The corporation intituled "The Clunes Water Commissioners" doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the Water Act 1905, No. 2016, make the following By-law for the due administration and the carrying out of the nowers conferred on it respecting the water supply of the Clunes Borough Council.

The charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or, in their default, the owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the period ending the 30th September, 1914, in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Commissioners, and such rates shall be payable in two moirties at the Town Hall, Clunes, one on the 1st day of October, 1913, and the other on the 1st day

On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds and under the sum of One pound sterling (evcept for occupied or unoccupied lands where no tenement or shop is erected and no water is laid on, or along the street, road, or public thoroughfare abutting such lands), and on these the sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the Borough Council annual valuation, unless the water is supplied by measure in accordance with By-law No. 5.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds and not exceeding One hundred pounds, the sum of Five pounds sterling per centum on the amount of valuation.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of One hundred pounds and not exceeding Two hundred pounds the sum of Four pounds ten shillings sterling per centum on the amount of valuation.

4. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Two hundred pounds the sum of Three pounds ten shillings sterling wer centum on the amount of valuation.

5. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles shillings sterling per centum on the amount of valuation.

6. Such person as shall be appointed by the Commissioners (from time to time) for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand and receive, collect, and sue for the recovery of the rates hereby made.

4. For every allotment of land exceeding Five shillings annual municipal valuation fronting a street wherein a main pipe of the Trust is laid, a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid.

5. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a stand-pipe one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if sup-plied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.

7. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable fue-equal moieties on the 1st of January and 1st of July,

1914.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Legislature of the Province of British Columbia (forming part of the Dominion of Canada), a British Possession within the meaning of the said recited Act, has, by the Probates Recognition Act 1911, Cap. 1, S. 4, made adequate provision for the recognition in that Possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the Supreme Court of Victoria, do now therefore, by and with the advice of the said Executive Council, hereby by this my Proclamation declare that Part III. of the said Administration and Probate Act 1830 of the State of Victoria, as amended by any Act, shall, without exception or modification, apply to the Province of British Columbia, in the Dominion of Canada aforesaid, and that henceforth while this Proclamation is in force the said Part III. shall apply accordingly.

A signboard, hanging-lamp, or gas-pipe fixture may be erected on or attached to any building or verandah provided it be of material, construction, and design approved by the surveyor, and be in no part less than eight feet six inches above the level of the footpath beneath, and the written permission of the Council thereto be first obtained. But no signboard shall exceed in depth three feet, nor, unless attached to a verandah, project over the footpath.
- 4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.
