QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT

TO 30TH JUNE, 1913.

COMPILED FROM OFFICIAL RETURNS IN THE OFFICE OF THE

QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 30TH JUNE, 1913.

Population.—The estimated population on the 31st March, 1913, was 1,386,856; on 30th June, 1913, it was 1,390,383—thus showing an increase of 3,527 persons. The natural increase in the population was 5,489, but the excess of emigration was 1,962. New South Wales gained from this State 2,349 persons, Queensland 1,451, South Australia 1,330, and Western Australia 761, whereas this State gained from Tasmania 1,122 persons, from New Zealand 246, and from the United Kingdom 3,045 persons.

Vital Statistics of the State.—The marriages—2,944—were 213 less, the births—9,169—were 803 more, the deaths—3,678—were 521 less, and the excess of births over deaths was greater by 1,324 than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Of the total number of deaths, 234 were due to phthisis, and 60 to other tubercular diseases; 295 to cancer; 24 to typhoid fever; and 76 to diphtheria and croup.

Vital Statistics of Melbourne, &c.—The births during the quarter numbered 4,303. This includes 44 cases of twins, and 365 illegitimate births. The deaths numbered 1,902, and the excess of births over deaths was 2,401. The deaths from diphtheria and croup numbered 36, from typhoid fever 5, and from tubercular diseases 150, as against 43, 9, and 192 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The total deaths in Melbourne were 1,902, of whom 318 were under twelve months of age. In Ballarat, of 158 deaths, 32 were of infants; in Bendigo, of 163 deaths, 28 were of infants; and in Geelong, of 77 deaths, 9 were of infants. In the four towns mentioned there were 814 deaths of people aged 65 years and upwards—or 35 per cent. of the total.

State Revenue and Expenditure.—The total revenue for the quarter was £3,170,839, which represents an increase of £259,489 on that for the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The principal items of revenue were—Railways £1,283,533, and Income Tax £428,872. The total expenditure was £2,961,111, an increase of £683,883 on that for the second quarter of 1912.

Railways.—Compared with the corresponding quarter of the preceding year the revenue increased by £29,239, but there was a decrease in the total expenditure of £18,411. The train miles run increased by 114,743, passengers carried by 1,396,490, and the tonnage of goods and live stock by 76,469.

Victorian Banking Returns.—On the 30th June the total liabilities of the banks furnishing returns to the Chief Secretary were £47,273,289, and the assets £47,988,674, as against £48,879,294 and £49,590,809 on the 30th June, 1912. The reserves amounted to £8,986,743, and paid-up capital to £14,783,293. The ratio of coin, bullion, and notes to liabilities was 21.05 per cent. Particulars of the Victorian business of the Commonwealth Bank are also given.

Savings Banks.—On the 30th June the amount at credit of the 692,144 depositors in the State and Commonwealth Savings Banks was £22,174,400. During the quarter 39,676 accounts were opened, and 26,002 were closed; the deposits made were £4,783,735, and the withdrawals £4,329,360.

Gold Yield.—The total yield of gold up to the end of June, 1913, is 73,278,196 ounces.

Imports and Exports.—The total value of oversea imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £5,505,188, and the total oversea exports during the same period were valued at £2,425,629, as compared with £5,449,765 and £2,951,465 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.—For the second quarter in 1913, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool Stores was £317,067, of which £203,980 went to the United Kingdom, £40,599 to South Africa, and £72,488 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Butter, valued at £112,009; Mutton and Lamb, £84,086; and Fruit, £72,876.
