GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS, 1913-14.

IT is hereby notified that Monday, the 1st day of December next, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the General Lists of Nonratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council.

Qualified persons, women as well as men, who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions before or on that date.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Pro-vince may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province.

Each applicant for an Elector's Right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the duty stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

WOMAN'S CHRISTIAN TEMPERANCE UNION OF VICTORIA.—PETITION FOR INCORPORATION.

THE substance and prayer of a petition to the Governor in Council, signed by not less than 25 contributors within the meaning of Part I. of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1890 (54 Vict. 2. Regulation G of Class I., and Regulation C of Class III. (heading "Foreign-going"), and Regulation C of Class III., and Regulation E of Class VI., and Regulation E of Class VII. IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Benalla Public Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published previously in the Government Gazette, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

r. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and any other particulars

that may be required shall be furnished at the time of making the application for any burial in the cemetery.

3. A burial right shall give the holder and his repre-

A burial right shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the right of burial in the portion of ground thereby allotted as a private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the Trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. A permit will, on application of the holder of a burial right, and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection, or a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, centoaph, tablet, or other erection thereon, if approved by the Trustees, and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose, and on payment of the fees.

5. Notice of any burial shall be given at the sexton's residence at least eight (8) working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.

6. That every adult's grave shall be at least 6 feet deep, and every child's grave 4½ feet deep.

7. That any person having died from any infectious or contagious disease the grave of such person shall not be re-opened within two years.

8. That no burial shall be permitted to take place without a certificate from a Deputy Registrar of Deaths, Coroner, or a Justice of the Peace, and such certificate chall be delinered to the certain before the functional action. shall be delivered to the sexton before the funeral enters the cemetery

o. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days, September to April, inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.; May to August, inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year, from Two p.m. to Five p.m.

10. That no burials shall be allowed between the hours

of Five p.m. and Eight a.m., except by special permission

of Five p.m. and Eight a.m., except by special permission of a quorum of the Trustees.

11. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection shall be maintained and kept: in thorough order, repair and condition, by and at the expense of the owner.

12. Licensed exhumations for removal and re-interment in another cemetery shall be made between the hours of Six and Eight a.m., but the consent of the Attorney-General, and also of the Trustees, shall be first obtained.

13. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

14. That no dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

15. That no smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged, within the cemetery.

16. That no person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery unless by the authority of the Trustees first had and obtained.

obtained.

obtained.

17. That no flower, tree, or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except as approved by the Trustees, and any flower, tree, or shrub afterwards becoming a nuisance or causing damage, shall be removed by the direction of the Trustees.

18. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employ of the Trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the Trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.

19. Sculptors, stonemasons, and others desirous of erecting tombstones, monuments, tablets, or railings, or of constructing vaults, or of placing inscriptions or epitaphs, shall obtain licences to do so from the Trustees.

20. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. All refuse remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once from the cemetery by the person employed on the work.

21. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open

21. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily.

22. That a plan of the cemetery, showing a distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and number of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of rights of burial, shall be kept at the office of the secretary.

23. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Nine a.m. to Five p.m.

T HE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law follow-

- r. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Quambatook Urban District within the Avoca Water Trust District:—
 - (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there f any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as, aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Five shillings for the period hereinafter set out.
 - (2) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
 - (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building, situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenemes or land in our such tenemes or land in our such tenemes or land in our such tenemes or land in our such such tenemes or land in our such tenemes or land in our such tenemes or land in our such tenemes or land in our such tenemes or land in our such tenemes. such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the first day of October, 1913, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1913, and shall be payable on the 27th day of November, 1913, at the office of the said Commission at Charlton.
- 3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.
- 4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons. per 1,000 gallons.
- 5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

BY-LAW NO. 1.

THE Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust (hereinafter of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1905, doth hereby make the By-law following for its waterworks district:—

1. All Regulations relating to the waterworks district of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the said Regulations, for payment of which rate or charge such persons shall have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; nor to abrogate or diminish the power of the Trust to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; nor to annul or stay any prothe power of the Trust to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; nor to annul or stay any proceedings taken, prosecution commenced, or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the said Regulations, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion; and all offences against any provision of the said Regulations committed before the date of this By-law coming into operation may be prosecuted for and punished as if this By-law had not been made.

2. The place of meeting of the Trust shall be the Kyneton Shire Council Chambers. Ordinary meetings of the Trust shall be held on the Wednesday next after the first Saturday in each calendar month at half-past Ten o'clock in the forenoon.

 3. Except as herein otherwise provided, business at meetings of the Trust shall be conducted in accordance with the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, in so far as the same are applicable to the conduct of such business.

 4. At every ordinary meeting of the Trust the first business shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the next preceding ordinary meeting, and of any special meeting held since such preceding ordinary meeting, and of any committee, presented at such ordinary meeting; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of such proceedings; and such minutes shall, when found correct, be signed by the chairman.
- 5. After the confirmation of minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable :-

- (I.) Reading of outward correspondence;
 (II.) Reading of correspondence received, and considering and ordering thereon;
 (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials;
 (IV.) Presentation of reports of committees;
 (V.) Payments;
 (V.) Ordinary business, including dealing with

tenders;
(vII.) Orders of the day, including matters continued
from former meetings;
(vIII.) Motions of which notice has been given, in the
order in which so given;

(ix.) Notices of motion.

(ix.) Notices of motion.

The order of business of a special meeting shall be that in which it appears in the notice convening such meeting.

6. Notices of motion shall be dated and signed, and given to the secretary to be numbered and read at the close of the meeting at which they are given; except notices of protest against resolutions of the Trust; and also except notices of the resumption of business that has lapsed by the number of Commissioners present becoming less than a quorum, of which intended resumption notice may be given to the secretary within ten days of the next ordinary meeting of the Trust, after such business has lapsed. lapsed.

No Commissioner shall submit any motion initiating

7. No Commissioner shall submit any motion initiating a subject for discussion, save in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion on any petition, memorial, or other like application, except for receiving the same, shall, unless by leave granted by a two-thirds majority of the Commissioners present at a meeting, be made until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after the receipt of such application. nary meeti

application.

9. Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received; and if not so moved shall be struck out.

10. No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner giving notice thereof, unless by some other Commissioner thereto authorized in writing by such first-inculuded Commissioner. first-mentioned Commissioner.

11. The mover of every motion appointing a committee shell be a member of such committee.

12. A Commissioner devitous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state its nature before addressing the Trust thereon.

13. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

14. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote, unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may require the enforcement of any standing order, by

may require the enforcement of any stanting order, sy directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

15. A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken on it.

16. No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be within a configuration of the confi

a motion shall not be held to have spoken on it.

16. No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the Commissioners, seven days at least before the holding of such subsequent meeting; nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority comprising two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was agreed to; or by a majority, if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent, meeting be greater than the number present at such prior meeting.

17. The Commissioners, at meetings of the Trust, shall be designated by their official titles, as Chairman or Commissioner, as the case may require.

18. The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting thereon, and his decision as to order or practice shall be final.

19. A Commissioner shall not digress from the subjectmatter of the question under discussion, nor comment upon words used in a previous debate; imputation of improper motives and personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly.

20. If any Commissioner make use of any expression, disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other Commissioner, the Commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw such expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

21. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down,

required by the chairman to withdraw such expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

21. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the chairman to explain.

22. A Commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and being twice called to order, or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this By-law.

23. Any person not being a Commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when required by the chairman so to do, may, on his order, be forthwith removed; and shall do, may, on his order, be forthwith removed; and shall be held guilty of a breach of this By-law.

24. A Commissioner may of right demand the production of any document of the Trust applying to a question under

of any document of the Trust applying to a question under discussion.

25. The Trust Commissioners shall vote by show of hands; and the chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative; and the result shall be declared by him and entered in the minutes.

26. When a division on a question is demanded by any

When a division on a question is demanded by any Commissioner, the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up the right hand, and thereafter those voting in the negative shall hold up the right hand, and the result shall be declared by the chairman: and the names of the Commissioners voting on the division, in the affirmative or negative, as the case may be shall be recorded in the minutes. Any Commissioner present not voting, not being under legal disability, shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law.

27. At every meeting of the Trust, each motion, whether an original motion or an amendment, shall be reduced

No discussion shall be allowed on a motion for adjournment of the Trust; and if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be proceeded with, or such other as may be accorded precedence, before any further motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but, if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debate on motions moved and seconded, or any order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

31. Any Commissioner may protest against a resolution of the Trust, if notice of intention to protest be given for thwith on the adoption of such resolution, and if the protest specify the reason for protesting, and be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be

kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such Commissioner; and such protest shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest was given, previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes, if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in terms disrespectful to the Trust.

32. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present at a meeting becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed, at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

33. If a debate on an order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number of Commissioners as aforestid, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day, on motion upon notice; and such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

34. Minutes of proceedings of committees shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and, being signed by the Chairman of Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

30. The treasurer shall receive and disburse all moneys

39. The treasurer shall receive and disburse all moneys on behalf of the Trust. He shall take account of all moneys received by the collector, and supervise his accounts. All payments by the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by three Commissioners, and countersigned by the secretary.

43. The salary or allowance attached to every office and place at the disposal of the Trust shall be fixed before the publication of the advertisement inviting applications as aloresaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

44. In case of security being required for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of pre-viding the same.

45. The secretary shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible therefor. Impressions may be made only by order of the Trust, and shall be verified by the signatures of two Commissioners and the secretary.

46. Before the execution of any contract for works, the 46. Before the execution of any contract for works, the contractor undertaking to perform the same shall give security to the Trust, to the extent of Ten pounds per centum of the amount of such contract. When tenders are called for works a preliminary deposit of Two pounds ten shillings per centum shall be required to accompany each tender, which preliminary deposit will be subject to forfeiture, in the event of the tenderer refusing to pay the balance of Ten pounds per centum, and to execute a contract deed, within seven days of his being notified of the acceptance of his tender.

47. In case of a tenderer failing to proceed to the

47. In case of a tenderer failing to proceed to the execution of a contract deed within seven days as above, the 1 rust may disqualify him from again tendering for contracts for works under the Trust, for such period as may be determined.

48. Any of the provisions of this By-law may be suspended or waived, in case of emergency, by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the Commissioners present at any meeting of the Trust.

49. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdic-

2. Before any such licence is granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he

is a competent plumber.

3. The Trust may at any time cancel any such licence, if, in the opinion of the Trust Commissioners, the holder thereof, by himself of his employes, commits any breach of this By-law.

4. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work, the property of the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipes, or who shall make such communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust shall be guilty of an offence. Galvanized wroughtion piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:

All fittings must be of good quality, and of strength to bear with safety the maximum pressure to which they may be subject. Connexions with the pipes of the Trust must be made with proper stop-cock screwed ferrules, and with 2 feet of lead piping with brass unions. One service-pipe only, for domestic supply, to each tenement will be permitted. The maximum size of service-pipes, unless by special consent of the Trust, shall be—for tenements of annual value not exceeding £20, ½-inch bore; for tenements exceeding £20 annual value, §-inch bore. All service-pipes on private property shall be at a depth of not less than to inches below the surface of the ground.

6. All connexions between lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings, all joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints; in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on service-pipes, eitner in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the

plumber affixing the same. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of 3 feet from the building line, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

7. The service-pipes from the mains being the property of the owners or occupiers of the enements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier or owner shall, in every instance in which any damage is caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be guilty of an offence.

8. If any person neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from the proper officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the Trust may seem fit, until the mecessary repairs have been effected.

9. The Trust may at any time, when found necessary repairs have been effected.

9. The Trust may at any time, when found necessary repairs have been effected and expense of providing and laying, repairing, or renewing the same; and such cost and expense shall be a debt due by such owner to the Trust, and shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction.

10. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

11. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be guilty of an offence.

water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be guilty of an offence.

12. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be guilty of an offence.

13. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Trust. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For 4-inch meter, Four shillings; For 3-inch meter, Five shillings; For any meter of larger size than 3-inch, 6 per cent upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

For 3-inch meter, Five shillings;
For any meter of larger size than 3-inch, 6 per cent upon the cost of such meter. fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of the months of January and July in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Trust, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

14. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Trust, he may, by notice, in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying he cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the falance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust, who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

15. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and re-fixed, by taking it as equal to the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the consumers, other than such as are hired from the Trust, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Trust; a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

17. The Trust, by its officers, may, at any time, after six days' notice in writing of its intention, attach a check

If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contrivention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water, from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

27. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds,

- 7. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds (£4) per annum.
- 8. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings (£4 105.) her annum.
- 9. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Five pounds (£5) per annum.

- 10. For water supplied to any house or tenement upon which no annual municipal value is made, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.

 11. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.
- 12. For every public water trough sumplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.
- 13. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow; such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.
- 14. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an over-ow waste pipe from any private bath.
- 15. The Trust may by notice, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense provides a meter. pense, provide a meter.
- 16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.
- 17. Every person requiring to remove or alter the posi-tion of any meter shall give six days' notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust, and a regulation of the quan-tity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.
- 18. If any person who has provided any meter fail to give the notice required of any repairs required for such meter he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 19. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

- 20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.
- 21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the 21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if water is being allowed to run to waste, and, if such occupier or owner refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.
- 22. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.
- 23. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works, and such permission shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission.
- 24. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as afore-24. Any person, whether necessed or permitted as alore-said or not, who shall require to affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust, shall give notice to the secretary of his intention so to do.
- All connexions from the Trust mains to property 25. All connexions from the trust mains to property shall be made at the expense of the owner or occupier of the property to be supplied, and all repairs or renewals shall, when necessary, be made by the owner or occupier, and such pipes shall at all times be under the control of the Trust.
- 26. All connexions, pipes, and fittings shall be of the best quality, and approved by the Secretary and Chairman of the Trust.
- 27. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.
- 28. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.
- 29. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the direction of an officer of the Trust shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

6. Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

Such occupiers or owners of gardens, steam-engines, or stock, who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water shall, if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any), if, in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such occupiers or owners to be notified in writing of such charge.
