RATING BY-LAW FOR 1913.

THE Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks
Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the
Water Act 1905, hereby make the following Rating

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust supplied otherwise than by meter (the minimum rate for each house or tenement supplied with water to be Twenty-five shillings) according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal district in which such rateable property is situated for one year commencing the 1st day of January, 1913, and ending the 3st day of December, 1913.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.
