BY-LAW NO. 261, AMENDING BY-LAW NO. 210.—IRRIGATION CHARGE.—RODNEY TRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

- (b) For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no house or building erected, a rate of Eighteenpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being thereof shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Ten shillings and sixpence per annum.

  (r) And for every ratepayer owning or occupying two or more houses, buildings, or tenements within the Waterworks District, to each of which water meters have been and are attached, such maximum quantity to be consumed either wholly at any one or partly at one and partly at any other or others of said houses, buildings, or tenements (and in all cases to be ascertained and paid for by measure), shall, for that part or the whole of the year, as the case may be, during which such ratepayer shall own or occupy such two or more houses, buildings, or tenements, but for no longer period, be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of the total sum of the municipal valuations of all the said houses, buildings, or tenements owned or occupied by him. If such maximum quantities be exceeded the excess shall be paid for by measure at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. gallons.
- (d) For water supplied by measure, a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1.000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons.

2. The rates herein are made for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1912, and shall be payable in one sum on the 1st day of April, 1912.

Such persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to de-mand; receive, collect, and recover such rates.

Education Act 1901. REGULATION RESCINDED, REGULATION MADE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of April, 1012.

### PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria. Mr. Murray Mr. Graham Mr. Cameron.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (\$\varepsilon 4\$ Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: And whereas by the Education Act 1901 (1 Edw. VII. No.

1777) it is enacted that pursuant to the provisions of the Principal Act regulations may be made for the control of continuation schools: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind clause 10 of Regulation No. X., made under the provisions of the Act No. 1777 aforesaid, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION X., CLAUSE 10.—CONTINUATION SCHOOLS FOR THE TRAINING OF JUNIOR TEACHERS.

THE TRAINING OF JUNIOR TEACHERS.

10. Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulations No. VII. and No. XI., pupils who have attended for two years at a continuation school for junior teachers and have passed a satisfactory examination in the course of study, and pupils who, prior to admission to a continuation school, have passed the Junior Public or some higher examination of the Melbourne University, and have attended for one year at a continuation school for junior teachers, and have passed a satisfactory examination in the course of study, shall be held to have preferential claim over all other candidates for appointment to such vacancies as may occur during the year next succeeding the annual examination at which they qualified for appointment. Upon appointment, such qualified pupils shall, without further examination, be classified and paid as junior teachers of the third class.

The conditions necessary for the promotion of such

The conditions necessary for the promotion of such junior teachers to the second class shall be as follows:—

- (a) To have completed twelve months as junior teachers of the third class, and to have received satisfactory reports from the district inspector and from the head teacher of the school in which they are employed; and
  (b) To have passed in all the subjects prescribed in the continuation-school course, and also in needlework (part 1 of the junior teacher course), and drawing practice; and
  (c) To have passed a satisfactory examination in the course of theory and practice of teaching as prescribed from time to time for the first year of the training of continuation-school students after appointment to State Schools.
  The conditions necessary for the promotion of such

The conditions necessary for the promotion of such junior teachers to the first class shall be as follows:—

- or teachers to the first class shall be as follows:—

  (a) To have completed twelve months as junior teachers of the second class, and to have received satisfactory reports from the district inspector and from the head teacher of the school in which they are employed; and (b) To have passed a satisfactory examination in music (theory and practice), and in the course of theory and practice of teaching as prescribed from time to time for the second year of the training of continuation-school students after appointment to State Schools.

(c) Needlework, Part II., of the junior teacher course. Drawing practice—as for junior teachers for classes II. and I.

Such junior teachers shall be regarded as having com-pleted their junior teachers' course when they have completed one year as first-class junior teachers.

Before appointment as junior teachers, pupils of con-tinuation schools shall be medically examined, and no such pupil shall be appointed unless the medical report is satisfactory.

And the Honorable Alfred Arthur Billson, His Majestv's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Malvern order as follows:—

1. In the interpretation of this By-law the word "poultry" shall mean and include the following birds, namely:—Fowls, ducks, geese, and turkeys, or any one or more of them, and whether of the male or female

or more of them, and whether of the male or female gender.

2. No person shall keep, or cause to be kept, any poultry except in yards or runs having an area of not less than 200 square feet, provided that if more than ten head of poultry are kept at any one time, then for every five head of poultry in excess of such number there shall be an additional space of 100 square feet.

Provided further that such yards or runs shall be securely enclosed by a fowl-proof fence, and shall be kept in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state and condition.

3. Every such fowl yard or run shall be at least 25 feet from any dwelling house, and the Council may, upon reasonable notice to the occupier of any such yard or run, require such occupier to remove or alter such yard or run so that no part thereof shall be within 25 feet of any dwelling house as aforesaid.

4. No fowl house shall be erected or placed within 25 feet of any dwelling house.

5. The occupier of any premises on which a fowl house is erected or placed shall cause the floor and the interior thereof to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such floor and interior in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state and condition.

6. Any poultry which shall develop diphtheria, tubercle, or other contagious or infectious disease injurious to human heings shall be destroyed, or caused to be destroyed, by the person keeping the same.

7. The occupier of any premises upon which there is

beings shall be destroyed, or caused to be destroyed, by the person keeping the same.

7. The occupier of any premises upon which there is a fowl house, fowl yard, or run, shall at all reasonable times afford free access to every part thereof respectively to the Officer of Health and Inspector of Nuisances of the said city, or either of them, or to any person or persons specially appointed by the Council in that behalf for the purpose of inspecting any such fowl house, fowl yard, or run, or the poultry therein or thereon.

8. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Ten shillings for each such breach.

No male over the age of ten years shall trespass in any dressing shed, bathing box, or latrines reserved for the use of females, and no female shall trespass in any dressing shed, bathing box, or latrines reserved for males dressing shed, bathing box, or latrines reserved for males except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accidents.

7. No person shall play games in, loiter, misconduct himself, commit a nuisance, bring any rubbish, fitth, or other offensive matter into, or damage or disfigure, or write upon any of the bathing boxes set apart or authorized by the Council for bathing purposes.

8. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane language, or behave in an indecent manner, in or on any part of the river bank set apart or used by the public for bathing purposes, or in connexion with such purposes.
