Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination—which must be that their applications or on or before Tuesday, the 4th February, 1913, a crossed postal note, pavable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Tenshillings in the case of candidates for the Clerical Division Examination, and Five shillings in that of candidates for the General Division Examination, being the fees for such examinations.

At the Clerical Examination sixty (60) candidates will At the Clerical Examination sixty (60) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must, at the date of examination, be between the ages of 16 and 21 years at his last birthday, but no person 22 years of age or over can be appointed. The commencing salary is £60 a vear, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended by the Permanent Head of the Department and the Public Service Commissioner.

For the position of Junior Attendant, Public Library, or Junior Messenger, applicants must be between the ages of 16 and 20 years. On attainment of the age of 21 years and completion of three years' service, an officer may be granted a salary of £108 a year.

For the position of Penal Warder applicants must be between the ages of 25 and 35 years, and must furnish a certificate of fitness from the Deputy Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, Melbourne. No applicant shall be registered as a candidate for such position if he be less than 5 feet 8 inches in height, or measure round his chest less than 36 inches, or weigh less than 11 stone.

Officers of the General Division of the Public Service of Victoria may compete at the Clerical Division Examination, or may present themselves at the General Division Examination in order to qualify for promotion, on making application to the Commissioner and furnishing evidence of good conduct and health from the Head of their Department. # ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH.—LAND, ELTHAM.—POWER TO DISPOSE.\*

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination known as the Roman Catholic Church in Victoria, under the provisions of the 'Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion," for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the fourth day of November, 1912, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

Description of Land.—One acre one rood thirty-nine perches and four-tenths, county of Evelyn, town of Eltham, being allotment 1A of section to: Commencing at the west angle of allotment 2; bounded thence by that allotment bearing south 34 deg. east four chains twenty-seven links; thence by a road bearing south 56 deg. west three chains seventy-eight links; thence by allotment 1 bearing north 34 deg. west two chains thirty-eight links; and thence by the Melbourne-road bearing north o deg. 30 min. west two chains twenty-seven links, and north 56 deg. east two chains fifty-three links to the point of commencement.

Names of Trustees.-The Roman Catholic Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne.

Power of Disposition.—To sell, transfer, mortgage, charge, lease, exchange, give, grant, or dispose of the whole or any part of the said land.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be Applied.—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Melbourne as a Council of such diocese under the provisions of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 2100, may from time to time by resolution direct.

# PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

Regulations in connexion with the vote of Five thousand pounds (£5,000) for fencing and improving public parks, gardens, and other reserves under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

A SUM of Three thousand five hundred pounds shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:—

- 1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1912, and 31st December, 1912, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of April, 1913. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.
- 2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the inanging body of any public park, garden, or other reserve from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1912, and the 31st December, 1912; but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1912.
- 3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure from the year 1911 (vide Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced pro rata.
- 4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.
- 5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the City of Melbourne (except the Royal Park), or to the Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzroy, or to the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park and Barkly Gardens, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.
