COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF ELSTERN-WICK PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 200 of the Land Act 1901 it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 100 fsuch Act, and has vested such land in trustees, or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 200, Land Act 1901: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brighton and their successors in respect of the Eisternwick Public Park and Recreation Reserve, in the borough of Brighton (now called the town of Brighton): Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Brighton do hereby make the

following regulation in respect of the said Elsternwick Public Park and Recreation Reserve:--

### REGULATION.

### Conditions.

- 1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the Land Acts, except under the 187th section of the Land Act 1901, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria; with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section to of the Land Act 1901, or for mining purposes.
- 2. In case the said land, or any part thereof, should be sold; leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than that which the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Land Acts may think fit.
