## QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 31ST MARCH, 1912.

*Population.*—The estimated population on 31st December, 1911, was 1,337,678; on 31st March, 1912, it was 1,345,134—thus showing an increase of 7,456 persons. The natural increase in the population was 4,243, and the excess of immigration was 3,213. During the quarter Victoria gained from the United Kingdom 2,039 persons, and from Tasmania 3,843 persons.

*Vital Statistics of the State.*—The marriages—2,675—were 114 more, the births—8,243—were 137 more, and the deaths—4,000—were 481 more, but the excess of births over deaths was less by 344 than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Of the total number of deaths, 245 were due to phthisis, and 47 to other tubercular diseases; 336 to cancer, 41 to typhoid fever, and 52 to diphtheria and croup.

*Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.*—The births during the quarter numbered 3,921. This includes 30 cases of twins and 355 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 1,997, and the excess of births over deaths was 1,924. The deaths from diphtheria and croup numbered 21, from typhoid fever 15, and from tubercular diseases 144, as against 18, 13, and 162 respectively in the first quarter of 1911. The total deaths in Melbourne were 1,997, of whom 407 were under twelve months of age. In Ballarat, of 241 deaths, 65 were of infants; in Bendigo, of 179 deaths, 35 were of infants; and in Geelong, of 98 deaths, 17 were of infants. In the four towns mentioned there were 778 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 31 per cent. of the total.

*State Revenue and Expenditure.*—The total revenue for the quarter was £2,578,187, which represents an increase of £700,723 on that for the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The principal items of revenue were—Railways, £1,420,827; and Probate Duty, £111,838. The total expenditure was £2,250,465, an increase of £154,580 on that for the corresponding quarter of 1911.

*Railways.*—Compared with the corresponding quarter of the preceding year, the revenue increased by £50,356, the expenditure by £116,937, train miles run by 229,123, passengers carried by 2,895,184, and the tonnage of goods and live stock by 50,149.

*Victorian Banking Returns.*—On the 31st March the total liabilities of the banks were £49,809,251, and the assets £49,183,188, as against £47,208,264 and £47,169,670, on the 31st March, 1911. The reserves amounted to £7,787,662, and paid-up capital to £14,529,658. The ratio of coin, bullion, and notes to liabilities was 18.09 per cent.

*Savings Banks.*—On the 31st March the amount at credit of the 630,381 depositors was £18,867,533. During the quarter 38,070 accounts were opened, and 24,806 were closed; the deposits made were £4,422,138, and the withdrawals £3,780,294.

*Gold Yield.*—The total yield of gold up to the end of March, 1912, is 72,648,781 ounces.

*Imports and Exports.*—The total value of oversea imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £6,651,778, and the total oversea exports during the same period were valued at £6,474,500, as compared with £5,679,638 and £5,250,956 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

*Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.*—For the first quarter in 1912, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool Stores was £1,060,971, of which £953,692 went to the United Kingdom, £40,516 to South Africa, and £66,763 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Butter, valued at £603,332; Mutton and Lamb, £254,661; and Fruit, £136,514.
