# DETERMINATION OF THE PRINTERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of printing, including bookbinding, stereotyping, preparing printed matter for sale or distribution (including preparing wrappers or labels, folding, insetting, stapling, counting, wrapping, tying, labelling, carrying, or despatching), has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 15th day of July, 1912. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

# IMPROVERS.


