This part of this By-law shall have operation and apply to the whole of the area within the Borough of Portland enclosed by the left bank of the Salt Creek, commencing at its confluence with Portland Bay, and following up its course and that of the "Swamp" until it meets the prolongation of a line drawn in the centre of Clarke-street; thence northwards along such line drawn in the centre of Clarke-street until it meets a line drawn in the centre of Otway-street; thence enstwards centre of Clarke-street until it meets a line drawn in the centre of Otway-street; thence eastwards along such line drawn in the centre of Otway-street until it meets a line drawn in the centre of Blair-street; thence northwards along such line drawn in the centre of Blair-street until it meets a line drawn in the centre of Kennedy-street; thence eastwards along such line drawn in the centre of Kennedy-street and a prolongation of such line through the Lighthouse reserve until it meets the sea-coast of Portland Bay; and thence by the said sea-coast of Portland Bay southwards to the point of commencement; and to any other to the point of commencement; and to any other area or areas within the said Borough of Portland which the Council may, from time to time, by resolution, add to such above-mentioned area, and shall apply and extend to every occupier of any tenement therein.

State School, Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 15,000 gallons per annum.

The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each load of 400 gallons or less.

For every water trough connected with hotels, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

For every factory, mill, or other tenement where machinery is attached and working, the rate shall be Two shillings in the £r on the annual municipal value of such property; or the water may be supplied and charged for by measure at Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

9. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter, the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per half acre and 200,000 gallons per acre.

10. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards, a charge of Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 150,000 gallons per acre when supplied from an open race.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

12. For the water supplied to mining companies, dredges, &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per week.

The before-mentioned rates shall be payable half-yearly,

1. The Woodlands Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Woodlands Park who shall offend against decency as regards dress,

5. No person shall leave or deposit in the Woodlands Park any glass, paper, or rubbish except in the receptacles provided, nor roll or throw stones or other missiles in the Woodlands Park or light any fire therein.

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Woodlands Park or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, and no person shall offer for sale any article therein without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

7. No person shall hold any form of concert or other entertainment within the Woodlands Park without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees.

8. No person shall stand on the seats in the Woodlands Park, or cause any interference with or annoyance to visitors by playing games or musical instruments therein.

9. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Woodlands Park shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

10. No person shall put into the Woodlands Park any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals; and all goats, pigs, and poultry, and all dogs, except as hereinafter provided, found trespassing within the Woodlands Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall bring into the Woodlands Park any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailliff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
