W HEREAS at about 1.15 a.m. on the 7th January, 1913, two men, each armed with a revolver, entered the bedroom of Mr. Arthur Henry Trotter, at 403 George-street, Fitzroy, demanded money, and on being refused, the taller of the two fired at Mr. Trotter, and caused his death.
