Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE AERATED WATER TRADE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of an Aerated Water or Cordial or Non-intoxicating Beer Manufacturer, has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 25th day of January, 1913.

WAGES.

2. That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following shall be:—

Persons bottling aerated waters by hand or by any rack (other than an automatic rack)	50s.	per week of 48 hours
Persons bottling aerated waters by automatic rack	47s. 6d.	" "
Persons not otherwise provided for	43s. 6d.	" "
Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) engaged in general work, i.e., all work with the exception of—		
(a) bottling aerated waters;		
(b) carrying weights of 84 lbs. or over—		
14} years of age	11s.	" "
15 "	13s. 6d.	" "
16 "	16s.	" "
17 "	21s.	" "
18 "	25s.	" "
19 "	27s. 6d.	" "
20 "	35s.	" "

APPRENTICES.

NUMBER.

3. That the number of apprentices who may be employed within a factory or place shall be one apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 43s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

IMPROVERS.

NUMBER.

4. That the number of improvers who may be employed within any factory or place shall be one improver to every ten or fraction of ten persons receiving not less than 43s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

WAGES.

5. That the lowest rates of payment to be paid to apprentices or improvers shall be :—

14 years of age	11s.	per week of 48 hours
15	13s. 6d.	" "
16	16s.	" "
17	21s.	" "
18	25s.	" "
19	27s. 6d.	" "
20	35s.	" "

TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.

6. That the time of beginning and ending work shall be :—

Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
7.30 a.m.	12 noon on the day on which the half-holiday is observed, and
7.30 a.m.	6 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

OVERTIME.

7. That the following rates shall be paid for all work done :—

- (a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause (6)
 (b) Within the hours fixed in Clause (6) in excess of 48 hours in any week
- } Time and a quarter.

SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

8. That the special rate of payment payable to any person for all work done on—

Sundays and
Good Friday,

or the days on which

New Year's Day,
Foundation Day (26th day of January),
Eight Hours Day (21st April),
King's Birthday (3rd June), and
Christmas Day

are observed as Public Holidays, shall be at the rate of double time.
