Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BRUSHMAKERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a brushmaker has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 15th day of December, 1913. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

(2) That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to persons engaged as follows shall be:—

## OVERTIME.

(4) That any person who works in any week for any time in excess of 48 hours shall be paid for such excess time one penny per hour over and above the rates fixed in this Determination.

## SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

(5) That the special price or rate of payment to any person for all work done on—

(a) Sundays,

(b) The undermentioned Public Holidays (that is to say):—

Christmas Day,

Good Friday,

Eight Hours Day (21st April),

shall be at the rate of double time.

But if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named Public Holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
