1. of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Any Inspector who has been appointed by the Governor in Council in accordance with section 10 of the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890* may, by notice, in writing, under his hand, require an owner or occupier to destroy or remove, within thirty (30) days after service of such notice on such owner or occupier, any live or dead tree, shrub, fern, or plant of any kind or description whatsoever, or any rubbish which, in the opinion of the Inspector, renders or tends to render a vermin-proof fence ineffective.

2. If the owner or occupier upon whom such notice is served fails to comply with its requirements within the time allowed, the Inspector may proceed with the work of destruction or removal (as the case may be) at the sole expense of the owner or occupier, who shall, on demand, pay to the Inspector the cost incurred by him in the execution of such work.
