NOTICE TO MARINERS.—VICTORIA.

[No. 151.]

SAILING DIRECTIONS.—ENTRANCE TO PORT PHILLIP.

THE following additional sailing directions regarding the navigation of the Entrance to Port Phillip is published for general information:—

The fairway at the Entrance to Port Phillip has been deepened to 37 feet for a width of 2,000 feet eastward, and 700 feet westward of the line of leading lights.

With the increased width of channel, mariners may now navigate the fairway with greater safety than heretofore by keeping eastward or westward of the mid-channel course according as they are entering or clearing the Heads, while still conforming to the rule of the road.

On occasions when two or more vessels are being navigated through the fairway in opposite directions, the present practice of keeping near the line of leading lights, whether entering or clearing, is attended with considerable risks in a place where strong tidal currents and swirls prevent vessels being kept on a straight course.

Masters of vessels bound eastward and clearing the Heads are cautioned against leaving the line of leading light, and altering their course to the south-eastward on reaching the line of the Lonsdale Bight Beacons, but should be steered straight out on the line of leading lights until Point Lonsdale is well abaft the beam.

Masters of vessels entering the Heads from the south-eastward should port the helm before reaching the line of leading lights and steer into the eastward of such line or on the starboard side of the channel as previously directed.

During rough seas with high waves vessels may "scend" or dip 8 to 10 feet below the still water level, and extreme caution should be taken by persons in charge of heavy draught vessels outward bound, and the risks of excessive pitching minimised by navigating outward only on the last quarter or slack flood tide.

Except under the most favorable conditions of sea and tide it is considered dangerous to attempt to navigate any ship having a greater draught than 29 feet through the Entrance to Port Phillip.

#### TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST.

##### By-Law No. 42.

A By-law of the Town of Ballarat East, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and section 35 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 42, for prohibiting spitting and expectorating in certain places, and for preventing nuisances and securing the healthfulness of the said Town and its inhabitants.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, and by the *Health Acts*, and of every other power enabling it in this behalf, the Council of the Town of Ballarat East, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Town, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction, order as follows, that is to say :—

1. No person shall spit or expectorate on the footpath of any street or road, or on any pavement, floor, or wall of any place open to or frequented by the public.

2. Any person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

#### SHIRE OF BET BET.

##### By-Law No. 5.

A By-law of the Shire of Bet Bet, numbered 5, made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, and 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, and section 2 of the *Health Act 1900*, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil closet pans, house and yard refuse, and other matter referred to therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890* and the *Local Government Act 1903*, Part VII., the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bet Bet make the following By-law :—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the Shire of Bet Bet, but the Council of the Shire may exempt from the operation of this By-law any premises within the said Shire.

3. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished, and By-law No. 1 of the said Shire in so far as it shall prove inconsistent herewith is hereby repealed.

4. Instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be interchangeable, and one of which shall be provided by and remain the property of the householder, and the other of which shall be provided and owned by the Council.

5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, which shall be provided by the Council, and removed between such hours as the Council may direct in a suitable cart, and the Council shall have power to make a charge on each occupier for each service payable to the nightman. Any amount in default to be recovered in a Court of Petty Sessions by such nightman.

6. A pan cleansed by efficient means, approved by the Council, shall be left in the place of the one removed.

7. Every closet shall consist of a suitable privy building constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient ventilation. The floor of the closet shall at no point be less than three inches above the natural surface of the adjoining ground, and be provided with the requisite means for the application of earth or some deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

8. The night-soil removed shall be rendered inoffensive by being trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the said Council.

9. No occupier or person shall deposit in any closet pan any house or yard rubbish or any other material other than night-soil (except for deodorizing), nor shall they damage such pan or lid in any manner.

10. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper and reasonable supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, or other effectual deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all such night-soil which shall be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a reasonable quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of the pan.

11. Every occupier and every person having the control or management of any premises shall employ the person authorized by the Council for the removal of night-soil, and shall employ or contract for the employment of no other person (except in cases of exemption) for that purpose.

12. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the said Council over all depôts and places of deposit and premises which may be entered upon and inspected by the Council, or its officer or officers, from time to time, or by any person duly authorized by the Council.

13. Every person offending against any one or more of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, or any penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, but the Justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or any part (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

#### SHIRE OF DONALD.

##### By-LAW No. 12.

A By-law of the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Donald, made under the *Health Act 1890*.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power and authority enabling them on this behalf, the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Donald, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Donald, doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

##### INTERPRETATION OF TERMS.

1. In the construction and for the purpose of this By-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or the subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

##### DRAINAGE OF CESSPOOLS.

1. *Contents of Cesspool not to be Emptied on Surface of Ground, &c.*—No privy cesspool shall have connected therewith or attached thereto any pipe or other appliance capable of being used for the purpose of discharging any of the contents of such cesspool upon or under the surface of any adjoining ground or into any drain or sewer.

##### SITUATION OF PRIVIES.

2. *Privies to be Built in Certain Places.*—No person shall place or build, or cause or permit to be placed or built, any privy or earth-closet or any urinal in front of any dwelling, or at a less distance than 4 feet from any public highway, or 36 feet from the door or window of any dwelling, or from any lane or street of a width at any part thereof of 16 feet or upwards, or from any street channel, or at a less distance than 2 feet from any partition fence.

##### CONSTRUCTION OF PRIVIES.

3. *How Privies to be Constructed.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy or earth-closet except of the design, dimensions, and materials, and except it be provided in respect to the middenstead of such closet with a flooring of asphalt, concrete, or other impervious material, as is set forth in one or other of the specifications in the Schedule hereto, except in cases where the Council shall otherwise order or direct.

##### CLOSET DOORS.

4. *Closet Doors.*—No person shall permit any closet door or trap to abut or open upon a street or lane exceeding 16 feet in width.

##### DISINFECTANTS.

5. *Use of Deodorant and Disinfectant.*—The occupier, and every person having the management or control of any house or premises, shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of such suitable deodorant or disinfectant as the Council may from time to time approve of, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorant or disinfectant sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize or disinfect the contents of such pan or receptacle.

(a) *Sand, &c., not to be used.*—No person shall put any sand, earth, lime, or ashes in such pan or receptacle.

##### PENALTY.

6. *Penalty.*—If any person commit a breach of the foregoing By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of £10, and to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; and such penalties, together with all expenses incurred by the Council under this By-law, may be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any



such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in such portions of the Shire of Donald as are defined by the following boundaries:—

**TOWNSHIP OF DONALD.**

Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 4 of section 10, parish of Banyenong, county of Kara Kara; thence west along the southern boundary of the said allotment to the Richardson River; thence north-westerly along the course of that river to the north-west angle of allotment 7 of section 7 in the said parish and county; thence easterly along the said allotment to the north-east angle thereof; thence in a south-easterly direction along the eastern boundaries of allotments 7, 6, and 5 of the section 7 of the said parish, allotments 5 and 4 of section 8 of the same parish to the south-east angle of the allotment 12 of section 9 of the same parish to the point of commencement.

**TOWNSHIP OF WATCHEM.**

Within the township boundaries of Watchem such part of Crown allot. A, parish of Watchem, having a frontage to Camp-street by a depth of 250 feet thereto, such part of allot. 25C, in the same parish, fronting Hoban and Camp streets, by a depth of 250 feet thereto, and the whole of allot. 20, in the parish of Watchem, west of the railway line.

This By-law shall come into force immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

**SCHEDULE.**

*Specifications of Privies.*—Internal dimensions not less than 5 feet by 3 ft. 6 in., and 7 feet high from floor to upper plate or ceiling. Nothing herein contained shall prevent any person from building better finished or more elaborately-fitted privies, provided that in the opinion of the Council due provision has been made for all the requirements of the specifications.

**No. 1.—Privy of Wood.**

Framing of hardwood or any pine or fir timber. All other timber to be of pine or fir, or for the internal fittings any superior joiner's wood. Foundation of not less than six 4-in. x 4-in. redgum or jarrah blocks, 3 inches above the surface of the ground and down to the solid ground; studs and plates 3 inches x 2 inches, mortised and tenoned together; trim for door and opening under seat, at rear; cover exterior of walls with  $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. weatherboards, securely nailed to studs, with at least 1-in. lap butting against 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. angle staves, all wrought; floor joists 4 inches x 2 inches, covered with  $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. grooved and tongued flooring, roof may be either hipped or gabled; rafters 4 inches x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches; hips and ridges 7 inches x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches, covered with corrugated galvanized iron, secured with screws or nails to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. batten, or with slates and galvanized-iron ridging, not less than 14 inches wide; if furnished with gables to have 5-in. x 1-in. barge-boards, and 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. x 1-in. covering board. The door to be not less than 6 feet high by 2 ft. 4 in. wide, 1-in. ledged, hung with 18-in. T hinges and fastened with Norfolk latch and 4-in. bolt, or may be pannelled with butt hinges and proper lock; the door for access to underneath the seat to be not less than 1 ft. 8 in. wide by 1 ft. 5 in. high, 1-in. ledged, hung with 18-in. T hinges, and fitted with 4-in. bolt or stout turned button; the seat to be 1 inch thick, and not less than 18 inches wide and 18 inches high, with 11-in. x 10-in. egg-shaped hole with rounded edge; the front of the hole to be 4 inches from the front or outer face of the riser, the seat to be supported by strong bearers and 1-in. riser. The floor of the space under the whole area of the seat to be made up with concrete or brickwork, rendered on top with cement mortar (one part of Portland cement to two parts of sand); the surface of this floor to be at a level of 1 ft. 4 in. below the upper surface of the seat, the sides of the space for receiving the pan to be enclosed with 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. brickwork laid in mortar not more than 4 inches wider than the pan, or wooden battens may be fixed 6 inches above the cemented floor to serve as guides for the pan in the same position as the above-described brickwork. The seat, door, and walls or guides to be arranged for the reception of the prescribed pan 1 ft. 2 in. high and 1 ft. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  in. diameter, with handles projecting 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches. If the privy be ceiled, there must be a ventilator 6 inches square at or near the highest place of the ceiling opening to the outer air; if a lid be provided for the seat there must be a ventilator of 3-in. iron pipe from under the seat to above the roof of the privy.

**No. 2.—Privy of Brick.**

The foundation may be of stone walling 12 inches wide or brickwork 13 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide, laid in mortar, not less than 3 inches above the surface of the ground and down to the

solid ground; the walls to be of brickwork in lime mortar 9 inches thick; strike the joints of the brickwork on both faces and lime-white the walls inside or plaster the same. The floor, roof, doors, and floor and enclosure or guides under the seat to be as described for the privy of wood, except that the floor joists are to bear 3-in. x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. redgum or jarrah plate, bedded in mortar; and the doors to have solid frames 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches, on axed stone or 3-in. redgum or jarrah sills.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts, and known as the Tallangatta and Cudgewa Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulation following, viz:—

1. First Meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
2. Time and place of meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.
3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least three members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of two members, exclusive of the Chairman.

4. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.

5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.

6. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and be willing to act.

7. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.

8. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

9. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

10. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.

11. Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting of a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any Committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.

12. Order of business of meetings.—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (I.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (II.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

- (iv.) Presentation of reports of Committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

12. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

14. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

15. Notice of motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

16. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

17. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

18. Motion to be moved by member giving notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

19. Mover of motion appointing committee to be a member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

20. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

21. Order, &c., of debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the Chair may proceed with his subject.

22. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

23. No motion to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

24. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

25. Mover of motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

26. Motions, &c., how decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

27. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.

28. Priority of members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.

29. Members to stand while addressing the Trust.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

30. Points of order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

31. Members not to digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

32. Members to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

33. Members called to order to sit down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.

34. Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

35. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

36. Members may demand documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

37. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

38. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

39. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any other order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

40. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

41. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

43. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

44. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.

45. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the

Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

46. No debate shall take place upon petitions.—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.

47. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or Committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.

48. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

49. Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay the Treasurer, or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

50. Appointment, &c., of officers.—No appointment to any office, at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

51. Salaries of officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

52. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

53. Common seal.—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

54. Suspension of rules.—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

55. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

And the Honorable Alfred Arthur Billson, His Majesty's Minister of Railways for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893.

#### THE TALLANGATTA AND CUDGEWA RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION DISTRICT AND THE TALLANGATTA AND CUDGEWA RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS I, Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., by an Order in Council dated the 30th day of June, 1913, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of July, 1913, and in *The Upper Murray and Mitta Mitta Herald* and the *Corryong Courier* newspapers, circulating in such proposed district, announced my intention to constitute, under the provisions of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, the land hereinafter described, a Railway Construction District, under the name, style, or title of the Tallangatta and Cudgewa Railway Construction District: And whereas no petition has been received by me praying that such Railway Construction District be not constituted, and that the line of railway from Tallangatta to Cudgewa, authorized by the *Tallangatta to Cudgewa Railway Construction Act 1912*, be not constructed: Now therefore I, Sir John Michael Fleetwood Fuller, Baronet, Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, hereby by this my Order constitute the lands hereinafter described a Railway Construction District, under the name, style, or title of the Tallangatta and Cudgewa Railway Construction District; and I do hereby constitute a Trust for the said Railway Construction District, consisting of twelve (12) trustees, being the members for the time being of the municipal council of the municipal district of Towong.

The land above referred to:—

Description of the boundaries of land in the shire of Towong, being part of the county of Benambra, and comprising the whole of the parishes of Bungil East, Thologong, Koetong, Burrowye, Walwa, Tintalra, Cudgewa, Jemba, Jingelic, Towong, Colac Colac, Thowla, Wabba, Berringama, Granya, Keelangie, Canabore, Welumla, Adjie, Nariel, Kancobin, Kosciusko, and Corryong, and parts of the parishes of Bungil, Bulloh, Wagra, Wyeboon, and Burrungabuge, included within the foregoing document, which will, in the opinion of the Board, be materially enhanced in value by the construction of the above railway: Commencing at a point on the north boundary of the shire of Towong, being the north-west corner of allotment 3, parish of Bungil; thence south-westerly along the west boundaries of allotments 3 and 3A, easterly along the south boundary of the latter allotment and northerly along part of the east boundary of the same allotment; thence easterly along the south side of a 3-chain road to the north-west corner of allotment 7; thence southerly along the west boundary of allotment 7 to the south-west corner

#### CITY OF BRUNSWICK.

##### REGULATION NO. 24.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick order as follows:—

Service and Wiring Rules Conditions to which the wiring of premises must conform before a supply of electricity can be given and continued.

##### (a) SERVICE RULES.

##### Standard Pressure.

1. Current will be supplied at the standard pressure mentioned on the application form signed by the consumer.

##### Nature of Service.

2. Premises in which the maximum rate of supply at any time does not exceed 3,000 watts, that is, the energy necessary to maintain 50 16-candle power carbon filament lamps or their equivalent, will be supplied through a two-wire service main; premises in which this rate is exceeded will be supplied through a three or four-wire service main, except in the case of motors, which will be supplied from the three "outer" leads of the three-phase system. In all services except the last-mentioned, one of the leads will be "earthed" at the power-house or transformer.

##### Main Cut-outs.

3. The Council will fix, as near as possible to the point of entrance of the service main into the premises, a suitable main cut-out, or cut-outs and meter. The Council will decide as to the most suitable position for both cut-outs and meter.

##### Consumers' Terminals.

4. The consumers' own leads must start at the Council's main fuse, and sufficient length must be left so as to allow of the ends being inserted into the fuse terminals. A loop must be left in each of the leads so as to allow of the same being connected up to the meter.

5. No one but the Council's employés may insert the ends of the leads into the main fuse or meter.

##### Main Switches.

6. The consumer must supply and fix, as near to the meter as possible, and between this and his distributing board, a double pole switch, or, in the case of a three-wire service, two double-pole switches, and they must be capable of being manipulated by means of insulated handles, without removing or opening the covering.

For greater clearness, the following diagrams are given to show the arrangements of two-wire and three-wire services:—

##### Distributing Boards.

7. In the case of a three or four-wire service, the internal wiring shall, nevertheless, be carried out solely on the two-wire system, the circuits being evenly balanced between two or three two-wire main switches, and distributing boards, as the case may be, and placed respectively in each leg of the three or four wire service. Such switches and fuse boards shall be fixed at least 6 feet apart, unless other specially improved arrangements are made, making it impossible under any circumstances for parts at a higher difference of potential between one another than 250 volts to be touched simultaneously.

*Note.*—An exception to the above rule shall be made in the case of theatres, or other buildings with stages, and in installations in which the distributing boards are under the sole control of special attendants.

*Conductors not to be Earthed.*

8. No conductor may be connected to "earth" and the same care shall be used to secure high installation of both conductors.

9. No supply will be given to premises wired on a concentric system using an uninsulated conductor.

*Lamp-holders.*

10. In order to facilitate the system of lamp renewals, all lamp-holders shall be of the bayonet type.

*Wall Plugs for Light and Power Circuits.*

11. Where two circuits are installed, one being supplied through a meter at "lighting" rates, and the other through another meter at "power and heating rates," all wall plugs, connectors, and the like used in connexion therewith, shall be of such different types that it shall not be possible to connect the plug of any portable or other lighting apparatus (a supply to which is chargeable at the "lighting" rate) to any part of the "power and heating" circuit.

*Special Lighting.*

12. Special lighting, such as the lighting of ovens, specially wet factory premises, garden lighting, designs for public illuminations and the like, also all lighting of a temporary nature, should be discussed with the Council's engineer, and his approval must be obtained before the work is connected.

*Regulations for the Supply of Energy to Motors at a Pressure above 250 Volts.*

13. If a motor is to be supplied at a pressure exceeding 250 volts, the following regulations, issued by the Governor in Council, under the provisions of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896*, must be observed:—

(a) The frame and shaft of every electric motor intended to be worked at the pressure specified in this approval shall be connected to earth.

(b) The electric lines forming the connexions to motors or otherwise in connexion with this supply, and placed upon the aforesaid premises of the consumer, shall be, as far as practicable, completely enclosed in strong metal casing, efficiently connected with earth.

*Note.*—By strong metal casing, screwed tubing is understood.

(c) The supply to every motor shall be controlled by means of an efficient cut-off switch, placed in such a position as to be easily handled by the person in charge of the motor, and connected so that by its means all pressure can be cut off from the motor itself, and from any regulating switch, resistance, or other device in connexion therewith.

Efficient fuses or other automatic cut-outs shall also be provided, so as to protect the branch circuit on each side of every motor from excess of current.

The above-mentioned switches and cut-outs shall be so enclosed and protected that there shall be no danger of any shock being obtained in the ordinary handling thereof, or of any fire being caused by their normal or abnormal action.

(d) A notice shall be fixed in a conspicuous position at every motor and switch in connexion with this supply, forbidding unauthorized persons to touch the motors or apparatus.

*Motor Starting Devices.*

14. Motor starting devices shall be so constructed that their manipulation shall not unduly or improperly interfere with the supply to any other consumer.

15. In the case of motors consuming 3,000 watts and under, starting devices must be placed in that conductor which is connected with the Council's main fuse.

16. All switches, resistances, and starting devices must be so enclosed that contact with current carrying parts is impossible, and so constructed that they may be manipulated without opening the case.

*Alternating Current Motors.*

17. Alternating current motors exceeding three brake-horse-power (or absorbing more than three kilowatts), shall be fitted with "wound" rotors, in the circuits of which resistances must be inserted for starting purposes.

Squirrel cage motors must be installed, and the starting arrangements made in such a manner that the current taken on starting up does not exceed twice that taken on normal full load.

*Connexions to Earth.*

18. Where, in these rules, it is provided that a motor or apparatus shall be "earthed," the connexion to earth shall consist of an insulated cable, the size of which shall conform to the table on page 3580.

19. Contacts between the cable and apparatus, earth plates or pipes, shall be well and permanently made, by either soldered joints, or by strong binding screws or clamps. Cables merely twisted round the object they are to be connected to will not be allowed.

*Connexion to Special Apparatus.*

20. The Council will only connect unusual or special apparatus, such as secondary batteries, electric cells, large arc lamps, electric furnaces, welding machines, experimental apparatus, &c., if it is satisfied that by so doing the supply given to other consumers will not be prejudicially affected. Consumers should, therefore, consult the Council before making arrangements to use such apparatus.

(b) WIRING RULES.

1. These rules embody the requirements and precautions framed to secure satisfactory results with a supply of electrical energy at low pressures, not exceeding 250 volts. They are intended to include only such requirements and precautions as are generally necessary, but they are intended neither to take the place of a detailed specification, nor to instruct untrained persons.

For medium pressures exceeding 250 volts, but not exceeding 650 volts, the additional requirements and precautions are set out on pages 30 and 31.

2. Notice of the introduction of wiring should in all cases be given to the fire offices insuring the risk, and their suggestions respecting any details not covered by these rules or any deviations arising from special conditions should be adopted. When the supply is to be obtained from an external source, notice should be given to suppliers before wiring. Any departure from these rules may be authorized only by the written consent of the Committee of the Association, and such departure shall only be regarded as holding good in the particular case for which permission was granted. In special cases, temporary installations, or any work or condition for which permission is not made in these rules, such precautions must be taken as are required by the Inspector.

*Definitions of certain Terms used in these Rules.*

3. *Three-wire System.*—A three-wire system is one in which three conductors are maintained at different potentials, the conductor at a potential intermediate between the highest and lowest being common to all lamps or other consuming devices supplied on either side of the system.

4. *Neutral Conductor.*—The neutral conductor of a three-wire system is the conductor which is at a potential intermediate between the potentials of the outer conductors.

5. *Outer Conductor.*—The outer conductors of a three-wire system are those between which there is the greatest difference of potential.

*Note.*—This specialized use of the word "outer" must not be confused with the non-technical use of the word when applied to the external conductor of a concentric main which physically surrounds the other conductor or conductors of such main.

6. *Earthed Conductor.*—A conductor is said to be earthed when it is connected to the general mass of the earth in such a manner as will insure at all times an immediate and safe discharge of electrical energy.

7. *Uninsulated Conductor.*—A conductor is said to be uninsulated when, although not earthed, no provision is made by the interposition of a dielectric or otherwise for its insulation from earth.

8. *Bunching of Conductors.*—Conductors are said to be bunched when more than one is contained within a single duct or groove.

9. *Single-pole Switches.*—Single-pole switches are switches interrupting one conductor only of a circuit.

10. *Linked Switches.*—Linked switches are single-pole switches fixed on conductors of different polarity linked together mechanically so as to operate simultaneously.

11. *Dielectric.*—A dielectric is any material which by its nature or the method of its application to a conductor permanently offers high resistance to the passage of current and of disruptive discharge through itself.

12. *Grade of Insulation.*—A cable is said to be of I.F.F. 600 or 2,500 megohm grade when its minimum insulation is that shown in cols. 5 and 6 respectively of the table when tested at 60 deg. F. (15.6 deg. C.) after one minute's electrification and 24 hours' immersion in water.

13. *Ventilated Motors.*—A ventilated motor is one in which, while ventilation is provided for, access to the armature, field coils, and other live parts is only to be obtained by opening a door in, or removing a part of, the enclosing case.

14. *Totally Enclosed Motors.*—A totally enclosed motor is one in which all the live parts, whether insulated or not, are totally enclosed, as in paragraph 13, but without provision for internal ventilation.

*General Arrangement.*

15. Every system must be protected by linked main switches and main fuses, or linked switch fuses, under the control of the consumer, and these must be easily accessible, and placed as near the generator or the entry of supply as circumstances permit.

16. When one of the main conductors of a system of supply is earthed, no interruption of the current is permitted in a conductor connected to the earthed main, unless a simultaneous break is effected on the non-earthed conductor. Hence, to insure the current being interrupted simultaneously on both the earthed and the non-earthed wires, no switch or switch fuse that is not linked to another switch or switch fuse on the non-earthed conductor may be inserted in any conductor connected to an earthed main.

17. No fuse may be placed in the neutral conductor of a three-wire or other multiple-wire system, but fuses must be placed on both conductors of two-wire circuits branching therefrom. This does not prevent the use of a disconnecting link in the neutral conductor for testing purposes.

18. When the wiring is such that one conductor is uninsulated at all points—such as a bare return to a concentric system—no switch or fuse may be placed in that conductor, and the said conductor must be efficiently earthed.

19. When the pressure between the outer conductors of a three-wire system exceeds 250 volts, and the three wires of the system or two pairs of wires are brought into premises, the supply shall be given to two pairs of terminals arranged so as to minimize the danger of shock, and the wiring from these terminals shall be kept distinct throughout, and so arranged that a person cannot simultaneously touch two points respectively in contact with the outer conductors. In the case of other multiple wire systems, similar principles shall be applied.

20. When energy is taken from all the conductors of a two-phase or a three-phase system, the conductors must be protected, either by an automatic triple-pole circuit-breaker, or by a fuse on each pole in conjunction with a triple-linked switch, or by three switch fuses.

21. Conductors must radiate from distributing centres, and in large systems from those centres to sub-centres, so that no main sub-circuit carries more than 5 amperes up to 125 volts, or more than 3 amperes from 125 to 250 volts, for incandescent lighting. The sub-circuits for small heaters must not carry more than 15 amperes up to 125 volts, or more than 10 amperes from 125 to 250 volts, and they must be protected by a fuse on each pole. Heaters and apparatus exceeding the 10-ampere limit must comply with paragraph 92 (e) (1) and (2).

22. Every sub-circuit must be protected on each pole by a fuse (para. 18).

23. When protected from mechanical injury by metal tubes or conduits (para. 46 (a)), conductors of opposite polarity may be bunched, and when carrying small currents for incandescent lighting, from sub-centres, as in paragraph 21, they may also, if without joints, be bunched when the projecting tubing or casing is non-metallic. If the supply is alternating and the protection metallic, the lead and return conductors must be bunched.

24. Where metallic sheathing or tubing is used it must be electrically and mechanically continuous and connected to earth. The conductor (earth wire) used for the purpose of earthing must be of copper and of a sectional area not less than that of No. 14 S.W.G.

25. There must be no contact between conductors (or their insulating material, metallic sheathing or tubing) and gas pipes. Non-conducting distance pieces must be used where necessary.

26. Gas pipes must never be used to obtain an earth connexion.

27. Where concentric wiring with an uninsulated external conductor is used, this system of wiring must be employed throughout, except for fittings and pendant flexibles.

28. When the mains are earthed at one point, the external conductor of a concentric system is the conductor to be connected to the earth main.

29. In places where inflammable or explosive dust, gases, or vapours are liable to be present, dynamos, arc lamps, Nernst lamps, and connectors must not be used. In such situations, incandescent lamps must, with their holders, be enclosed in air-tight fittings of thick glass; switches, fuses, and resistances must be enclosed in gas-tight boxes, or break under oil; and motors, with their live parts, starters, terminals, and connexions, must be completely enclosed (para. 92 (d)), in flame-tight enclosures made of unflammable material.

30. Except where completely enclosed in a metallic casing, no switch, ceiling-rose, cut-out, connector, or other electrical accessory may be mounted directly upon any surface of a condensing or humid nature, such as masonry or brickwork, but must in addition to its own mount, be fixed upon a base block rendered impervious to moisture.

*Conductors—Size and Conductivity.*

31. Excepting for wiring fittings, the sectional area (see table) of any copper conductor must not be less than that of No. 18 S.W.G. It must be assumed that at least 60 watts may be consumed at any point (para. 98).

32. The size of conductors within a building, will, subject to paragraphs 31 and 35, be determined by the permissible drop in volts, which should not exceed 2 per cent. on lighting circuits.

33. Covered copper conductors should be of soft copper, and should have a conductivity not less than that of the I.S.C. standard (para. 114); where sulphur compounds are present in any part of the insulating material, the copper in contact with the insulating material must be protected therefrom by tinning or otherwise.

34. All covered copper conductors having a greater area than that of a No. 14 S.W.G. wire must be stranded.

35. The table appended shows the sizes of copper conductors which will safely carry currents up to 750 amperes, and the length in yards of single conductor in circuit for each volt of fall of potential when the maximum continuous current is in use.

*Conductors—Insulation.*

36. Conductors, except as provided in paragraph 53, must be specially insulated with material which does not deteriorate at the highest temperature to which it will be subjected; for instance, rubber must not be allowed to exceed 130 deg. F. (54.4 deg. C.), and paper or fibre must not be allowed to exceed 176 degrees F. (80 deg. C.).

37. The insulating material on any conductor other than a flexible must be throughout either—

A.—A dielectric, such as vulcanized rubber of the best quality, which is impervious to moisture, and only needs mechanical protection (para. 46). ("Dielectric" does not include braiding or taping.)

Or—

B.—A dielectric, such as paper or fibre, which must be kept perfectly dry, and therefore needs to be encased in a waterproof sheath, generally of soft metal, such as lead, drawn closely over the dielectric.

38. The radial thickness of vulcanized rubber must be not less than that given in columns 9 and 10 of the table, or in proportion thereto. The radial thickness of dielectrics of Class B must be not less than that given in column 11 of the table. The dielectric must not soften sufficiently to allow decentralization at a lower temperature than 176 deg. F. (80 deg. C.).

39. The dielectric must be such that when the insulated conductor has been immersed in water for twenty-four hours it will, while still immersed, withstand 2,000 volts for half-an-hour between the conductors or between the conductor and the water, the test pressure being applied with alternating current at a frequency of 50, the E.M.F. curve being as nearly as possible a sine wave.

40. The minimum insulation resistance must be that given in columns 5 and 6 of the table for vulcanized rubber, and that in column 7 for Class B, the test being made at 60 deg. F. (15.6 deg. C.), after one minute's electrification at 500 volts, and after the insulated conductor has been immersed in water for the twenty-four hours immediately preceding the test.

41. The insulation resistance between the members of twin-conductors must not be lower than the corresponding insulation resistances in the table.

42. Conductors insulated, as in Class A, must be taped and braided if drawn into conduits, and at least taped if laid in casing.

43. Concentric conductors (paras. 18, 27, and 28) should in all respects conform to the requirements laid down for single conductors; the insulation resistance of the dielectric separating the two conductors must be that given in the table for single conductors having the same diameter as the inner conductor. The insulation resistance of the dielectric on the external conductor, where insulated, must be that given in the table for single conductors having the same diameter as the outside diameter of the external conductor.

*Conductors—Flexible.*

44. Flexibles must be of a sectional area not less than that equivalent to No. 22 S.W.G. (1), and they must be made up of wires twisted together on a short lay, the sectional area of each wire being not greater than that of No. 36 S.W.G. The insulating material used as the dielectric must be pure rubber equal to washed Para

(1) The following have a sectional area equivalent to No. 22 S.W.G.: 24/40, 22/38, 14/36.

rubber of the best quality, or vulcanized rubber of the best quality. Pure rubber insulation is best suited for flexibles intended for use with pendants. Pure rubber must be laid on in two layers, care being taken that each layer overlaps, and the radial thickness of the dielectric must not be less than 20 mils. Each coil of pure rubber flexible must be tested for fifteen minutes with a pressure of 1,500 volts alternating between the conductors at a frequency of 50. Vulcanized rubber flexible must be insulated with one layer of pure rubber and two layers of vulcanized rubber, and the radial thickness of the dielectric must not be less than 34 mils. Each coil of vulcanized rubber flexible must be tested for fifteen minutes with a pressure of 1,500 volts alternating at a frequency of 50, after twenty-four hours' immersion in water, and while still immersed. When sulphur is present, the insulating material must not be in direct contact with the copper wires.

45. Flexibles (paras. 25, 52, 76, and 77) may be used only for attaching to pendant or portable appliances, or for sub-circuits under the conditions of paragraph 46 (c). They must not be used in any position out of sight, except where passing directly through walls, when they must be protected by incombustible watertight conduits. They must not pass through floors. Where twin flexible cord conductors are in a position where they are likely to receive mechanical injury, or are specially exposed to the action of flies or other insects (such as in butchers' or confectioners' shops, &c.), they must have additional protection to the satisfaction of the Inspector. Unless specially allowed, flexible cord pendant lights must hang direct from a ceiling rose or other designed support. The connexion between flexibles and hard wires may only be effected by means of screw-down terminals in junction boxes or ceiling roses, and where flexibles from fittings must pass into a ceiling they must be enclosed in conduits up to a metal junction box.

#### Conductors—Fixing and Supporting.

46. Conductors (excepting flexibles) insulated as in Classes A and B (para. 37):—

(a) May be enclosed in steel conduits with details and accessories complying with the British Standard Specification for "Steel Conduits for Electrical Wiring," or in brass or copper conduits; but all conduit systems must be electrically and mechanically continuous throughout, have all outlets bushed to prevent abrasion, and be connected to earth (paras. 25 and 26). In dry places isolated single lengths of tubing need not be earthed if adequately enamelled, or otherwise insulated, externally. In damp places the conduit system must be watertight. Conduits must be efficiently drained if liable to internal condensation. Sharp bends or elbows are prohibited, but inspection elbows are permissible.

(b) May be enclosed in wood casing in dry places where not buried in plaster or cement nor exposed to moisture. Unless efficiently protected from drip, wood casing must not be fixed immediately below, and in no case must touch water-pipes. Conductors carrying more than five amperes must be laid singly in separate grooves. Wood casing shall be such, that the width of the fillet between the grooves shall be at least  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch, and the thickness of the outside shell at least  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch. Capping to be screwed.

(c) May be without mechanical protection (*i.e.*, without conduit, armouring, &c.), where not exposed to injury, and fixed in plain sight, but they must be supported in such a manner as to secure the permanent spacing of the conductors from walls, ceilings, and all structural metal work and metal piping. When carrying more than five amperes they must also be spaced from each other unless they are of the multiple core. Such spacing is not, however, necessary if the conductors are lead-covered (para. 25). When conductors are attached to the exterior of a building, insulators of approved pattern must be used. Permission must be obtained for the running of wires over, or in close proximity to, buildings; and in all such cases special precautions must be taken to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

(d) May be enclosed in paper-insulated, metal-sheathed conduit, only when such conduit, unless nail-proof, is in side buildings and on the surface, and in plain sight throughout its entire length.

47. Unenclosed lead-covered conductors must be supported on a continuous wood fillet, or fastened by broad clips, which, in damp places, must be of lead.

48. Conductors, where exposed to injury (*e.g.*, where passing out of floors), must be specially protected by stout conduits or boxing, and where passing through walls, partitions, or ceilings, they must be enclosed in porcelain or other protecting conduits.

49. Conductors passing through outside walls, party walls, or fire-resisting floors, must be provided with special protection, such as a close-fitting porcelain or other incombustible tube, to prevent the spread of fire through the openings. When the end of the tube is outside the building, it must be of porcelain, bell-mouthed or bushed, and turned downwards.

50. Conductors buried in plaster must be enclosed in steel conduit in accordance with Rule 46 (a).

51. Wooden casing will not be permitted in lift wells. All fixed conductors must be placed in metallic tubing, and movable conductors, *i.e.*, those running to lift, to be placed in approved flexible tubing.

52. Metal staples must not be used for fixing unarmoured conductors.

#### Conductors—Bare.

53. Bare conductors without any insulating covering may be used indoors—

(a) As collector wires for travelling cranes and similar appliances, but they must be so supported upon insulators as to prevent contact between the conductors themselves, or between the conductors and the walls or the structural or other metal work, should a collector wire be displaced from any insulator. The insulation at each straining point (*i.e.*, at the end of each wire) must consist of two strain insulators placed in series. The current must be under complete control by means of a switch and a fuse, or a switch fuse, in each supply conductor. Lightning arresters must be fitted if the bare wiring extends to an exposed position in the open.

(b) As trolley wires for locomotives, jib cranes, and similar appliances, but they must be insulated by means of two strain insulators placed in series between each wire and "earth" at their points of support. Wall rosettes or brackets used as supports for span wires should not be fixed within one foot of any gas pipe. Controlling switches and fuses, or switch-fuses, and lightning arresters must be provided as under (a).

(c) As battery connexions, but such conductors must be well spaced from each other and from all structural or other metal work, and be rigidly supported on insulators.

(d) For other purposes, under special circumstances and in positions inaccessible to unauthorized persons, but permission for such use must be previously obtained from the fire offices insuring the risk.

#### Joints and Connexions.

54. Joints constitute a source of weakness, and should be avoided whenever possible.

55. Joints, when unavoidable, must be accessible, and they must be mechanically and electrically perfect, to prevent heat being generated. All joints must be soldered. Soldering fluids containing acid or other corrosive substances must not be used.

When junction boxes are used, they must be so constructed that—

(a) The conductors cannot be readily short-circuited.

(b) The insulation between opposite poles is rigid and durable.

(c) The connexions do not heat.

(d) If used in damp places, the moisture is excluded by suitable means.

56. In jointing conductors, the braid, tape, or lead must be carefully removed without damage to the dielectric, and for a sufficient length to insure a thorough union between the dielectric and the material used to insulate the joint. If the insulating material is not waterproof it must be covered with an impervious sleeve or box, which must make a watertight joint on each side of the junction. Care must be taken to exclude moisture during the operation.

57. Looping must be employed to avoid joints on small conductors.

58. Where conductors are connected to switches, fuses, junction boxes, or other appliances, the whole of the separate wires forming the stranded or flexible conductor must be contained within the terminal. The dielectric must not be bared back further than to allow the conductor to enter the terminals properly, and the ends of the insulation Class V. should be sealed.

59. With dielectrics of Class B, the exposed ends of conductors where they enter the terminals of switches, fuses, and other appliances, must be protected from moisture which might creep along the insulating material within the waterproof sheath.

60. Where conductors enter the terminals of switches, fuses, and other appliances, the braid, lead, or other covering must be cut back from the end of the dielectric, which must be waterproof. In damp places the strands of conductors of Class B should be soldered to prevent moisture creeping along the copper beneath the insulating material.

61. Conductors of larger sectional area than that of No. 14 S.W.G. must be soldered to proper lugs for connection. Where there is any possibility of stress on the lugs, the conductors must be secured, in addition to the soldering, by some mechanical device, such as one or more grub-screws.

#### Switch and Distribution Boards.

62. Main and distribution switch and fuse boards must be fixed in a dry situation, and be so arranged that a fire thereon cannot spread, whether occurring at the back or front. Their bases must be of incombustible and insulating material, with moisture-proof bushes fitted at the points of support if the material is hygroscopic. The possibility of a permanent arc must be prevented either by sufficient spacing of all live parts or by the use of separating partitions. Where switch and distribution boards are placed on or within 6 inches of a wooden wall or 18 inches of a wooden ceiling, a thickness of some hard insulating fire-resisting material, such as a composition of asbestos or other mineral ingredient, is to be placed between such switch and distribution board and such wall or ceiling, and extending at least 6 inches beyond the board all around. Wires, &c., going through this material should fit as tightly as possible the holes through which they pass.

63. Connections at the back of main boards must be accessible, symmetrically placed, and spaced apart, and unless protected from acid fumes, must not project into battery rooms.

64. Switchboard circuits should be labelled for identification.

65. No open-type fuses may be placed at the back of switchboards.

66. The cases of instruments, if metallic, must be insulated from the circuits.

67. Every voltmeter or pilot lamp, with its connecting wires, must be protected by a fuse on each pole.

68. Combination switch and fuse boxes must be so arranged that it is possible to operate a switch without uncovering the fuses, if of the open type.

69. When fuses are of the open type and grouped together, the case of the distribution board will be sufficient protection from the fused metal provided the distance from cover to fuse exceeds 1 inch with glass-fronted cases. If made of wood the case must be protected with fire-resisting material, and a clearance of  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches should be provided.

#### Switches.

70. Switches (paras. 29 and 30), whether fixed separately or combined with lamp-holders or fittings, must comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) Overheating must not take place at the point of contact or elsewhere, when the full current flows continuously.
- (b) They must be incapable of forming a permanent arc when breaking circuit. Switches should be tested with pressure and currents 50 per cent. in excess of those which will be used on the circuits for which they are intended.
- (c) The bases must be of incombustible, non-conducting and moisture-proof material.
- (d) Unless placed in an engine-room or in a compartment specially arranged for the purpose, switches must have their live parts covered. The covers must be of incombustible material, and must be either non-conducting or of rigid metal, and clear of all internal mechanism. For more than five amperes, at pressures over 125 volts, metal covers must be lined with insulating material.
- (e) Switches in position liable to injury, or contact with goods, should be further protected by an open-fronted box or other suitable guard.
- (f) Handles must be insulated and so arranged that the hand cannot touch live metal or be injured through an adjacent fuse blowing.

#### Fuses.

71. Fuses (paras. 29, 30, and 69) must comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) No overheating of any part must take place when the full current flows continuously.
- (b) They shall effectually interrupt the current when a short circuit occurs, and also when the current through them exceeds the working rate by 200 per cent., the current flowing under the normal pressure, but they must be so proportioned to the current to be carried that no conductor protected by them can be raised in temperature above that specified in paragraph 36.
- (c) The terminals must be so spaced apart or screened that an arc cannot be maintained when the fuse is blown.
- (d) The bases must be of incombustible, non-conducting, and moisture-proof material.
- (e) Unless placed in an engine-room or in a compartment specially arranged for the purpose, fuses must have covers to retain the fused metal. The covers must be of incombustible material and must either be of non-conducting or of

rigid metal lined with insulating incombustible material, and clear of all live parts. Small, close-fitting covers should be perforated for ventilation.

(f) Fuses must not be placed in wall-sockets, ceiling-roses, lamp-holders, or connectors.

(g) Separate single fuses, and not double pole fuses, must be used on circuits where the pressure exceeds 125 volts.

72. Branch fuses must be grouped together in accessible positions in sight, and should be symmetrically placed and labelled for each circuit.

73. *Note.*—Hard metal is recommended for fuses. Soft metal fuses should be soldered to hard metal contact pieces. As a practical guide, fuses may be considered too large if they are not perceptibly warm to the touch when carrying full load, and too small if they hiss when moistened. Precautions against shock must be taken when applying this test.

#### Connectors.

74. Connectors (paras. 29 and 30) must be capable of withstanding a test with pressure and current 50 per cent. in excess of those for which they are intended. Fixed connectors must have incombustible bases, and in damp places special watertight connectors must be used. Where the fixed part of a connector is attached to a floor, it must be so arranged that no dust or water can accumulate, that all contacts are well below the floor level, and that any possibility of danger from contact of live metal with carpets is avoided. Provision should be made to facilitate inspection.

75. Connectors must be constructed so that they cannot be readily short circuited. Clearances should be such that an arc cannot be started if the connector is pulled out while the current is flowing.

76. Flexibles for portable fittings must end in a connector.

77. Every connector or group of connectors must be independently controlled by a switch on the live side of the connector. To avoid leaving the flexibles live, it is preferable that the portable fittings themselves should not be provided with switches.

#### Ceiling Roses.

78. Ceiling roses (para. 30) must comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) The bases must be of incombustible, non-conducting, and moisture-proof material.
- (b) The covers must be of incombustible material, and must be either non-conducting or of rigid metal clear of all live parts.
- (c) The terminals must be relieved of the direct pull of the attached conductor and fitting, and be so arranged that no short circuit can take place.
- (d) They must not be used for attachment to more than two pairs of flexibles, unless specially designed for multiple pendants.

#### Fittings for Supporting Lamps.

79. Wherever brackets, electroliers, or standards require to have conductors threaded through tubes or channels formed in the metal work, these must be of ample size and have no sharp angles or projecting edges, which would be liable to damage the insulating material, and the open ends should, where possible, be bushed. In cases where lamps or fittings are suspended by means of flexible conductors, suitable cord grips must be used, which will take all weight off the terminals of the fitting, and which at the same time will not tend to chafe the insulation of the conductors or to press the cores of the conductors into contact with one another through the insulation.

80. Where possible, the conductors should be carried without joints through the fittings to the lamps; but where connections at the fitting are unavoidable, special care must be taken to make the joints equal in conductivity and insulation to the rest of the work (par. 45).

81. Combined gas and electric fittings must not be used.

82. If disused gas fittings are adapted for electric light they must be entirely disconnected from the gas pipes.

#### Lamp-holders.

83. Lamp-holders (paras. 29 and 87) must—

- (a) Be incombustible.
- (b) Be specially designed if for currents above one and a half amperes.
- (c) Not be hung from flexibles exposed to the weather.
- (d) Not contain a switch if for pressures above 250 volts.

84. Switch lamp-holders must be controlled in groups of not more than twelve by a wall switch.

#### Arc Lamps.

85. Arc lamps (par. 29) must—

- (a) Be guarded by lanterns or globes arranged to intercept falling particles of carbon.

*Note.*—Lanterns or globes may be dispensed with where an open arc is essential, as in photography, and where no combustible material is present, as in a foundry; but the flooring immediately under the lamp, if of a combustible nature, must be protected from falling particles of carbon. Open inverted arc lamps, in the presence of combustible

matter, must have metal reflectors rigidly attached beneath the arc, which at all times must be below the level of the upper edge of the reflector. The reflector must project at least 15 inches measured horizontally beyond the arc on all sides.

- (b) Be insulated from their support.
- (c) Be fixed so that their cases cannot come into contact with any metallic object.
- (d) Have their leading-in wires protected from rain.
- (e) Be controlled by linked switches and protected by a fuse on each pole.
- (f) Where arc lamps are suspended from pulleys and are lowered for the purpose of carboning, cleaning, &c., stranded conductors must be used for the leads if such leads go direct to the lamp.

#### *Incandescent Lamps.*

86. Incandescent lamps must—

- (a) Not be placed in close proximity to combustible materials unless specially protected. Shades made of combustible materials must be kept free from contact with the lamps and their holders by suitable guards or supports. Celluloid or similar materials must not be used for shades and candle tubes.
- (b) Be fitted with guards if placed in positions where goods are liable to be stacked in contact with them.
- (c) With their holders be enclosed in air-tight fittings of thick glass, if placed in positions where they are exposed to inflammable vapour or gas, or to excessive dust or flyings, as in dust-rooms and in raising-rooms.

87. Lamp caps of which the insulating material is hygroscopic must not be used in damp places unless the lamp-holder is insulated from its support.

88. Lamps of the Nernst type must comply with the requirements of paragraphs 29, 85 (a), (b), (c), (d), and 86.

#### *Heaters.*

89. Heaters (pars. 21 and 83 (b)) must be—

- (a) So constructed and mounted that their supports and connexions cannot become overheated, precautions being taken with regard to their surroundings, as in the case of non-electrical heating appliances. They must not be placed in close proximity to combustible materials unless suitably protected.
- (b) Independently controlled by a switch on the live side of the connector, the connectors being so arranged that the live end of the coupling is not exposed to accidental short-circuiting or injury.
- (c) Must conform to rules 89 (a) and (b), and, in addition, every electric iron must have a lamp or other approved device so connected as to indicate at all times when current is on the iron.

90. Radiator circuits must be protected by a fuse on each pole and by a wall switch in each room.

#### *Resistances, Choking Coils, and Alternating-current Transformers.*

- 91. The live parts (par. 29) of the above must be—
  - (a) Carried on frames or supports, and enclosed in cases. These frames, supports, and cases must be of incombustible material efficiently insulated from the conductors.
  - (b) Amply ventilated. Where there is danger of inflammable dust or flyings entering, apertures in the cases must be protected by fine mesh wire gauze or by finely-perforated sheet metal.
  - (c) So proportioned that their cases cannot attain a temperature exceeding 176 deg. F. (80 deg. C.).
  - (d) So fixed that no unprotected combustible material is within 6 inches of the frames or cases containing them, or within 24 inches measured vertically above them.

#### *Motors.*

92. Motors (par. 29) rated at more than one-third of a horse-power must comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) They must be protected from damp, dust, and mechanical injury.
- (b) They must be so placed that no unprotected woodwork or combustible material be within a distance of 12 inches from them, measured horizontally, or within 4 feet, measured vertically, above them, unless they are of a totally enclosed type (par. 14).
- (c) When mounted upon wood flooring, unless of the totally closed or ventilated type (par. 13), they must have a sheet of metal inserted between them and such flooring. If elevated over wood flooring they must either rest upon a metal plate or have a metal plate suspended immediately below them.

- (d) In positions exposed to inflammable dust or flyings, or where combustible materials are manipulated or stored, they must be either of the totally enclosed or of the ventilated type, provided that any ventilated openings in the cases of continuous current machines are protected by fine-mesh wire gauze or by finely-perforated sheet metal, and that all slip-rings, commutators, and brushes are totally enclosed. Inspection openings fitted with plate-glass or fine-mesh wire gauze are allowed. Induction motors may have unprotected ventilating holes in their metal cases, but slip-rings, or brushes, or any sliding contacts must be completely enclosed in metal cases.
- (e) They must be controlled by a switch and a fuse, a hand-grip fuse, or by a circuit-breaker, on one conductor; and by one of these devices on the other conductor (pars. 16 and 18).
- (f) The starting gear of a continuous current motor must consist of a regulating switch and a series resistance, fitted with a no-volt release (par. 70 (d)).
- (g) The shunt circuit of any motor must be so connected that the field is excited before the armature circuit is completed.
- (h) Every alternating current motor must be provided with a suitable starting device and with a no-volt release. Large motors should have linked circuit breakers on the conductors.

#### *Dynamos.*

93. Dynamos (par. 29) must comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) They must not be placed in positions exposed to inflammable dust or flyings, nor where combustible materials are manipulated or stored.
- (b) They must be protected from damp, dust, and mechanical injury.
- (c) They must be so placed that no unprotected woodwork or other combustible material be within a distance of 12 inches from them, measured horizontally, or within 4 feet, measured vertically, above them.
- (d) When mounted upon or above wood flooring, they must have a sheet of metal inserted between them and such flooring.
- (e) They must be controlled by a switch and a fuse, or by a circuit-breaker on one conductor, and by one of these devices on the other conductor (par. 18).

#### *Accumulators and other Batteries.*

94. The room in which accumulators or primary batteries are placed must be well ventilated (par. 29).

95. The case of each cell must stand on insulators. Glass cells should have an intermediate support to distribute the strain.

96. Bare conductors (par. 53 (c)) should be used for end and regulating cell connexions.

97. The method of control must be as described in paragraph 92 (e).

#### *Testing.*

98. The insulation resistance to earth of the whole or any part of the wiring must, when tested previously to the erection of fittings and electroliers, be measured with a pressure not less than twice the intended working pressure, and must not be less in megohms than 30 divided by the number of points (par. 31) under test. For this purpose the points are to be counted as the number of pairs of terminal wires from which it is proposed to take the current, either directly or by flexibles, to lamps or other appliances.

99. Current must not be switched on until the following test has been applied to finished work:—

The whole of the lamps having been connected to the conductors, and all switches and fuses being on, a pressure equal to twice the working pressure must be applied, and the insulation resistance of the whole or any part of the installation must not be less in megohms than 25 divided by the number of lamps. When all lamps and appliances have been removed from the circuit, the insulation resistance between conductors must not be less than 25 megohms divided by the number of lamps. The insulation of any individual sub-circuit (par. 21) must not fall below 1 megohm. Any motor, heater, arc lamp, or other appliance may be connected to the supply of electrical energy provided that the insulation of the parts carrying the current measured as above is greater than 1 megohm from the frame or case.

100. The value of systematically inspecting and testing apparatus and circuits cannot be too strongly urged. Records should be kept of all tests, so that any gradual deterioration of the system may be detected. Cleanliness of all parts of the apparatus and fittings is essential. All dead or disused wires and fittings which do not conform to these rules must be removed from a building where possible.



101. Before making any repairs or alterations, the circuits which are being attended to must be entirely disconnected from the supply.

Table.

102. Columns 1 and 15 give the size of the conductors in common use. Cables are shown thus:—19/16, viz., nineteen wires of No. 16 standard wire gauge, or 19/.082 inch, meaning nineteen wires, each of which is .082 inch in diameter.

103. Column 2 gives the maximum current permissible in conductors laid in casing or tubing, providing the external temperature does not exceed 100 deg. F. (37.8 deg. C). The maximum current for any conductor may be calculated from the formula—

$$\text{Log } C = 0.84 \log A + 0.415,$$

$$\text{or } C = 2.6 A^{0.82}$$

(Where C = current in amperes.

and A = sectional area in 1000ths of a square inch).

104. Column 3 gives the approximate current density in amperes per square inch corresponding to column 2.

105. Column 4 gives the total length in yards of the conductor in circuit (lead and return) for one volt drop when the current in each conductor is that given in column 2.

106. Columns 5 and 6 give the minimum insulation resistance (par. 40) with vulcanized rubber in megohms per mile. Their insulation resistances are those of cables I.E.C. 600 and 2,500 megohm grades respectively.

107. Column 7 gives the minimum insulation resistance (par. 40) which is advisable in practice for fibre-covered cables lead-covered.

108. Column 8 gives the resistance of the conductor per 1,000 yards in Board of Trade standard ohms.

109. Columns 9 and 10 give the minimum thickness of dielectric of Class A, as defined in paragraph 38.

110. Column 11 gives the minimum thickness of dielectric of Class B, as defined in paragraph 38. Special cables, such as twin or three-core cables, are not included in this column.

111. Column 12 gives the minimum thickness of lead for cables of Class B. This column does not apply to vulcanized-rubber cables which may be lead covered.

112. Column 13 gives the weight of copper conductors of the gauge given in lbs. per 1,000 yards.

113. Column 14 gives the nominal section of the conductor in square inches.

114. The data for the resistance and weights of copper conductors are based on the E.S.C. standard as defined by the Engineering Standards Committee, as follows:—

A wire, 1 metre long, weighing 1 gramme, and having a resistance of 0.1539 standard ohms at 60 deg. F. (15.6 deg. C) is taken as the Engineering Standards Committee (E.S.C.) standard for hard-drawn high conductivity commercial copper.

Hard-drawn copper is defined as that which will not elongate more than 1 per cent. without fracture. A wire 1 metre long weighing 1 gramme and having a resistance of 1.508 standard ohms at 60 deg. F. (15.6 deg. C) is taken as the Engineering Standards Committee (E.S.C.) standard for annealed high conductivity commercial copper.

Copper is taken as weighing .555 lbs. per cubic foot (8.89 grammes per cubic centimetre) at 60 deg. F. (15.6 deg. C.) which gives a specific gravity of 8.90. An average temperature coefficient of 0.00238 per degree F. (0.00428 per degree C.), is adopted.

A variation of 2 per cent. from the adopted standard of resistance is allowed in all conductors. A variation of 2 per cent. from the adopted standard of weight is allowed in all conductors.

An allowance of 1 per cent. increased resistance as calculated from the diameter, is allowed on all tinned copper conductors between diameters 0.104 and 0.028 (Nos. 12 and 22 S.W.G.) inclusive.

For the purpose of calculation of tables, a lay, involving an increase of 2 per cent. in each wire, except the centre wire, for the total length of the cable, is taken as the standard.

The legal standard wire gauge, as fixed by Order in Council dated 23rd August, 1883, is adopted as the standard for all wires.

Extracts from British Standard Specification for Steel Conduits for Electrical Wiring, 46A.

1. Steel conduit for electrical wiring shall be either close joint, brazed, welded, or solid drawn. They shall be of mild steel, free from burrs, flaws, or other defects. They and their accessories, when these are made of steel or iron, shall be stove enamelled or galvanized inside and out by an approved process.

2. Two classes of steel conduit for electrical wiring are recognised as standard—

(a) PLAIN.

(b) SCREWED.

Class (a) consists of light-gauge conduit of the thickness and dimensions given in the annexed table.

The socket joining the lengths of tubing is a

sleeve, and neither the ends of the conduit nor the socket are screwed.

Class (b) consists of heavy-gauge conduit of the thickness and dimensions given in the annexed table. Both ends of the conduit are screwed with the Whitworth form of thread.

The couplers are also screwed inside throughout their entire length with a right-handed thread of Whitworth form, but having the number of threads per inch given in the annexed table. The screwed portions of both conduits and couplers are not enamelled.

3. Both classes of conduit shall be manufactured to the respective outside diameters given in the annexed table.

4. Both classes of conduit shall be manufactured in straight lengths of 10, 12, or 14 feet.

5. Both classes of conduit and accessories shall be manufactured to the respective thicknesses given in the annexed table.

14. The average thickness of steel conduits should be determined by weighing not less than one hundred feet (100 feet). The weight shall fall within the margins given in the annexed table.

REGULATIONS FOR MEDIUM PRESSURES EXCEEDING 250 VOLTS BUT NOT EXCEEDING 650 VOLTS.

[The Regulations printed here are only those relating to the conditions intended to be covered by the Wiring Rules.]

Unless special permission is given in writing by the Committee of the Association prior to the commencement of the work, the circuits of any electric traction system employing an earthed return must under no circumstances be taken into, on, or through any building for light or power purposes, save in the case of the power and car-houses or other buildings forming part of the system.

**General.**

Conductors conveying currents of medium pressures must be completely enclosed in screwed piping. Such piping to be efficiently connected with earth and electrically continuous throughout its length.

**Motors.**

1. The frame of every electric motor shall be efficiently connected with earth.

2. The supply to every motor shall be controlled by means of an efficient cut-off switch, placed in such a position as to be easily handled by the person in charge of the motor, and connected so that by its means all pressure can be cut off from the motor itself, and from any regulating switch, resistance, or other device in connexion therewith.

3. Efficient fuses or other automatic circuit-breakers shall be provided, so as to protect the circuits from excess of current, and all switches and cut-outs shall be so enclosed and protected that there shall be no danger of any shock being obtained in the ordinary handling thereof, or of any fire being caused by their normal or abnormal action.

4. A notice shall be fixed in a conspicuous position at every motor and switchboard in connexion with the supply forbidding unauthorized persons to touch the motors or apparatus.

**Arc Lamps in Series.**

1. The supply to every arc lamp shall be controlled by means of an efficient cut-off switch, placed in such a position as to be easily handled by the person in charge of the arc lighting, and connected so that by its means all pressure can be cut off from the arc lamp itself, and

from any regulating switch, resistance, or other device in connexion therewith. Provided that where the arc lamps are connected in series across the outer conductors of a three-wire system, it shall be sufficient if one such switch be provided for each series of arc lamps.

2. Switches, efficient fuses, or other automatic cut-outs shall be provided, so as to protect the circuits from excess of current, and all switches and cut-outs shall be so enclosed and protected that there shall be no danger of any shock being obtained in the ordinary handling thereof, or of any fire being caused by their normal or abnormal action.

**Incandescent Lamps in Series.**

1. Covers of switches and lamp-holders, if metallic, shall be efficiently connected with earth.

2. Switches, efficient fuses, or other automatic cut-outs shall be provided, so as to protect the circuits from excess of circuit, and all switches and cut-outs shall be so enclosed and protected that there shall be no danger of any shock being obtained in the ordinary handling thereof, or of any fire being caused by their normal or abnormal action.

## SHIRE OF KARA KARA.

BY-LAW No. 6.—REGULATION OF TRACTION-ENGINE TRAFFIC. A By-law of the Shire of Kara Kara, made under subsection 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under 594 of the said Act, for regulating the conditions under which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kara Kara order as follows:—

*Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.*

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such machines consist only of bars at least two and three-quarters inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between the cross-bars not exceeding three inches, provided in such last-mentioned case—

- (1) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, a permit in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.
- (2) That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine, or any vehicle drawn by it.
- (3) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
- (4) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.
- (5) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

*Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted thereon.*

2. Every owner of a traction shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate, attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof, and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

*Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in Itself sufficient Power to Move it.*

3. So long as the fires of a traction are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to use it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

*Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, &c.*

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine, or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

*Engines Not to Halt on certain Parts of Highway.*

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

*Engines Not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.*

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water or for any other purpose whatever.

*Driving Engine between Sunset and Sunrise.*

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless by written permission of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front and one on the rear; or, when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

*Wooden Planks to be Carried on Engine, &c.*

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks at least twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks; and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

*Skidding of Wheels of Engine.*

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all the necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

*Penalties.*

10. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—
- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
  - (b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
  - (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Extent of Operation of By-law.*

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Kara Kara.
