Factories and Shops Acts.

In compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1912*, and after due inquiry, I, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of sub-section (1) of section 37 of the said Act in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF ARBUCKLE, WADDELL, & FAWCKNER, 20 MCKILLOP-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 20th July, 1913, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than eighteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said eighteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

Municipal Grounds Act 1905.

SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

By-law No. 38 of the Shire of Heidelberg, made under the provision of the *Municipal Grounds Act 1905* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, for regulating charges of admission to and the conduct of persons at or within the reserves known as the Alphington and Ivanhoe Parks.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places, or throw stones or any missile, beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave bottles therein, paper, orange peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter.
2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences, gates, or trees, or cut letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.
3. No person except those in the employ of the, or authorized by the Council, shall bring into any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places any horse vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein closed for plantation or other purposes.
4. All dogs, goats, and all poultry found within the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places shall be destroyed, and the owner shall be liable to make compensation for any damage done.
5. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.
6. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the Council, or by a constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
7. No person except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other vehicle in any of the said parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places.
8. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in any of the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places, and to make a charge for admission thereat.

9. The Council shall have power to let any of the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

10. No charge or fee for admission to such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person, and One shilling for each child under the age of twelve years, unless the Council previously authorize higher charges.

11. No person except the members of the Council, the shire secretary, shire engineer, and employes of the Council on duty shall enter any portion of such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

12. No person unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

13. No person shall carry firearms in or through the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein unless by authority of the Council.

14. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places without the written authority of the Council, and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.

15. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct, interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places.

16. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work any of the Council's employes engaged in the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places by conversation or otherwise.

17. No person shall sell or offer for sale within such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places any article of food or drink or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement without the written permission of the Council.

18. No person shall remain in such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employe of the Council to leave the same.

19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in such parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places.

20. No persons shall assemble in the parks, reserves, lands, grounds, or other places for fetes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

21. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary hereto shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

THE GLENROWAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Glenrowan Waterworks Trust, which has been constituted under the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

1. Each house or tenement must be supplied by a separate service from the Trust's main, and if so required by the Trust the whole service shall be subjected to a test pressure of 200 lbs. to the square inch after it has been laid. The portions of the service pipe laid along or across any public street, lane, or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to wheel traffic, shall be laid not less than 9 inches below the surface. All trenches cut for the purpose of laying service pipes in streets, lanes, or right-of-ways must be properly filled in and made good to the satisfaction of the Trust and Municipal Council or their officers.

2. Any person, whether licensed as hereafter set out or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

4. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

5. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

6. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who without the written permission of the Trust shall take or carry away such water from the premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. No person other than an employé of the Municipal Council shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire plugs. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. For every offence against any provision of this By-law for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

11. In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act, or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice, in writing, addressed to the Secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in this By-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the Chairman of the Trust, the Secretary or the Engineer, who severally shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same at the next following meeting of the Trust for confirmation.

12. No prosecution shall be commenced in connexion with any violation or infringement of this By-law except by the specific direction of the Trust, conveyed by a motion or of the Chairman, such direction in the latter case being in writing.

BY-LAW No. 2.

The following are the rates for 1913 which the occupiers or owners of lands, tenements, or vacant allotments within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect to every such property.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence on municipal valuation shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land fronting a street in which a main shall have been laid shall be Ten shillings.

4. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from a main, one-quarter the before mentioned rate to be paid.

5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per one thousand gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1913.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

DECLARATION.

PROPOSED GOULBURN FLOOD PROTECTION DISTRICT.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Water Acts, I hereby declare that the lands, included in the area defined hereunder, and shown on a plan lodged in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne, ought to be constituted a Flood Protection District.

The area hereinbefore referred to is defined as follows:—

south-easterly through said allotment 1A, along the southern boundary of allotment 15, and through allotments 16 and 16A to the north-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly by the western boundary of a Timber reserve to the existing levee on the left side of Wells Creek; thence generally north-westerly by that levee, along the southern boundary of allotment 16C, through allotments 16B, 16A, and 16, and along the northern boundaries of allotments 16 and 1, all in said section E, parish of Undera, to the western boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north-westerly by the existing levee on the west side of Wells Creek and the Goulburn River, along the northern boundaries of allotments 71, 70, 68, 67, and 66 of the Wyuna Estate, parish of Wyuna, to the western boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by the same levee, through a State Forest, along the northern boundaries of allotments 48, 47, 46, 45, 44, 29, 28, 27, and 26 to a point in line with the western boundary of said allotment 26, all in the said Wyuna Estate, parish of Wyuna; thence northerly by the same levee, generally following the western boundary of a Timber reserve, and through allotments 4A¹ and 3A¹, section 9, to the northern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by a road to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 2B¹, section 8; thence northerly by a line and that boundary to the north-west angle of said allotment 2B¹; thence generally westerly by the northern boundaries of allotments 2B², 1A, and 1 of said section 8, to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence generally westerly by the Goulburn River frontage reserve to the existing levee at the south-east corner of allotment 3, section 2; thence by a line bearing north a distance of nineteen chains; thence north-westerly by a straight line through allotments 3 and 2B to a point in the western boundary of the last-mentioned allotment, distant sixty-three chains from its south-west angle; thence westerly by a straight line through allotments 2A and 1A¹ to a point in the western boundary of the last-mentioned allotment, distant twenty-eight chains from its south-west angle; thence north-westerly by a straight line through allotment 1A² to a point in the western boundary of that allotment, distant thirty-one chains from its south-west angle, all in said section 2; thence north-westerly by a straight line in continuation of the last-described line for a distance of twenty chains into allotment 2, section 1; thence south-westerly by a straight line to the eastern end of the existing levee at the north-west corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-westerly by that levee, and north-westerly by the Goulburn River frontage reserve to the end of the existing levee in allotment 1B of said section 1; thence north-westerly by that levee, generally following the north-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment, the northern boundary of allotment 1A of the same section, all in the parish of Wyuna, and the north-eastern boundary of allotment 168, parish of Kanyapella, through allotment 167 of that parish and a State Forest to the eastern boundary of allotment 166; thence north-easterly by a straight line across a State Forest and the Goulburn River to the point of commencement.

2. Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 20B, parish of Moira; thence southerly, westerly, and southerly by the boundaries of a Timber reserve to a point on the southern side of the road forming the southern boundary of allotment 25 in line with western boundary of that allotment; thence generally north-westerly by a road to an angle therein (opposite the southern boundary of allotment 21) formed by lines bearing respectively N. 13 deg. 37 min. W. one thousand three hundred and nineteen links and S. 74 deg. 41 min. W. nine hundred and twenty-two links; thence north-easterly by the boundary of a Timber reserve to a point in line with the existing levee along the eastern boundary of allotment 21A; thence northerly by a line and northerly and westerly by the said levee generally along the eastern boundaries of allotments 21A and 23 and the northern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 22A; thence northerly by a line and that boundary to the north-west angle of said allotment 22A; thence north-easterly by a straight line to a point in the western boundary of allotment 20, distant twenty chains from the south-west angle of that allotment; thence by a straight line in continuation of the last-described line for a distance of seventeen chains into said allotment 20; thence northerly by a line parallel to the western boundary of said allotment 20 to a point in allotment 19, distant four chains, at right angles, from the centre line of Wallala Creek; thence north-easterly by a line parallel to and four chains distant from the said centre line to the eastern boundary of said allotment 19; thence southerly by a straight line to a point in the southern boundary of said allotment 20, distant seven chains from the south-east angle of that allotment, all in the parish of Moira; thence easterly by the northern boundary of a Timber reserve to the point of commencement.

3. A strip of land eight chains wide, being four chains on either side of the centre line of Deep Creek from its junction with the Murray River, between allotments 11

and 12, section B, parish of Moira, to a line parallel to and ten chains distant (easterly) from the western boundary of allotment 18, section 4, parish of Narioka.

4. A strip of land eight chains wide, in the parish of Moira, being four chains on either side of the centre line of the Wallala Creek from a line in allotment 19a, parallel to and four chains distant from the centre line of Deep Creek, to a line between allotments 11 and 11A, section B, parallel to and four chains distant from the last-mentioned centre line.

The flood protection works for such district wholly or partly constructed before the commencement of the *Flood Protection Act 1911*, No. 2345, consist of about seventy miles of earthen levee banks of varying heights up to about twelve feet along the course of the Goulburn River, within the said district, to confine the waters of the said river, and appurtenant works, all as generally shown on the plan above referred to.

The cost of the flood protection works wholly or partly constructed before the passing of the *Flood Protection Act 1911*, No. 2345, and forming part of the scheme of flood protection works proposed for such district (including land compensation), is approximately £50,000.

The flood protection works proposed to be constructed for such district consist of about fifty-five miles of earthen levee banks of varying heights up to about twelve feet along parts of the courses of the Goulburn and Murray Rivers, and Wells, Deep, Wallala, Yu Yu, and Wakiti Creeks, clearing and excavation to improve the course of the Goulburn River, and appurtenant works, all as generally shown on the plan above referred to.

The estimated cost of the flood protection works proposed to be constructed for such district is £75,000.

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ADDITION TO PORT RULES.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following addition to the Port Rules respecting Explosives within Port Phillip, that is to say:—

PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.

20B. The agent of any ship taking explosives from the Port shall deliver to the Port Officer or the Officer-in-Charge of the Powder Anchorage a notice in writing stating the time at which the ship will arrive in the approved Powder Anchorage to receive the explosives.

The time so stated shall not be later than Three p.m. for quantities of explosives of 25 tons or under, and Noon for quantities of explosives over 25 tons.

The notice shall be given not less than 24 hours prior to the time stated in such notice, or where Government holidays intervene, before Noon on the last day Government offices are open to the public prior to such holidays.

For every hour that the ship's arrival in the Powder Anchorage is delayed, after the time stated in the notice, provided weather conditions are suitable, in the opinion of the Port Officer, for loading explosives, the agent will be charged the following fees:—

Where the quantity of explosives to be loaded is 25 tons or under, Five pounds per hour; and where the quantity to be loaded is more than 25 tons, Ten pounds per hour.

Improvements to the value of at least two instalments of the purchase money must be effected on each farm allotment before the end of the first year from the date of the lease, and 10 per cent. of the purchase money before the end of the third year, and a further 10 per cent. before the end of the sixth year.

The lessee must reside on the estate. (Personal residence by the lessee's wife, or any child not less than eighteen years of age of lessee, may be considered personal residence by the lessee, with the approval of the Commission.) In special cases the Commission has power to allow persons other than those above mentioned to reside for a limited period in lieu of lessee.

The lessee cannot transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of his allotment within the first six years of the lease.

Leases will be subject to a condition providing for resumption of land required for necessary drains or channels through any allotment.

Lessees are not permitted to destroy or remove timber from the land unless by written consent of the Commission.

The amount of deposit (less £1 5s.) will be deducted from the capital value, and the half-yearly instalments calculated on the balance of purchase money.

Payments in advance may be made at any time at the option of the lessee, and proportionate reduction of interest secured thereby.

The balance of purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*, the first of such instalments being payable six months after the date of the lease. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

The Crown grant may be issued to the lessee at the end of any half-year after the first twelve years have expired, on payment of the balance of purchase money, and will be subject to a condition that the owner for the time being of the land, or a member of his family over eighteen years of age, or any person approved by the Governor in Council, shall reside thereon for at least eight months in every year, and that a breach of this condition may lead to the forfeiture of the land to the Crown.

Any person offending against, or not complying with, any provision of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not less than £1 nor more than £50, and the Council may, by notice signed by the secretary, order that any building which is commenced or erected in contravention of these regulations be altered to comply therewith, and may, where deemed advisable, in like manner order that all other operations on such building be discontinued until such first-mentioned order has been complied with to the satisfaction of the Council.
