REGULATIONS.—ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT OF OFFICERS.—CHAPTER XIII.

10a. Tea Money.

COUNTRY ROADS BOARD.

DECLARATION OF MAIN ROADS UNDER COUNTRY ROADS ACT IN THE SHIRES OF LILLYDALE, FERNTREE GULLY, HEALESVILLE, AND UPPER YARRA.

RESOLUTION CONFIRMED.

Resolution of the Country Roads Board made the
20th day of October, 1913.

THE Country Roads Board, incorporated by the Country Roads Act (No. 2415), at a meeting now holden, being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder, are of sufficient importance to be main roads, acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act, doth by this resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1912*.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of Lillydale.

1. *Main Healesville Road*.—Commencing on the western boundary of the shire at the north-west angle of allotment 3, parish of Ringwood; thence easterly to the township of Ringwood; thence north-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 36D, parish of Warrandyte; thence generally north-easterly to and through the township of Lillydale to the north-east angle of allotment 4, parish of Yering, at its junction with the Lillydale-Warburton road; thence northerly for a distance of about 2 miles to a point on the western boundary of allotment 14, parish of Yering; thence generally north-easterly, northerly, and easterly to the bridge over the River Yarra on the eastern boundary of allotment 120, parish of Gruyere, at the eastern boundary of the shire.

2. *Main Warburton Road*.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 4, section 29, parish of Yering, at its junction with the Melbourne-Healesville road; thence south-easterly and north-easterly to the Woori-Yallock Creek, the eastern boundary of the shire, at the north-east angle of allotment 44, parish of Wandin Yallock.

NOTE.—The route of portion of this road between the Shires of Lillydale and Upper Yarra is already set out in the description of the road routes in the Shire of Upper Yarra.

3. *Monbulk-road*.—Commencing at the most easterly angle of allotment 28A, parish of Mooroolbark, in the township of Evelyn; thence south-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 121, parish of Wandin Yallock; thence southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 130 of the same parish; thence southerly to the southern angle of allotment 89, section A, parish of Monbulk, on the southern boundary of the shire.

NOTE.—The route of portion of this road between the Shires of Lillydale and Ferntree Gully is already set out in the description of the road routes in the Shire of Ferntree Gully.

4. *Mount Dandenong-road*.—Commencing at its junction with the Melbourne-Healesville road, at the most southerly angle of allotment 22B, parish of Ringwood; thence north-easterly and easterly to the most northerly angle of allotment 37B, parish of Mooroolbark; thence south-easterly and north-easterly to allotment 925A, section 1, parish of Mooroolbark; thence south-westerly and south-easterly to the shire boundary at the south-east angle of allotment 58, parish of Mooroolbark, near the township of Olinda.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-law of the Rochester Waterworks Trust for determining, making, and levying rates and charges payable in respect of the supply of water within the Urban District of the said Trust, and for preventing the undue waste of water.

THE Rochester Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and by virtue of the provisions of the *Water Act 1905* and of every other power enabling the said Trust in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-laws, that is to say:—

No. 1. The following rates and charges are those which all occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water by the said Trust for the year 1914:—

- (a) For every house or tenement of Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound two shillings and sixpence sterling per annum.
- (b) For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound five shillings sterling per annum.
- (c) For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-four pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling per annum.
- (d) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal valuation of Twenty-five pounds and upwards, an annual rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.
- (e) For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same, with a minimum rate of Four shillings per annum.
- (f) A minimum rate of One pound sterling and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stabling watering during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.
- (g) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of One pound sterling per annum. Provided that for any such trough or receptacle situated on or immediately outside land rated together with any house or tenement as hereinbefore mentioned, a rate of Ten shillings per annum only will be charged.
- (h) The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity.
- (i) For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for brickwork and plastering shall be made, or if there be no contract then upon the value, or on the amount charged or paid for brickwork and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intentions to do so.
- (j) In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.
- (k) The charge for water supplied from the Trust stand-pipe shall be Threepence for each 100 gallons.

No. 2. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on 1st day of January, 1914, and 1st day of July, 1914.

No. 3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

TRARALGON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1914.

A BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1914 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Traralgon Waterworks Trust, which district has, for the purposes of the *Water Act 1905*, been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate for the Shire of Traralgon; but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence (£1 2s. 6d.).

2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, the municipal value of which does not exceed Three pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over Three pounds and under Eight pounds, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.). When such value is Eight pounds or over, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound.

3. For every public water-trough, the sum of One pound (£1).

4. When water is supplied by measure for domestic, or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property, if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

5. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st December, shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

6. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

8. The foregoing rates are made payable on the 1st March, 1914.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint, shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

(a) For all lands and tenements within the said district, excepting and excluding all lands set out and described in paragraph (b) hereof, a rate of One shilling and tenpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

(b) For every Crown allotment and lesser piece of land upon which no building is erected, or which is unoccupied or vacant, and which is not supplied with water, a rate of Ten shillings for every such Crown allotment or lesser piece thereof.

2. Such rate is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1914, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1914, and shall be payable in equal half-yearly moieties, in advance, on the first day of January and July in the year 1914.

3. The valuation for the time being of the lands and tenements within the said district for the municipal rate in the municipal district of the Shire of Rodney, in which such lands and tenements are situated, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purpose of making and levying such rate.

4. Water will also be supplied by measurement, and in each case the party desiring to be supplied must provide the meter, and maintain the same in good working order, and pay for the water according to measurement thereby at the rate following:—

(a) For steam boilers, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(b) For shire water-troughs, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(c) In all other cases, water supplied by the Trust by measurement will be charged for at the rate of One shilling and tenpence per 1,000 gallons, until the amount payable equals the amount of the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied. Excess water over and above such amount will be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, up to 200,000 gallons; over and above 200,000 gallons, Sixpence for each additional 1,000 gallons; and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will, in each case, be fixed by the Trust.

5. Supplies of water for any purposes not specified herein, and otherwise than by measure, must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken.

6. The minimum amount to be paid for water supplied by measurement for domestic purposes only, or both for domestic purposes and for purposes other than domestic combined, shall be the amount which, at One shilling and tenpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

7. For water supplied by measure, the minimum charge therefor, being the same amount as the rate for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, shall be paid half-yearly, in advance, upon the same days as the said rate is hereinafter made payable, and shall be deemed to be in satisfaction of the said rate; and the excess over and above the amount allowed by the rate shall be paid for upon demand, in writing, immediately after the amount thereof shall be ascertained by the reading of the meter at the end of each year.

8. In no case will water be supplied to any person whatsoever at a lesser rate or charge than Twenty shillings sterling per annum.

9. Such person or persons as the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate, and all moneys made payable hereunder.

WANGARATTA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1914.

THE Wangaratta Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Act 1905, make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1914 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust:—

(a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20 or under (except in the case of land on which there is no buildings), the sum of One pound sterling (£1).

(b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of (£5) Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Five shillings per annum.

(e) For water supplied by standpipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load not exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

(f) Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of (1s.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate in respect of the premises so supplied, and (1s.) One shilling per 1,000 gallons for water used over the amount of the assessed rate, subject to any special agreement for the supply of water that may be entered into by the Trust with any person. In cases where the supply of water is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge shall be for 10,000 gallons per annum.

(g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(h) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1914, and the first day of July, 1914, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

UPPER MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situated. The minimum rate to be Twenty shillings.

2. Water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes during January, February, March, November, and December, shall be charged for by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), and the minimum quantity to be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, shall be the quantity which would be equal to the amount of assessed rate payable for such premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at Sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

3. The above rate is for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1914, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1914; and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the first April and on the first October, 1914.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid yearly on the first February.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rate and charge.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1914, No. 9.

THE Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act* 1905, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, do hereby make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW No. 9.

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied, otherwise than by measure, with water for domestic use.

2. For making and levying such rate—

- (1) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement does not exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid. Provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.
- (2) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement does not exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling for the first Two hundred pounds, and Fourpence in the pound sterling for any amount over and above the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid.
- (3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment, or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings each be charged.
- (4) For every township allotment on which there is a stock trough or any other facility for watering stock, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be paid.
- (5) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1914, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1914.

4. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rate.

BROADFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1914 WITHIN THE BROADFORD URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Broadford Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act* 1905, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1914 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes, such rates to be paid half-yearly, in advance, in equal moieties, on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1914:—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Fifteen pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Thirty-seven shillings and sixpence.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Fifteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

3. On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land, the sum of Ten shillings.

4. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

- (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every one thousand gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case so supplied shall be twenty thousand gallons per half year, or a quantity which at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, One shilling.
- (3) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Five shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the event of there not being any contract, Five shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
- (4) All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid as agreed upon.

(5) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

For water supplied by meter a charge of One shilling (1s.) per thousand gallons shall be made, excepting where water is supplied to factories, in which case the charge shall be Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons. Provided that no person shall pay an amount other than that based upon One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound on the municipal valuation, or less than the minimum rate; any quantity used over the foregoing amounts to be charged in excess.

7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1914.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Donald, has, by Order made on the 28th day of October, 1913, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893), directed that the provisions of Part IV. of the *Electoral Act 1910*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedules, shall apply to the election of Councillors for the said Municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedules, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

Section 93 shall apply, omitting the word "electoral" in the first line, and substituting therefor the word "voters"; omitting the words "province or district" wherever they appear, and substituting therefor the word "Municipality."

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XXI.—Scholarships,—of the Regulations under the *Education Act 1890*, and doth substitute the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XXI.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

1. The Minister of Public Instruction may annually award scholarships in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

- (a) Sixty scholarships, or any less number, to pupils of State elementary schools for the purpose of giving facilities to deserving students for obtaining higher education and proceeding to any degree or diploma at the Melbourne University, or to any science course at an approved technical school.
 - (b) Forty scholarships, or any less number, to pupils selected from State elementary schools or from registered schools as suitable to receive higher education, and to proceed to a degree or a diploma in agriculture, or mining, or veterinary science, at the Melbourne University.
 - (c) Twenty scholarships, or any less number, to pupils of State district high schools or of State higher elementary schools for the purpose of giving facilities to deserving students for obtaining higher education and proceeding to any degree or diploma at the Melbourne University, or to any science course at an approved technical school.
 - (d) Twenty scholarships, or any less number, to pupils of registered schools for the purpose of giving facilities to deserving students obtaining higher education and proceeding to any degree or diploma at the Melbourne University, or to any science course at an approved technical school.
2. (a) The sixty scholarships under clause 1 (a) and thirty-four of the forty scholarships under clause 1 (b) shall be grouped in two Divisions as follow:—

Division I.—Thirty-six scholarships under clause 1 (a) and twenty scholarships under clause 1 (b) to be awarded to pupils of State elementary schools in each of which the monthly average attendance of pupils is 150 in number or over that number.

Division II.—Twenty-four scholarships under clause 1 (a) and fourteen scholarships under clause 1 (b) to be awarded to pupils of State elementary schools in each of which the monthly average attendance is under 150 in number.

- (b) Provided that, if a greater or a less number than sixty scholarships be awarded in any year under clause 1 (a) or if a greater or a less number than forty scholarships be awarded under clause 1 (b), a greater or a less number shall be allotted to each Division in the proportion, as closely as possible, of three in Division I. to two in Division II.
 - (c) Provided also that, should the number of meritorious candidates in either Division be less than the number of scholarships allotted to such Division, the scholarships unallotted may be awarded to meritorious candidates in the other Division.
 - (d) The Director shall decide under which Division a school shall be placed; and, in the case of candidates who during the twelve months preceding the examination at which they present themselves have attended more schools than one, shall determine for which Division of scholarships such candidates may be permitted to compete.
3. Of the scholarships to be granted under sub-clause (b) of clause 1 above, thirty-four scholarships shall be

awarded to candidates who present themselves as pupils in State elementary schools, and six of such scholarships shall be awarded to candidates who present themselves as pupils in registered schools. Provided that, should the number of meritorious candidates from State elementary schools be less than thirty-four, the scholarships unallotted may be awarded to meritorious candidates from registered schools; and, should the number of meritorious candidates from registered schools be less than six, the scholarships unallotted may be awarded to meritorious candidates from State elementary schools.

4. The scholars will be selected upon competitive examinations, held during December of each year. No scholarships will be awarded to any candidate whose age, as attested by a certificate of birth, will exceed fourteen years and six months on the first day of January immediately succeeding the examination.

5. The subjects of examination will be—

6. No scholarship under sub-clause (b) of clause 1 above will be awarded to any candidate who does not produce satisfactory evidence that he is likely to profit by a course of study in agriculture, or mining, or veterinary science, and is likely to succeed in the practical work involved in one of these occupations.

7. (a) No scholarship under sub-clause (a) or (b) of clause 1 above for pupils of State elementary schools shall be awarded to any candidate who, during the two years immediately prior to the first day of January succeeding the examination, has not been continuously on the rolls of and in attendance at a State school.
- (b) No scholarship under sub-clause (c) of clause 1 above shall be awarded to any candidate who has not been continuously on the rolls of and in attendance at a State district high school or a State higher elementary school since the first day of October prior to the examination.
- (c) Candidates who, during any portion of the two years immediately prior to the first day of January succeeding the examination, have been on the rolls of and in attendance at a registered school shall be eligible to compete only for the scholarships under sub-clauses (b) and (d) of clause 1 above for pupils of registered schools. The provisions of this sub-clause, however, shall not apply to candidates who have been continuously on the rolls of and in attendance at a State district high school or a State higher elementary school since the first day of October prior to the examination.

8. No scholarship will be awarded to any candidate who, at the competitive examination, does not pass a meritorious examination. The conditions determining what shall constitute a meritorious examination shall, with the approval of the Minister, be fixed from time to time by the Director.

9. Each scholarship will be tenable for four years upon the following conditions:—

- (a) That the scholar shall, at the commencement of the session immediately following the award of the scholarship and thereafter during the currency of the scholarship, become a student in a State district high school or an approved registered secondary school.
- (b) That the scholar shall obtain, at the end of each year, a satisfactory report as to his conduct and progress from the principal or head master of the school which he is attending.
- (c) That the scholar shall forward to the Education Department in the first term of each year a certificate from the principal or the head master of the school which he is attending, stating that the course of study being followed by the scholar is in accordance with the requirements of Regulations XXI. and XXII.
- (d) That the scholar under sub-clause (a) or (c) or (d) of clause 1 above shall complete the "pass" at the Junior Public Examination of the Melbourne University at the end of the third year of the currency of the scholarship.

The Minister may at any time cancel any scholarship if the above conditions are not complied with, or if he is satisfied that the conduct of any scholar has been disorderly or immoral; and, thereupon, all advantages and allowances connected with such scholarship shall cease and determine.

10. (a) Where a scholar is allowed by the Minister to attend a State district high school, he shall receive free tuition thereat, and, in addition,

his parent or guardian shall be granted an allowance of £4 per annum towards expenses of books and other materials.

(b) Where a scholar is allowed by the Minister to attend an approved registered secondary school, his parent or guardian shall be granted an allowance of £12 per annum towards expenses of tuition and of books and other materials.

(c) The provisions of sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this clause shall come into force on the 1st January, 1914.

11. Where a scholar does not reside within five miles of a State district high school, or of an approved registered secondary school, the Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, allow him such sum (not exceeding £5 per annum) as will cover the cost of transit to and from school. Provided that no such allowance shall be paid to any scholar if the total amount of the net profits, emoluments and income received by his parents or guardians exceeded £250 during the preceding year. And the Minister shall decide whether such scholar is eligible to receive such allowance, and the decision of the Minister shall be final.

12. Where it is necessary, in order to carry out the conditions specified in clause 9 above, that any scholar shall reside apart from his parents or guardians, the Minister may grant, in lieu of the cost of the transit of such scholar, an allowance at the rate of £26 per annum. Provided that no such allowance shall be paid to any scholar if the total amount of the net profits, emoluments, and income received by his parents or guardians exceeded £250 during the preceding year. And the Minister shall decide whether such scholar is eligible to receive such allowance, and the decision of the Minister shall be final.

13. Payments of allowances in connexion with scholarships will be made quarterly; but all payments by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature. The approval of the Minister must first be obtained to a letter of application (on a prescribed form) by the scholar's parent or guardian before a claim for payment of the allowance under clause 11 or clause 12 will be entertained.

14. Holders of scholarships may, when deemed necessary, be required to attend an examination, and those who fail to pass satisfactorily will have their scholarships withdrawn.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
