Any hoat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the Port Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, or unsuitable, shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or any objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such as have permission of the Port Officer or his Deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the Port Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 12 noon and 12 midnight on Henley Day, provided that all motor boats shall be at their mooring not later than 12.30 p.m., and remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the Port Officer, Customs House, Flinders-street. Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

All motor boats to be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 3s feet from stem to stern, unless the Port Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light, and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

Permit shalt not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early arplication to the Port Officer for same is invited. Annilicant must give name and dimensions of heat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor bonts not moored along the Henley Reserve must either use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, or provide their own mooring pegs at places directed by the officer controlling the course.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and l'rince's-bridge, shall not exceed 12 feet.

Ships' cutters and other large boats, or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's bridge and Puntroad bridge between the hours of 12 noon and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.



The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling, may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

  2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs.
  flowers in the reserve, nor shall any fires be lighted therein
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw
- No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats,

- stones in the reserve.

  5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

  6. No rerson shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

  7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

  8. No person, except labourers and workmen emploved in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

  9. No stakes or posts of any kind shall be driven into the bed of the reservoir in the reserve, except where necessary for pier or jetty purposes, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

  10. No boating contests shall take place in the reserve on any Sunday, and no person shall appear in boating costume within the reserve on that day.

  11. No person under the age of 1a years shall be permitted to enter or use any boat in the reserve unless accompanied by some competent adult person.

The Committee of Management may license boats to be used for hire and private pleasure purposes in the reserve, and all persons desirous of obtaining a licence for; a boat shall, before making application therefor, submit such boat, for the inspection of the officer of the Committee, of Management appointed for that purpose, 13, Every person to whom a boat licence is granted shall provide an efficient difference to be carried in each boat so licensed when in use, and every boat club shall provide not less than two such buoys for the use of such club.

14. All boat houses shall be erected between the carriage drive in the reserve and the reservoir therein.

15. All applications for boat houses sites, and also for permission to erect a pier or jetty within the reserve, shall be accompanied with plans and particulars for the inspection and approval of the Committee of Management, and when any boat house, pier, or jetty shall have been crected within the reserve it shall be kept in a proper and, efficient state of repair to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management.

16. The owner of every boat used for hire in the reserve shall cause to be painted in oil colours on some conspicuous part of such boat the number of persons such boat is licensed to carry, as indorsed on the licence.

17. No owner of any boat, shall permit the same to ply for hire within the reserve without having a licence in force for such boat from the Committee of Management, and no person shall ply for hire within the reserve without passengers such boat is licensed to carry painted as aforesaid, on some conspicuous part of such boat. No person shall have charge of any boat plying for hire within the reserve without having a licence of Management and on some conspicuous part of such boat. Any licence granted by the Committee of Management may at any time be suspended or revoked by the Committee of Management if it be satisfied that the licensee has violated any of the provisions of these Regulations, and no licence while suspended, or when revoked, shall be deemed to be of any force.

21. No person shall use in the reserve any weir, net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil in any way for the purpose of taking fish.

22. No person shall angle with or use more than two baits at the same time in the reserve.

23. No person shall use any ground bait for the purposes of attracting fish to any particular spot in the reserve, or for any other purpose.

24. Any fish under 3 ounces in weight caught in the reservoir in the reserve shall be forthwith returned to the said reservoir.

25. No person shall angle for or take fish in the reserve on any Sunday.

26. All licences shall be produced by the licensees when required to do so by any officer of the Committee of Management or person appointed in that behalf.

27. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, look, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with any animal or bird of any kind in the reserve, or take therefrom any animal, eggs, skins, or feathers of any description, or carry any firearm, poison, trap, snare, or gun within the reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land. Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 (Five pounds) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit, and pay—a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds).
