By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Health Act 1890.

BOROUGH OF PORT FAIRY.—BY-LAW No. 8.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1890, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Borough of Port Fairy, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

(1) By-law No. 6 of the said Council, made 11th January, 1911, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 24th March, 1911, is hereby repealed.

(2) This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(3) This By-law shall apply to and have operation to the area in the Borough enclosed within the following boundaries, viz.:—Starting at a point at the south-west angle of lot ninety-two; thence north from the Southern Ocean to the Yambuk-road; thence by a line to the small bridge across the Blackwood drain on the Hamilton-road; thence along the main Blackwood drain to a point being the intersection of the said drain with a road running westwards from the railway crossing on the Rosebrook-road; thence to the said railway crossing; thence along the Rosebrook-road northwards to the Sandspit-road; thence by that road to the Moyne River; thence along that river and the Southern Ocean to the commencing point; also, all that land in the Borough of Port Fairy east of the River Moyne.

(4) The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

(5) The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

(6) The occupier aforesaid, or other person having the control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, charcoal, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

(7) The Council shall at least once in each week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed, with its contents, from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

(8) Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed with water, and afterwards dipped in a trough containing disinfecting solution composed of phenyle and water, and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

(9) No closet or privy door or trap shall abut on and open in or into any street, lane, or right-of-way.

(10) The occupier aforesaid, or other person, shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

(11) To provide for the proper removal of night-soil, the occupier of every tenement within the aforesaid boundaries shall pay to the Council of the Borough of Port Fairy such sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said Council for supplying, removing, emptying, and cleansing closet pans, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

(12) Such charge shall be payable by each occupier at such times as the Council may from time to time determine, and shall be paid at the office of the Council, Borough Chambers, Bank-street, Port Fairy; and such charge shall be a charge upon the property.

(13) If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolution for passing this By-law, number eight, agreed to by the Council the tenth day of January, and confirmed the seventh day of February, 1912.

SHIRE OF EPPING.—BY-LAW No. 10.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Epping, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following boundaries, viz:—

Commencing at the north-west corner of the Epping township boundary; thence east by the Cemetery-lane to Darebin Creek; thence southerly by the Darebin Creek to a point east of Hogan's-lane; thence west to and along Hogan's-lane to a point due south of the commencing point; thence north to the point of commencement.

4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid, or other person having the control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be covered with a lid and removed, with its contents, from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by super-heated steam and tar painted, or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid, or other person, shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil, and the other work herein directed, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BOROUGH OF WONTHAGGI.—BY-LAW No. 4.

THE Council of the Borough of Wonthaggi, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Borough, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and every other power enabling the said Council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, do hereby make the following By-law No. 4 of the said Council, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall provide a covered non-absorbent receptacle of an approved pattern, into which all rubbish from yards, and all household refuse shall be placed for the purpose of removal, and which shall be kept in an inoffensive condition by the introduction into same of some effective deodorant when necessary.

3. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week, or more often if required by the Health Officer or Inspector, cause to be emptied and cleansed every earth closet or privy on or belonging to such premises.

4. Every occupier of any premises shall remove, or cause to be removed therefrom, all ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon at least once in every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of the occupier.

5. Nothing contained in the foregoing clause shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be used or to be kept for the purpose of being used as manure on any garden or land contiguous to such premises so that the same be not so kept or used as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or so as to contravene any By-law of the Council.

6. No person shall deposit night-soil, bury any carcass of any dead animal, or place or deposit dust, filth, rubbish, offal, manure, or other refuse or offensive matter in or upon any land within the said Borough except only at the depot for the time being provided by the said Council, or in or upon such other place or places as may be set apart from time to time for such purpose, and every carcass and all offensive matter liable to decompose shall be buried at least two feet below the natural surface of the ground, and in all cases to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Nuisances.

7. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor thereof being at least three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings for ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan for night-soil of a pattern

to be approved by the Council, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same, and no pan shall at any time be filled to within less than three inches of the surface of same.

8. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates thereof, and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this clause.

9. Every person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Wonthaggi.

BY-LAW NO. 57.

Diamond Creek Water Supply.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 57, for regulating the supply and distribution of water to the Township of Diamond Creek.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. That the charge for water shall not exceed One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and shall not be less than One shilling and threepence.

2. That the supply of water shall in all cases be by measure.

3. Application for water service must be made to the Council by the plumber laying such service, and three days' notice thereof, in writing, must be given. He shall also lodge with such application 10s. for ½-inch service and 20s. for ¾-inch service in addition to the usual deposit required for opening the road. The amount thus lodged shall entitle the consumer to 8,000 gallons of water for ½-inch connexion and 16,000 gallons of water for ¾-inch connexion.

4. All connexions shall be paid for by the consumer, and shall be made under the supervision and subject to the approval of the Shire Engineer.

5. No person shall, without proper notice, interfere with any pipe or connexion between the main and the meter.

6. Every consumer shall, at his own expense, provide a meter and maintain the same in good working order to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer, and such meter shall not be placed at a greater distance than 3 feet from the building line.

7. A high pressure screw-down stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, shall be placed on every service between the main and the building line.

8. All connexions, meters, taps, &c., must be approved by the Shire Engineer.

9. Any person desiring to move or alter the position of a meter must give three days' notice, in writing, and the registration of the quantity of the water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration.

10. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any of the Council's mains, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe belonging to the Council, or any service-pipe, tap, or fitting except he shall be a licensed plumber.

11. No person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, shall uncover any pipe without giving three days' notice to the Council, or shall tamper with or alter any pipe without permission, in writing, or shall wilfully or negligently break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Council.

12. All connexions with the Council's mains must be made in the same manner as required by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

13. The person appointed by the Council may at any time enter into any house or premises supplied from the Council's main in order to examine it, if there be any misuse of water, or for the purpose of checking the meter, and if such person be refused admission or prevented from entering such house or premises the Council may refuse to continue the supply of water to such premises, and the occupier of the said premises shall, in addition, be liable to the penalties hereunder:—

For any breach of the above conditions every person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

SHIRE OF ROCHESTER.

REGULATION.

A REGULATION of the Shire of Rochester, numbered One, made under part one, divisions three and four, of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1903*, in force in the Shire of Rochester, by virtue of a By-law of the above-named Shire, numbered six, for regulating the provision of crossings over footpaths and street channels, and draining private yards to street channels within the township of Rochester, that is to say:—All house drains leading from private property to street channels shall consist of glazed stoneware pipes of not less than 4 inches internal diameter laid in sand and jointed in cement mortar laid to levels supplied by the Shire Engineer. No opening up of footpaths shall in any case be allowed without the permission of the Shire Engineer. All private bridges over street channels shall be constructed of redgum timber on approved plates of such form and dimensions as shown and described in plans and specifications deposited at the Shire Hall, Rochester. All private pipe culverts giving access to private property shall consist of monier pipes not less than 12 inches diameter, laid in sand, jointed in cement, covered with not less than 6 inches of metal or gravel, with proper cement concrete kerbs, the whole laid to levels supplied by the Shire Engineer, and constructed in accordance with plans and specifications deposited at the Shire Hall, Rochester. Crossings over footpaths may be one of three kinds:—(1) Tar metalled; (2) Level pitched; (3) Graded pitched to be not less than 9 feet wide, and of length the full width of the footpath. (1) Tar-metalled crossings to be boxed in with redgum kerbs spiked to redgum posts between kerbs to be excavated to proper depth and filled in with approved metal 2½-inch gauge properly tarred, set in grades and levels as supplied, and constructed in accordance with plans and specifications deposited at the Shire Hall, Rochester. (2) Level pitched crossings—Footpaths to be excavated to proper depth, pitchers to be 9 inches wide, 4 inches deep, and from 9 to 15 inches in length, set in sand and grouted with cement mortar to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer, and in accordance with plans and specifications deposited at the Shire Hall, Rochester. (3) Graded pitched crossings to be similar to number two with the exception that pitchers shall be set to grade into channel with rounded kerbs at corners. The whole to be set to levels supplied by the Shire Engineer, and to be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications deposited at the Shire Hall, Rochester.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rochester make the foregoing Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the township of Rochester within the said Shire.

SHIRE OF RODNEY.

BY-LAW No. 22.

A By-law of the Shire of Rodney, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 22, for regulating traffic on the roads between Mooroopna and Shepparton.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rodney order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 21 of the Shire of Rodney is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part or parts of the municipal district, that is to say, within that part of the municipal district the boundaries whereof are as follows:—Commencing at a point on the south-east corner of allotment one, in the parish of Mooroopna; thence by a line south 42 deg. 38 min. east to the Goulburn River; thence north-easterly, south-easterly, easterly, northerly by the river to the southern side of the Benalla and Echuca road; thence westerly by the southern side of the said road 28 chains 9 links; thence by a straight line bearing approximately south 30 deg. 30 min. west to the point of commencement.

3. In this By-law the term "high level road" shall mean and include that part of the main road in the Shire of Rodney between the point of commencement referred to in paragraph one hereof and the boundary between Shepparton and Rodney Shires, which has been raised to a height of 8 feet; or thereabouts, above flood level, and which is indicated by a double-fenced line of metalled road, and includes all bridges and culverts thereon; and the term "the side tracks" shall mean and include all roads or tracks between the point of commencement as aforesaid and the point where the high level road leaves the Rodney Shire and enters the Shepparton Shire other than the high level road.

4. No person shall ride or impel any bicycle, or ride or drive any horse or vehicle, over or along the high level road or the side tracks at a greater speed than 8 miles an hour without permission, in writing, of the Council of the said Shire or the President thereof first had and obtained.

5. Every person riding or impelling any bicycle, or riding or driving any horse or vehicle, shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road, and when on such bicycle, and when overtaking any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger, proceeding along the road, such person shall, within reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn, giving audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach.

6. In every case where a person riding a bicycle meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under full control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, the person riding such bicycle shall immediately stop and dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted as long as reasonably necessary.

7. All cattle intended for sale or slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria or any other State to any other part shall, when practicable, be driven along the side tracks, and shall not, except during flood times, travel upon or along the high level road, and nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or prevent cattle from being driven upon such parts of the high level road where there are no side tracks.

Cattle shall have the meaning as defined in section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

8. No person shall drive or travel any traction engine, or any cart, waggon, or vehicle bearing a load, the total width whereof exceeds twelve feet, along the high level road, except between the hours of One a.m. and Six a.m. in summer, and Seven a.m. in winter, without permission, in writing, of the Council of the said Shire or the President thereof first had and obtained.

9. Sub-section 2 of By-law 13 of the Shire of Rodney is hereby repealed as regards that part of the municipal district to which this By-law applies and has operation.

10. Every person driving any traction engine, or any cart, waggon, or vehicle bearing a load, the total width whereof exceeds twelve feet, upon or along the high level road shall, when any person driving any motor car, carriage, cart, or other vehicle is approaching from the front or from behind, and cannot conveniently pass, draw as close to the left-hand side of the road as he is able, and there pull his traction engine, cart, waggon, or vehicle bearing the load aforesaid to a stand-still, and remain so standing until the person driving the motor car, carriage, cart, or other vehicle approaching as aforesaid shall have passed.

11. Every person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions contained in this By-law forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

4. Every person shall, for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions contained in this By-law, forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.
