# SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

By-law No. 58 of the Shire of Heidelberg, made under the provision of the Municipal Grounds Act 1905 and the Local Government Act 1903, for regulating charges of admission to and the conduct of persons at or within the reserves known as the Alphington and Ivanhoe Parks.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as fol-

r. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, grass. flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places, or throw stones or any missile, beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave bottles therein, paper, orange peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences, gates, or trees, or cut letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

3. No person except those in the employ of the, or authorized by the Council, shall bring into any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places any horse vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein closed for plantation or other purposes.

4. All dogs, goats, and all poultry found within the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places shall be destroyed, and the owner shall be liable to make compensation for any damage done.

5. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.

6. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the Council, or by a constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

7. No person except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other vehicle in any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places.

8. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in any of the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places.

- 9. The Council shall have power to let any of the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto.
- to. No charge or fee for admission to such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person, and One shilling for each child under the age of twelve years, unless the Council previously authorize higher charges.
- 11. No person except the members of the Council, the 11. No person except the memoers of the Council, the shire secretary, shire engineer, and employés of the Coun-cil on duty shall enter any portion of such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged unless other-wise authorized by the Council.
- 12. No person unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.
- 13. No person shall carry firearms in or through the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein unless by authority of the Council.
- 14. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, tootball, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places without the written authority of the Council, and payment of any lees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.
- 15. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct, interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places.
- 16. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work any of the Council's employés engaged in the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places by conversation or otherwise.
- 17. No person shall sell or offer for sale within such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places any article of food or drink or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement without the written permission of the Council.
- 18. No person shall remain in such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employe of the Council to leave the same.

- 19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places.
- 20. No persons shall assemble in the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission, in writing, of the Council.
- 21. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary hereto shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
- 22. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the enclosures known as the Ivanhoe and Alphington Parks.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 20th day of May, 1913, and confirmed on the 17th day of June, 1913.

#### THE GLENROWAN WATERWORKS TRUST. BY-LAW NO. 1.

HE Commissioners of the Glenrowan Waterworks Trust, which has been constituted under the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

1. Each house or tenement must be supplied by a separate service from the Trust's main, and if so required by the Trust the whole service shall be subjected to a test pressure of 200 lbs. to the square inch after it has been laid. The portions of the service pipe laid along or across any public street, lane, or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to wheel traffic, shall be laid not less than 9 inches below the surface. All trenches cut for the purpose of laying service pipes in streets, lanes, or right-of-ways must be properly filled in and made good to the satisfaction of the Trust and Municipal Council or their officers.

of-ways must be properly filled, in and made good to the satisfaction of the Trust and Municipal Council or their officers.

2. Any person, whether licensed as hereafter set out or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carclessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

4. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

5. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

6. Any person receiving water from the Trust shall take or carry away such wa

- 8. Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, eshall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 9. No person other than an employé of the Municipal Council shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire plugs. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 10. For every offence against any provision of this By-law for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

  11. In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act, or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice, in writing, addressed to the Secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in this By-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work to the commenced save upon the Trust's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the Chairman of the-Trust, the Secretary or the Engineer, who severally shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same at the next following meeting of the Trust for confirmation.
- 12. No prosecution shall be commenced in connexion with any violation or infringement of this By-law except by the specific direction of the Trust, conveyed by a motion or of the Chairman, such direction in the latter case being in writing.

For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from a main, one-quarter the before mentioned rate to be paid.
- 5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per one thousand gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

- 6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal mojeties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1913.
- 7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The time so stated shall not be later than Three p.m. for quantities of explosives of 25 tons or under, and Noon for quantities of explosives over 25 tons.

The notice shall be given not less than 24 hours prior to the time stated in such notice, or where Government holidays intervene, before Noon on the last day Government offices are open to the public prior to such holidays.

For every hour that the ship's arrival in the Powder Anchorage is delayed, after the time stated in the notice, provided weather conditions are suitable, in the opinion of the Port Officer, for loading explosives, the agent will be charged the following fees: charged the following fees :-
