BY-LAW No. 262.—FOR THE SALE OF WATER AT A CHARGE OF TEN SHILLINGS PER ACRE FOOT DURING THE PERIOD FROM THE 1ST DAY OF OCTOBER, 1911, TO THE 31ST DAY OF MAY, 1912.—BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following :—

Notwithstanding anything contained in the By-law No. 236, made by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission on the 11th day of September, 1911, and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 15th day of September, 1911, for the sale and distribution of water for irrigation within the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply District, the charge for water supplied for irrigation in excess of any Water Rights shall be :—

During the period from the 1st day of October, 1911, to the 31st day of May, 1912, Ten shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.
