IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the No. 106.—JULY 16, 1913.—9385.—1.

Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say :—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million six hundred and forty-nine thousand three hundred and sixty-six pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and thirteen and One thousand nine hundred and fourteen."

The occupier of every house, building, tenement, or premises situated in the township of Werribee shall provide a sufficient number of receptacles of rigid metal (preferably of galvanized iron), and each of a capacity not exceeding two cubic feet, for the reception of the garbage and refuse arising from such tenement or premises, and shall cause every such receptacle to be furnished with a cover fitting as closely as practicable, and shall keep such receptacle continuously covered save when garbage or refuse is being deposited in or discharged from the same, and shall keep every such receptacle and cover as clean as practicable and in good order and condition, and shall place such receptacle in the yard of such tenement or premises, close to the entrance thereof from the street, lane, or right-of-way on such day in each week as may be specified in any notice to that effect given by the Council, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged by the person or persons authorized or appointed by the Council.

2. No receptacle shall be placed in or on any street, lane, or right-of-way, but will be removed from inside the yards or premises.

3. Every person who shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, but not less than Five shillings.

Water Acts.

PROPOSED TYRRELL WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Water Acts, I hereby declare that the lands included in the area defined hereunder, and shown on a plan lodged in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne, ought to be constituted a Waterworks District.

The area hereinbefore referred to is defined as follows :—

Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 38, parish of Boorong; thence northerly by the western boundary of that allotment and westerly by the southern boundary of allotment 37A to the south-west angle of that allotment; thence northerly by the western boundaries of allotments 37A, 36, 35, 34, and 33, all in the parish of Boorong, and lines connecting those boundaries, to the north-west angle of said allotment 33; thence by a line bearing north to the southern boundary of allotment 61, parish of Tyenna; thence westerly by that boundary to the south-west angle of said allotment 61; thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 62, 59A, 59, 38, 35, 14, and 11, parish of Tyenna, the western boundaries of allotments 79, 78, 57, 36, 35, 34, 13, and 12, parish of Pirro, and lines connecting those boundaries, to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a line bearing north to the southern boundary of the parish of Mittaick; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly by the southern, western, and northern boundaries respectively of the last-mentioned parish to a point in line with the western boundary of the parish of Larundel; thence northerly by a line and that boundary to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned parish; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Larundel, Manangatang, and Cocamba to the north-east angle of the last-mentioned parish; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Cocamba and Eureka to the north angle of the reserve north of allotment 1, parish of Turar; thence south-easterly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 19 of that parish; thence westerly by a road to a point in the southern boundary of a Water reserve in line with the eastern boundary of

the Timber reserve north of allotment 3, parish of Chillingollah; thence southerly by a line and the eastern boundaries of said Timber reserve and allotment 3 and a line in continuation of the last-mentioned boundary to Lake Timboram; thence generally southerly by the eastern shore of that lake to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 13 of the last-mentioned parish; thence westerly by a line, the last-mentioned boundary, and a line in continuation thereof to the western boundary of the county of Tatchera; thence southerly by that boundary to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 2, parish of Moortworra; thence easterly by a line and the northern boundaries of allotments 2 and 1, parish of Moortworra, to the north-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of that allotment to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 1, parish of Waitchie; thence easterly by the road forming the northern boundaries of allotments 4 and 5A, parish of Waitchie, to the western boundary of Lalbert Creek reserve; thence generally south-easterly by that reserve to the southern boundary of allotment 49, parish of Koro-Ganeit; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of the parishes of Koro-Ganeit and Waitchie to the eastern boundary of the parish of Tyrrell; thence southerly by that boundary to the right bank of the Tyrrell Creek; thence generally north-westerly by that bank to its intersection with the southern boundary of the parish of Tyrrell about one chain easterly from the most southerly angle of allotment 2A of that parish; thence westerly by a road to the point of commencement.

The scheme of works proposed for such district includes a system of channels for supplying domestic and stock requirements; the estimated cost of such works is £25,000 (including £5,000 for existing works to be taken over from Sea Lake Waterworks District); and the said system of channels would be supplied from the Avon and Wimmera Rivers and Lake Lonsdale storage.

The provisions of this Act under the heading "Explosions and Accidents" and under the heading "Miscellaneous" shall apply to every shire; and the Governor in Council may at any time make an Order extending any other provisions of this Act to the whole or to any particular part of any shire or to any

particular boiler or class of boilers or any boiler used in any process trade or business in any shire or in any specified part of any shire :

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and subject to the provisions of section 4 (1) of the *Boilers Inspection Act 1906*, No. 2071, as amended by section 2 of the *Boilers Inspection Act 1912*, No. 2436, doth by this Order extend from and after the fourteenth day of July, 1913, such other provisions of the *Boilers Inspection Acts* to boilers used by the First Mildura Irrigation Trust and to boilers in any Shire in the State of Victoria used by any Waterworks Trust constituted under Part III., Division 3, or by any Local Governing Body constituted under Part III., Division 4, of the *Water Act 1905*, No. 2016, as amended by the *Water Act 1909*, No. 2226.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Inter-State Destitute Persons Relief Act 1912*, hereby makes the following Regulations under the said Act, and declares that the same shall take effect from the eighth day of July, 1913.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE INTER-STATE DESTITUTE PERSONS RELIEF ACT 1912.

1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "The Collector" means the Collector for Inter-State Destitute Persons appointed under the Act.
 - "Assistant Collector" means an Assistant Collector for Inter-State Destitute Persons appointed under the Act.
 - "State" means any State of the Commonwealth of Australia.
 - "The Act" means the *Inter-State Destitute Persons Relief Act 1912*.
2. The duties of the Collector shall be :—
 - (i.) To collect moneys as provided by the Act, either personally or by the assistant collectors or other officers appointed under the Act, and to give receipts on printed forms for such moneys.
 - (ii.) To keep a cash book, which shall show all moneys received by him, and the disposition thereof.
 - (iii.) To keep a ledger or ledgers which shall show :—
 - (a) The amount due by any person paying or liable to pay money to the collector.
 - (b) The amounts paid by any such person from time to time.
 - (c) The amount (if any) due by or to any person to whom money is being paid or should be paid.
 - (d) The total amount collected for any other State.
 - (e) The cost of such collection in fees paid, proportion of officers' salaries, and other expenses.
 - (f) The total amount received for any other State.
 - (g) The total cost of the Collector's Branch in salaries, stationery, postages, fees, and other expenses.
 - (h) The total sum collected in each year as revenue for this State.
 - (i) The total sum collected for deposit accounts.
 - (iv.) To prepare and present to the Attorney-General on or before the first day of August in each year, an audited account of the transactions of the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June in such year. The collector shall, in such statement, show the cost of his branch, the total amount collected as revenue and for deposit respectively, the total amount paid to other Government Departments in this State for fees or otherwise, the amount paid as expenses in and for other States, and the total amounts collected for and by each such State, and any other information directed by the Attorney-General from time to time.
 - (v.) To direct and supervise the operations of all assistant collectors and other officers appointed under the Act.
 - (vi.) To direct and conduct the correspondence of his branch.
 - (vii.) To remit weekly, whenever possible, any sums of money collected for any other State or for any person in this State. The costs of postage and exchange may be deducted from amounts remitted or due.
3. Assistant collectors shall, in the exercise of their duties, carry out the instructions of the collector, and shall be responsible to him.
4. The duties and powers imposed and conferred by these Regulations are in addition to and not in derogation of any duties and powers imposed or conferred by the Act.
5. The forms in the Schedule hereto, with such variations as the circumstances may render necessary or convenient, may be used for the purposes of matters under the Act : Provided that the use of other forms or any variation in any of the said forms shall not effect the validity of the proceedings.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation as hereunder set forth, made in pursuance of the provisions of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893*, certain lands described in such Proclamation were set apart and appropriated for

the purposes of "village community allotments" under the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in Division 1 of Part III. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1749), do hereby order as follows, viz:—

Settlement on Lands Act 1893.

NEERIM.—The Proclamation bearing date the 3rd April, 1894, by which certain lands situate in the parish of Neerim, and comprising an area of one thousand one hundred acres, more or less, were, amongst others, set apart and appropriated for the purposes of village community allotments, is hereby revoked so far only as it relates to the portion of the said lands hereinafter described, viz:—

The term "municipal stage carriage" shall, wherever used in this By-law, have the meaning assigned or described for a "municipal stage carriage" by clause two of Part ten of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

2. That the owner of every hackney carriage, municipal stage carriage, or other carriage used in plying for hire or passengers, and of every private vehicle and velocipede travelling or being driven after sunset and before sunrise shall cause the same to be provided with proper carriage lights, and the driver or conductor of such carriage shall keep the same properly lighted while such carriage is so used.

3. That the driver of every cart and the driver of every night-cart, during the hours after sunset of any day and before sunrise of the following day, in any street or public place within the municipality, shall keep a lighted lamp attached to or suspended from the off or right side of such cart or night-cart, as the case may be, and so as to show a bright white light visible in the direction towards which such cart or night-cart, as the case may be, is going, being driven, or approaching, and so as to show a clear red light in the rear or opposite direction to that in which such cart or night-cart, as the case may be, is going, being driven, or approaching.

4. That this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Municipality of the Shire of Dundas, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act*, 1903 (No. 1393), and numbered nine, for further regulating traffic in, through, and over the streets and roads of the said Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dundas hereby order as follows:—

1. The expression machine wherever used herein shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.
 2. Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway, pavement, or causeway made or set apart for the use or accommodation of foot passengers; but this section shall not apply to a machine merely impelled or taken across any footway, pavement, or causeway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.
 3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to such machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction which he or she is proceeding; and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.
 4. Every person when driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall carry a proper bell, which shall be capable at the will of such person of giving audible and sufficient warning to foot passengers and others of the approach of such machine.
 5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine overtaking or passing any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden in charge of any person or any foot passenger proceeding along or across any street or road, shall, within a reasonable distance from and before overtaking or passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle or horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding the bell fixed to such machine, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.
 6. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any machine furiously or negligently through or upon any public place or thoroughfare.
 7. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, except there be justifiable cause for deviation therefrom.
 8. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle or any horse, or any other beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden except there be justifiable cause for deviating therefrom.
 9. No person using a machine causing any injury, accident, or collision with any other person, machine, or vehicle, or being concerned therein, shall proceed on his or her way without stopping a reasonable time to see the extent of any injury caused and giving on demand his or her name and address to the person injured, or to some one on his or her behalf, or to any member of the police force on demand at any time.
 10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
