark registered with and approved by the Department of Agriculture.

CONCERNING REMOVALS FROM ONION INSPECTION DISTRICTS. 2. No person shall remove, or cause to be removed, any onions from any Onion Inspection District by rail or bont, or otherwise, unless—

- (a) such onions shall have been, not more than four days prior to such removal, examined by the Inspector and found, to the best of his knowledge and belief, to be clean, and reasonably free from diseases of onions proclaimed under section 2, Act 1432;
- (b) such onions are contained in bags, cases, or packages determined by the Inspector as sound, suitable, and clean;
- (c) the bags, cases, or packages in which such onions are contained shall be legibly branded or stamped with the name and address (or registered mark) of the actual grower of such onions, and in the case of previously used bags, cases, or packages, all other names and marks (if any) shall have been effectively obliterated; and and
- . (d) a "Transport Permit" in the form of Schedule
 A hereto shall have been issued in respect of
 such onions by the Inspector and to the proper
 railway or boat official for attachment to the
 waybill or bill of lading as authority for the
 transport of such onions.

CONCERNING TRANSFERS WITHIN ONION INSPECTION DISTRICTS.

ASTRICTS.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations an Inspector may examine any onions consigned from any place within any Onion Inspection District to any city or town situated within such district, and, provided that all the conditions of these Regulations are complied with; may issue a "Removal Permit," in the form of Schledule B hereto, in respect of such onions, without which such removal of such onions will constitute an offence under these Regulations.

SORTING.

- 4. Onions found upon examination by an Inspector to comprise a proportion of onions which are diseased shall be removed by the owner or consignee or agent of either to a place approved by the Inspector (which may be the owner's store), and there sorted under his supervision, and dealt with under the following conditions, viz.:—
 - (a) When sorted, all onions which are free from diseases may be repacked in bags, cases, or packages determined as sound, suitable, and clean by the Inspector, who may then issue for such onions a "Removal Permit" in the form in Schedule B.

- (b) After sorting, all diseased onions shall be destroyed or otherwise dealt with as the Inspector may direct.
- (c) All expenses in connexion with the supervision handling, sorting, cartage, and destruction of such onions shall be paid by the owner or consignee, or agent of either.

CHARGES.

- 5. The charge for inspection shall be Sixpence per ton or fraction of a ton, and shall be paid in respect to each lot or consignment prior to the issue of a "Transport Permit" or "Removal Permit," as the case may be; except in cases where the owner or consignee shall have lodged a deposit in money or approved guarantee to cover all consignments to be submitted during a period for one month, when and in such cases the charge shall be calculated in respect of the aggregate toniage of onions submitted for inspection during any one month until the last day of such month.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule and the rates charged are considered reasonable. Preference will also be given to articles of British manufacture as against those of foreign manufacture.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

- 1. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender: all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.
- 4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.
- 5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown, are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office, and Williamstown district will include the Town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra. Supplies for s.s. John Murray must be delivered at the Railway Pier, Port Melbourne.
- Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.
- 7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
- 9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.
- 11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the

- goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an anthority for the carrier to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retuined by hinself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 15 of these conditions.
- 12. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railway Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.
- 13. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

- 15. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; the terms of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules, and the wages paid to any such person shall be in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour clauses thus indorsed on the schedules affected shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract.
