Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BUILDERS' LABOURERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the Determination of the Carpenters Board or the Plumbers Board) employed in the occupation of Builder's Labourer, engaged in the erection, repair, or demolition of buildings, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That this Determination shall come into force on the 1st day of August, 1913.

(2) That the lowest rate of wages to be paid to the following classes of persons shall be:— \cdot

Builders' Labourers employed. Delivering building material where the artificial temperature is 130° F. or over ... 1s. 5d. per hour, or 3 2 4 per week of 44 hours. Carrying building material a height of 25 feet 25 feet or over Erecting scaffolding Lifting girders ...
Demolishing buildings ... Draining Or as gear hands or dog men Mixing, preparing, or delivering building material to a bricklayer, plasterer, mason, or fibrous plasterer 1s. $3\frac{1}{2}$ d. ... 1s. 21d. All other builders' labourers

Definitions.

That whenever occurring in this Determination, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say):—

- (a) Metropolitan Centre shall mean the Melbourne General Post Office.
- (b) Any other centre shall mean the respective town halls of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool.

and all distances from a centre shall be computed by the radius.

(4) 'ALLOWANCES.

That the following extra rates shall be paid to all builders' labourers employed on-

- (a) All work distant from the Metropolitan Centre four miles and over ... 03d. per hour.
- (b) All work distant from any other centre four miles and over ... 03d. per hour.

Provided always that where the locality of the work is nearer to the employé's residence than to the centre, all distances shall be reckoned from the employé's residence, which in such case shall be deemed to be the centre.

(9) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

That the special price or rate of payment payable to any person for all work done on-

- (a) Sundays;
- (b) On the undermentioned public holidays (that is to say) :-

26th January, Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April, 'hristmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day,

shall be at the rate of double time; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

TN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of a brassfounder or brassfinisher, or in the process, trade, or business of a brassfounder or brassfinisher of any electrical apparatus or machinery or parts thereof, has made the following Determination, namely :-

- 1. That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 11th day of July, 1913. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piecework price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.

That the time of beginning and ending work shall be :-Time of Beginning. Time of Ending.

OVERTIME.

That the following rates shall be paid for all work done:-

- (a) Within the hours fixed in Clause 5 in excess of 48 hours in any week-
 - (1) In connexion with the repairing of the employer's machinery or tools
- (b) Outside the hours fixed in Clause 5-

 - (i.) Between midnight and 7.30 a.m.(ii.) Between 12.15 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. on the day on which

 - (iv.) Between 2.15 p.m. and midnight on the day on which the half-holiday is observed
 - (v.) Between 8 p.m. and midnight on the other working days of the week

SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

That the special rate of payment payable to any person for all work done on-

Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day (26th January) Eight Hours' Day (21st April) Christmas Day Boxing Day, and New Year's Day,

shall be at the rate of double time; but if for any of these days any other day is by authority of Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted as the holiday, double time shall be payable only for the day so substituted.

, PIECEWORK.

The Board determines, under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1912, No. 2386, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person or persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a brassfounder or brassfinisher, or in the process, trade, or business of a brassfounder or brassfinisher of any electrical apparatus or machinery or parts thereof, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can arn not less than the minimum wage fixed for the particular class of work in which such worker is engaged.
