### CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

The Health Act 1890.

A By-law of the City of Footscray made under the Health Act 1890, and Numbered 33.  ${}_{-}$ 

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the Health Act 1890 and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the City of Footscray, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, do hereby make a By-law, and do hereby order and direct as follows:—

- 1. No person shall sweep or otherwise remove from any shop, house, or vehicle into any street any waste paper, shavings, or other refuse, or, being a hawker of rabbits, fish, fruit, or vegetables, or a newsvendor or other street trader, or any other person not being a street trader, throw down and leave in any street any offal, skins, waste paper, shavings, feathers, or other refuse.
- No person shall throw down and leave in any street any bill, placard, or other paper which shall have been torn off or removed from any bill-posting station.
- No person shall throw down and leave in any street any bill, placard, or other substance in-tended, or apparently intended, for the purpose of advertising.
- For every offence against any provision of this By-law the offender shall, upon conviction before any two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

### The Health Act 1800.

A BY-LAW OF THE CITY OF FOOTSCRAY MADE UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890, AND NUMBERED 34.

N pursuance of the power conferred by the Health Act It is pursuanteed the power conterred by the Health Act.

It is o and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the City of Footscray, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, do hereby make a By-law, and do hereby order and direct as follows:—

  1. The occupier of every house, building, tenement, or premises shall provide and keep or cause to be provided and kept thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles made of non-absorbent material not exceeding 4 cubic feet in content, so that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently removable by the public scavenger or such person or persons as the Council may appoint for that purpose, and shall cause all dust, ashes, rubbish, or other house refuse produced, collected, or accumulated on such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle, which receptacle shall be kept constantly covered except at such times as the same may be or shall be opened for the deposit therein of dust, ashes, rubbish, or house refuse as aforesaid, and such receptacle shall be kept in a clean and inoffensive condition, and shall be placed in the yard of such tenement or premises, close to the entrance thereof from the street, lane, or right-of-way on such day in each week as may be specified in any notice to that effect given by the Council, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed by the Council.
- 2. No dust box or receptacle shall be placed in on any street, lane, or right-of-way, but will be removed from inside the yards or premises.
- For every offence against any provisions of this By-law the offender shall, upon conviction before any two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE CITY OF ESSENDON, KNOWN AS "WOODLANDS PARK,"

W HEREAS by section 200 of the Land Act 1901 it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale, permanently, any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 200, Land Act 1901. And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the

City of Essendon in respect of the reserve for a Public l'ark and other purposes of Public Recreation in the City of Essendon, in the parish of Doutta Galla, known as and hereinafter designated "Woodlands Park." Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said "Woodlands Park":—

### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Woodlands Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Woodlands Park who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Woodlands Park.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Woodlands Park, or post bills thereon, or cut names, or in any way damage or deface any of the buildings, gates, bridges, seats, fences, trees, or rocks therein, or remove surface soil or sand in the Woodlands Park.

- 6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Woodlands Park or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, and no person shall offer for sale any article therein without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
- 7. No person shall hold any form of concert or other entertainment within the Woodlands Park without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees.
- 8. No person shall stand on the seats in the Woodlands Park, or cause any interference with or annoyance to visitors by playing games or musical instruments therein.
- 9. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Woodlands Park shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.
- 10. No person shall put into the Woodlands Park any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals; and all goats, pigs, and poultry, and all dogs, except as hereinafter provided, found trespassing within the Woodlands Park shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 11. No person shall bring into the Woodlands Park any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 200 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or constable, and taken before some Justice, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
