BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905 and all powers enabling them on this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

I Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905 and all powers enabling them on this behalf, do make the following By-law:

1. Any person affixing any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by a lead pipe three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give a clear twenty-four (24) hours' written notice of his intention to do so to the secretary of the Trust, and shall before doing such work obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any person offending against this By-law in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. No person shall lay lown any pipe at a less depth than two (2) feet from the surface of the eirth.

3. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasur: of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employés committing any breach of the Water Act 1905, or of this By-law, or any By-law of the Trust.

4. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence-fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

5. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

6. The bore of any service-pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed—

(a) One-half of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid at a sum exceeding Twenty pounds (£20); and this By-law shall be taken as a consent of the Trust only such service. Before any service-pipe with a bore the dimensions of which are contrary to this clause is laid down to any premises the consent of the Trust must first be obtained.

7. No person shall us

7. No person shall use, or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, nanufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes between the hours of Nine (9) o'clock p.m. and Seven (7) o'clock a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (fc).

point (£5).

8. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five

pounds (£5).

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed, shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

10. All water-troughs must be provided with ball taps.

11. No person shall use any water, or allow any water to run for the purpose of watering any garden, plantation, or vegetation wherever growing, or watering any land by means of any pipe, hose, or other conduit, or otherwise in any manner whatsoever, at any time other than between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Niñe (9) o'clock p.m., or unless such pipe, hose, or other conduit or other

means of watering shall, whilst such water shall be so used, be personally attended by some adult constantly present; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

12. If any person does or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or nonfeasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust, and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipe by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this By-law or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under section 345 of Water Act 1905.

13. The officer or officers of the Trust, or other person 13. The officer or officers of the Trust, or other person appointed for that purpose, may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consuined, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders or prevents evanimation he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

14. The word "person" in this By-law shall include corporation.

15. The By-law made by the Trust on the twenty-third day of November, 1909, relating to water supply, is hereby repealed.

Water supplied by measure to be used in private tter supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use or for the watering of private gardens or oistribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shifting (15.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shifting (15.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each hoise power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by meaning would exceed the where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse power, a charge by measure-ment shall be made at the same rate as pro-vided in clause four (4) hereof.
- 6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be Ninepence (yd.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the municipal charge shall not be less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal variation of the Saire of Shepparton for the year 1913 of the property so supplied. so supplied.
- 7. Water supplied to Government Departments, public gardens, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show yards, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten snillings (£2 tos.) per annum.
- S. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fitty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

 9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works or the erection of new building, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (as) per thousand (1,000), which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust officer or officers, and the applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this cause shall first notify the Trust and shall not use any water for such purposes until 'authorized in writing so to do. The Trust officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.

BY-LAW RELATING TO RATES AND CHARGES, No. 3.

HE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Bylaw following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1913 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterring on the amount of the municipal value thereor; but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten shillings sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

- (a) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Fitteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

 (e) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shiftings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (f) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings
- meter to be used.

 (f) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shalt order a meter to be used.

 (g) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the contractor, owners, or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for water at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons. Payments in either case to be made in advance.

- (h) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (i) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.

 (j) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, and show-grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

 (k) A minumum rate of Ten shillings sterling and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises upon which such hose is used.

 (l) For all tenements in the said district situate other-
- (l) For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticutenements are not supplied with water by reticu-lation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be one-half; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, shall be one-quarter of the amount which would be payable if such ten-ment were supplied with the water from the service-pipes. service-pipes.

For all tenements in the said district in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation by such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the abovementioned rates, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the first day of January, 1913, shall be as follows:—

- (a) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse power of such steam
- (b) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every one thousand gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in ach case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes solely, 30,000 per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police stations, churches, court house, post-office, State school, show-ground, cricket ground, bowling green, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five feet shall be charged as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1913. Such rates shall be payable by equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July of such year, and such charges shall be payable half-yearly on the first day of July and the thirty-first day of December of such year.

WHEREAS by the Electric Light and Power Act 1912 it is provided that notwithstanding anything contained in the Electric Light and Power Acts, the Governor in Council may, upon the recommendation of the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Acts, make Regulations for the protection of overhead electric wires or their attachments from injury, contact, or interference, by the conveying or carrying of any building or structure or load along or across any street or public thoroughfare: And whereas the said Minister has recommended the making of the Regulations following for the purposes aforesaid: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, doth hereby, in pursuance of the said recited power and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Street Electric Light and Power Wires Protection Regulations 1912."

2. No person or persons shall convey or carry or cause to be conveyed or carried along or across any street or public thoroughfare any buildings or structure or load of such height or character as may be capable of coming into contact with, or may require the temporary elevation adjustment or removal of, any overhead electric wire or adjustment or removal of, any overhead electric wire or wires or its or their attachment or attachments owned or used by anybody or person or persons under the provisions of the Electric Light and Power Acts or some other lawful authority (hereinatter referred to as the "Electric Authority"), unless such first-mentioned person or persons shall have first given to the several Electric Authorities for the time being concerned 24 hours' notice of the intention to undertake such conveyance or carriage.

Authorities for the time being concerned 24 hours' notice of the intention to undertake such conveyance or carriage.

3. Every notice under these Regulations shall be in writing, and shall set out the route intended to be followed, the date when the work is intended to be followed, the date when the work is intended to be followed, the date when the work is intended to be followed, the date when the work is intended to be followed, the date when the subject of the notice will, in the course of transit along the route named, reach the immediate vicinity of each overnead electric wire or its attachment of the Electric Authority notined, with which (unless temporarily elevated, adjusted, or removed) the subject of the notice would be capable of coming into contact, and shall also give particulars of the bunding structure or load intended to be deart with, and the nature of the vehicle or appliance to be used to effect the transportation thereof, with measurements disclosing what, when ready for transport, will be the greatest height from the ground, and the extreme width of the matter to be moved. The expression "matter to be moved" lastly hereinbefore used shall be for measurement purposes taken to include all projections constituting any part of, and the appliances used to convey carry or secure in position, the main subject of the notice.

4. Upon the receipt by the Electric Authority of a notice hereunder, such Authority shall arriange for an employé or representative to be present during the progress of the work of getting the building structure or load past each overneau electric wire or its attachment of such Authority capable of being come in contact with, or that may require to be temporarily elevated adjusted or removed, and such employé or representative shall take or cause to be taken all such precautions as may be or seem necessary to insure the safety of the public and to avoid any injury to or interference with any such electric wire or its attachment.

5. In or incidental to the work of getting the

its attachment.

5. In or incidental to the work of getting the building structure or load past each overhead electric wire or attachment aforesaid, the person or persons concerned shall comply with all reasonable requirements of the said Electric Authority or its employé or representative, so as to avoid injury to or interference with the wires of such Electric Authority.

6. For the attendance and services of their employé or representative, the Electric Authority shall be entitled to make a charge not exceeding One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) for each hour or portion of an hour so occupied, and in addition shall be entitled to charge the actual amount of any other expenditure involved in the temporary removal and subsequent restoration of any of their overhead lines where necessary.

7. If at the time fixed in the notice duly given here-

7. If at the time fixed in the notice duly given here-under to an Electric Authority as that at which the build ing structure or load to be moved will be in the m-mediate vicinity of an Electric Authority's overhead elec-tric wire or its attachment capable of being come in contact with by the same, and the building structure or

load be then on the spot and no representative or employed of the Electric Authority be present at such time or within fitteen minutes thereafter, the person or persons concerned in the moving of the building structure or load observing all proper care and precautions to prevent injury damage or danger, may proceed with the work of getting the building structure or load past the overhead electric wire or its attachment referred to, in the absence of any such representative or employé.

8. No person or persons shall convey or cause to be conveyed along or across any street or public thoroughfare any house structure or load unless the roof or upper portion thereof, if of metal, be efficiently protected by an insulating device which shall effectually prevent any contact with any electric line.

9. If any Electric Authority person or persons make default in complying with any of the preceding Regulations he or they shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every such default.

The recovery of a penalty under these Regulations shall not affect the liability of the Electric Authority person or persons to make compensation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of the default.

The Minister of Public Instruction may, if he consider the circumstances warrant it, allow a pupil attending either a State district agricultural high school, or a State district high school, or a State higher elementary school, or a State technical school, or a special educational center such as a sloyd or cookery center, such sum (not exceeding £5 per annum) as will cover the cost of transit to and from school, provided that—

(a) The residence of such pupil shall be beyond 3 miles of the school which he is attending;

(b) The school which pupil is attending shall be the nearest school of its kind to his residence:

(c) The total amount, as evidenced by a statutory declaration on a prescribed form, of the net income received by the parents or the guardians of such pupil during the preceding year shall be less than £150.

2. Payments of the allowance granted under Clause 1 above will be made at the end of each quarter to the parent or the guardian of the pupil; but such payments will be conditional on moneys being placed by the Legislature at the Minister's disposal.

BY-LAW NO. 24.

Regulation of Traction Engine Traffic.

A By-law of the Shire of Numurkah, made under subsection 29 of section 107 of the Local Government Act 1903, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public hierway. highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Numurkah order as fol-

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only. If the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches, provided in such last mentioned case—

I. That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or

ixceeding three inches, provided in such lastmentioned case—

I. That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or
an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, a permit, in writing, specifying the public highways on
which it may be used, and that the
engine is being used on one of the
highways so specified.

II. That the owner has agreed, in writing, to
pay to the Council the cost of making
good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine
or any vehicle drawn by it.

III. That such engine is not being used
(unless with the written consent of the
Council, or an officer of the Council
duly authorized in that behalf) to haul
more than two vehicles, exclusive of
any vehicle solely used for carrying
water for such engine.

IV. That the loading of any vehicle drawn
by such engine does not exceed o
tons in weight, including the weight of
such vehicle.

V. That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than 1 inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself sufficient Motive Power to move it.

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary,

Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments,

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or enbankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

Engines not to Halt on certain parts of Highway.

No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circounstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or un-loading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least 20 feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council dulv authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front, and one on the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

Wooden Planks to be carried on Engine, &c.

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks, 12 inches in width, 4 inches in thickness, and at least 12 feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

Skidding at Wheels at Frairs

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels

Penalties.

10. Any person shall, for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law, be liable to the following penalty:—
(a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three

pounds.

(b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

(c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.
