That By-law No. 210 made by the Commission on the 21st day of August, 1911, be and is hereby amended by substituting for the second clause of the said By-law No. 210 the following:—

2. Such charge is made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the 1st day of October, 1911, and ending with the 30th day of April, 1912, and shall be payable on the fifth day of October, 1911, at the office of the Commission at Tatura.

The foregoing By-law was made by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission on the 25th day of March, 1912, and the common seal of the Commission was hereunto affixed the first day of April, 1912, in the presence of—

YARRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of April, 1912.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by Division 3 of Part III. of the Water Act 1905 the Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of Commissioners of Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for the election of Commissioners of the Yarram Waterworks Trust.

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Yarram Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.

2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.—The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.

3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations, within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 27th day of June, 1912, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 27th day of June in each succeeding triennial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon a Sunday or any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be held upon the day next following.

5. Voters' List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 96 of the Water Act 1905 in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 27th day of May, 1912, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners, and shall remain in force, and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided.

6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 96 of the Water Act 1905, which shall, upon approval of the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust, be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing.

7. Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form in the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Altona included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.

In making out such list of voters, if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such ratepayer rated in the municipal district.

8. Minister to appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purpose of the first election herein mentioned the Minister shall appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the Chairman of the Trust holding office as such on the day immediately preceding the date of election shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of Chairman of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

9. Notice of Election.—Nomination of Candidates.—Second Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of Commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the Yarram township, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said township to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein, and any person desirous of becoming a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper, in the form of the Second Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein both his christian and surname, together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, as well as by the candidate. And no person who shall not have been so nominated shall, within the provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of Commissioners.

10. Qualifications of Commissioners.—No person shall be eligible for election as a Commissioner unless he is liable to be rated under the Water Act 1905 in respect of property within the district of the Trust.

11. Where Number of Candidates does not exceed Number of Commissioners to be elected.—If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of Commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

12. Where Number of Candidates exceeds the Number of Commissioners to be elected.—Third Schedule.—Notice of Poll.—Hours of Polling.—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of Commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause the ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall also give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the Yarram township, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such Commissioners upon a day named in such notice, at such place within the said township as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eight o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

13. Retirement of Candidates before Polling Day.—If, at any election, after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid, any candidate for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid, are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the Yarram township a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election shall, on the day appointed for the election, declare the remaining candidates duly elected; and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election; and, if such papers are already printed, shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

14. Polling Booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

15. Returning Officer to preside at Polling Booth.—The returning officer or his deputy shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

16. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling booth, and the said returning officer or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

17. Pencils to be provided.—The returning officer or his deputy shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

18. Mode of voting.—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

19. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

20. Informal Ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

21. What Question may be asked.—At any election of Commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

“Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force for this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of property described to be situated in (here specify the street or other place described in the roll)?”

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

22. False Answer, Polling Twice, and Personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling booth after having received a ballot-paper, without having deposited the same in the ballot-box, as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

23. Result of Polling, how ascertained.—Immediately on the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected Commissioners of the Trust, and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall determine by lot the candidate to hold office.

24. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll indorse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust.

25. Minister to determine question arising upon first election.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question, in writing, to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final and binding.

26. Questions arising upon subsequent election to be determined by the Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the Commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no Commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the Commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

27. Appeal to Minister from Determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

28. Failure to Elect deemed to create Extraordinary Vacancies.—If at any election of Commissioners any vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are not filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioners eventually elected or appointed to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

29. Expenses of Election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the Trust.

30. Penalty for Breach of Regulations.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

31. Interpretation.—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

A By-law of the Town of Williamstown, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 76, for the purpose of regulating the construction and erection of buildings and hoardings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Williamstown order as follows:—

By-law No. 72 is hereby repealed.

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

3. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do, and without first submitting to the Council, its town clerk or surveyor, the plans and specifications of the proposed building or erection.

4. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any building or erection within any of the streets mentioned in clause seven (7) hereof (except that of necessary repairs not affecting its construction or any external or party wall) without first obtaining the written permission of the Council so to do.

5. No person shall place, erect, build, or construct, or cause to be placed, erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection which is intended to be used or which shall or may be used as a shop, office, public building, or warehouse, upon or within lines at a distance of thirty (30) feet from and running parallel with either side of the streets or roads mentioned in clause seven (7) hereof unless the external walls thereof shall be of brick, stone, or concrete, or of brick, stone, and concrete combined.

6. No person shall place, erect, build, or construct, or cause to be placed, erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only in any of the streets mentioned in clause seven (7) hereof unless the whole of the said building or erection of whatever material constructed shall cover the area therein specified, and if such building or erection shall be of wood the external walls thereof shall be covered with new sound boards, and the roof or roofs thereof shall be covered on the outside with incombustible roof coverings, and the height between the floors and the ceilings of the main rooms shall be as specified therein.

8. No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be removed or transported, any building or erection either in whole or in part into any part of the area to which this By-law extends, or from any part of such area to another part of the same, unless such building or erection, when completed, shall comply with all the provisions of this By-law, and unless six days' (6) notice, in writing, of the intention to remove the same be first given to the Council, its town clerk or surveyor.

9. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only in any street, right-of-way, lane, or thoroughfare not mentioned in clause seven (7) hereof without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do, and without first submitting to the Council, its town clerk or surveyor, the

plans and specifications of the proposed building or erection, and the Council is hereby empowered to restrain the erection of any such building or erection, if, in its opinion, it does not contain sufficient area or accommodation for human occupation or habitation, or if the materials to be used in the construction of such building or erection are not considered suitable by the Council for a dwelling-house, provided the Council shall not restrain the erection of any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only in any street, right-of-way, lane, or thoroughfare existing on or before the first of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety (1890), and not mentioned in clause seven (7) hereof if the main rooms of the said building or erection, of whatever material constructed, shall cover an area of twelve hundred (1,200) square feet at the least, and if such building or erection be of wood the external walls thereof shall be covered with new sound boards, and the roof or roofs thereof shall be covered with incombustible roof coverings, and the height between the floors and the ceilings of the main rooms shall be eleven feet six inches (11 ft. 6 in.) at the least.

10. If any building or erection shall be partly or wholly erected, built, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council, its town clerk or surveyor, may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building or erection, fourteen (14) days' notice, in writing, to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions or to pull down or to remove such building or erection, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council, its town clerk or surveyor, to enter upon such building or erection and on the site thereof, with a sufficient number of workmen, and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council, in its discretion, thinks fit to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit, and all the expenses incurred by the Council, its town clerk or surveyor, in demolishing and pulling down the said building or erection, or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and detained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale to such owner or builder or other person legally entitled thereto.

11. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, or aviary, or other separate out-buildings approved of by the Council, or to any Government buildings, works, or operations.

12. The sum of Ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.) shall be charged and received on account of the municipal fund for each building, erection, alteration, or addition approved of by the Council, for erection in any of the streets mentioned in clause seven (7) hereof, and for each hoarding approved of by the Council.

13. The following words or expressions whenever used in this By-law shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them respectively, so far as such meanings are not excluded by the context, that is to say, "Council" shall mean the Council of the Town of Williamstown. "Surveyor" shall mean the surveyor for the time being of the town of Williamstown. "Town Clerk" shall mean the town clerk for the time being of the Town of Williamstown. The expression "public building" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used as a church, chapel, or other place of public worship, or as a school, college, or place of public instruction (not merely a dwelling-house so used), or as a hospital, public theatre, public hotel, public concert room, public ball room, public lecture room, public library, or public exhibition room, or as a public place of assembly, or used or constructed or adapted to be used for any public purpose, also a building used or constructed or adapted to be used as a hotel, lodging-house, home, refuge, or shelter. The expression "warehouse" means a warehouse, factory, manufactory, workshop, public stable, brewery, or distillery, or any other building exceeding in cubical content 15,000 cubic feet, which is neither a public building nor a domestic building. The expression "dwelling-house" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.

HOARDINGS.

14. No person shall place, erect, build, or construct, or cause to be placed, erected, built, or constructed, any hoarding, signboard, or erection for advertising purposes within a distance of fifty (50) feet from the building line of any street unless the same shall be properly and securely placed, built, erected, or constructed according to a plan and specification prepared by the owner thereof, and approved of by the Council or its surveyor, and the height of any such hoarding, signboard, or erection shall not be greater than twelve (12) feet. No person shall place, erect, build, or construct, or cause to be placed,

erected, built, or constructed, any hoarding, signboard, or erection for advertising purposes over any street, or any part thereof (unless the same forms part of a verandah), unless the same shall be properly and securely placed, erected, built, or constructed according to a plan and specification prepared by the owner thereof, and approved of by the Council or its surveyor, and no such hoarding, signboard, or erection shall be placed between the roofing of the verandah and the level of the footpath. One end of such hoarding, signboard, or erection shall be securely fixed to the face of the building of which the verandah forms part with wrought-iron brackets. The depth of such hoarding, signboard, or erection shall not exceed four (4) feet, and shall not project beyond the edge of the verandah nearest the street channel. If any person shall place, erect, build, or construct, or cause to be placed, erected, built, or constructed, any hoarding, signboard, or erection for advertising purposes contrary to the provisions of this By-law, it shall be lawful for the Council or its surveyor to serve on the owner or builder thereof a notice to pull down and remove such hoarding, signboard, or erection by giving such notice to the owner or builder thereof, or by affixing such notice on the hoarding, signboard, or erection, and in the event of the owner or builder thereof refusing or neglecting to pull down and remove such hoarding, signboard, or erection within seven days from and after the service of such notice, it shall be lawful for the Council to pull down and remove, or cause to be pulled down and removed, any hoarding, signboard, or erection constructed or erected contrary to this By-law, and to sell the materials thereof, and to apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such hoarding, signboard, or erection, and in paying any fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof.

"Hoardings" shall mean and include any erection or structure placed, erected, built, or constructed, or used for the purpose of writing, printing, pasting, or posting notices, advertisements, placards, or other printed or written matter thereon, or any erection or structure being of a height greater than six feet six inches (6 ft. 6 in.), measured from the level of the adjoining street to the highest point of such erection or structure upon which notices, advertisements, placards, or other printed or written matter is printed, written, placed, painted, pasted, or posted, but shall not apply to a hoarding erected in a street for the purpose of carrying on building operations only or to any dwelling-house or shop, or to a fence six feet six inches (6 ft. 6 in.) or under in height.

15. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds (£5).

The foregoing By-law, being By-law No. 76 of the Town of Williamstown, was passed by the Council of the Town of Williamstown on the 12th day of December, 1911, and confirmed by special order on the 9th day of January, 1912.

SHIRE OF FRANKSTON AND HASTINGS.

BY-LAW NO. 21.

A By-law of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings, made under section 193 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 21, for—

- regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings;
- requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings;
- authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to any such By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof;
- appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings order as follows:—

1. No person shall commence the erection of any building until he shall lodge with the Shire Engineer a plan and specification of the same, showing the exact site upon which it is intended to erect such building, and the manner in and the materials of which it is proposed to erect the same, and until the Shire Engineer shall, in writing, approve of such plan and specification; and no person shall erect any such building except in accordance with the plan and specification so approved.

2. No person shall commence to erect any hoarding for advertising or other similar purposes until he shall have lodged with the Shire Engineer a complete plan and specification, showing the exact site upon which it is intended to erect such hoarding, and the manner in and the materials of which it is proposed to construct the same, and until the Shire Engineer shall, in writing, approve of such plan and specification, with such modifications or additions thereto as in his opinion are necessary in the interests of public safety; and no person shall erect such hoarding except in accordance with the plan and specification so approved.

3. No person in the construction of the internal or external walls, roofs, floors, ceilings, or any part of any building to be erected shall use any material which, in the opinion of the Shire Engineer, shall be unsound.

4. No person shall, without the written consent of the Council of the said Shire, place or erect on any land within the portion of the said Shire to which this By-law is made applicable any building or portion of a building which has been removed from without the Shire, or from another part of the same. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundary of the land in the same position in which it stands, provided that such alteration is carried out in strict conformity with the general provisions of any building regulations of the said Shire.

5. If the Shire Engineer shall certify, in writing, that any building is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or insanitary state as to be dangerous to public safety or health, or that any hoarding is in such a state to be dangerous to public safety, the owner of such building, erection, or hoarding, upon receiving notice from the Council requiring him to pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding, shall pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding within the time limited by such notice, not being less than three days from the service thereof.

6. In default of compliance with any such notice to pull down or remove any building, erection, or hoarding, the Council may, immediately on the expiration of the time limited therein, pull down or remove such building, erection, or hoarding, and may sell any of the materials thereof, and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or hoarding, or materials, and shall pay into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

7. The internal walls of all wooden buildings shall be properly framed with studs and plates and covered with lath and plaster, tongued and grooved wood, steel plates, or any other similar lining which has been approved by the Engineer. The outside walls shall be similarly framed with sufficient studs and plates and covered with sound new boards or materials approved by the Engineer. The Engineer shall be the sole judge as to the necessary sizes of studs and plates, but no studs or plates shall be of less thickness than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch.

8. The following fees shall be payable for the several services hereunder set forth, and such fees shall be payable to the Shire Secretary before the performance of any act for which fee is payable:—

10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Township of Frankston, and Melbourne-road from Mile Bridge to Sweetwater Creek in the Shire of Frankston and Hastings.

Any person who offends against section 1 of this By-law one clear day after a notice in writing, signed by the Road Inspector of the said Shire, has been served upon him or his representative, or left at the house, land, or premises so owned or occupied by him, or over which he has a right-of-way or easement, requesting him to abate the said nuisance, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £20 nor less than £10.

4. In this By-law the word person shall include any incorporated body.
